HEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken, under "The Public Works Act, 1882," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of an approach to the Dunedin Railway Station, Provincial District

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by section eleven of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of a road approach to the Dunedin Railway Station; and that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, or interests of what kind soever, for use as such road approach.

A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Hamilton, Thames, Tauranga, and Cambridge Districts; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into five marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

TE AROHA DISTRICT

TE AROHA DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Auckland, bounded towards the North-west by a right line from the confluence of the Piako River with the Waitoa, drawn in the direction of the confluence of the Ohinemuri with the Waihou to the Waihou River; towards the East by the said Waihou River; again towards the North-west by the Patuwhao Block and its southern boundary produced to the Waitawheta River; again towards the East by that river to its intersection by a right line drawn between Te Aroha Mountain and the mouth of the Waihi River; towards the South-east by that line to the Tauranga District confiscation line; again towards the East by the said confiscation line on the summit of Te Aroha Range to the Wairere Stream; again towards the South by the Wairere Stream to the Waihou River; towards the South by the South-east by the said river, and by the Mangawhero and Mangawhara Rivers, by the Mangawhara and Waipa Blocks to the Waikato River; towards the South by the Waikato River; towards the South by the Hinuwera No. 2 Block; again towards the South-east by the said block to the southern corner of Maunganui Block; again towards the South-east by the said block to the southern corner of Maunganui Block; again towards the South-west by the Waikato confiscation boundary-line to a point due west of Te Aroha Mountain; towards the North by a right line drawn due east to the right bank of the Piako River; again towards the West by that river to the Waitoa River, the starting point.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," it is enacted that, "whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tomage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers; and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or

other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships":

And whereas by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1876," it is enacted that, "where Her Majesty has power, under 'The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854,' or any Act passed or hereafter to be passed amending the same, to make an Order in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time to make such Order in Council, and by Order in Council to revoke, alter, or add to any Order so made":

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 29th day of

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 29th day of February, 1868, Her Majesty, to whom it was made to appear that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," had been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, and were in force in that country, was pleased to direct that the ships of Denmark the certificates of Danish nationality and registry of which were dated on or after the 1st day of October, 1867, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of Danish nationality and registry:
And whereas certain modifications were subsequently

And whereas Her Majesty, by Order in Council dated the 30th day of December, 1878, was pleased to direct, as regards Danish steamships, that, if the owner or master of any Danish steamship measured after the said 1st day of October, 1878, desires the allowance for engine room in his Stip to be estimated under the British instead of under the Danish rules, such engine room shall be measured, and the allowance calculated according to the British rules:
