HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the

Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Hawea Domain Board, viz.,—

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

WHEREAS by "The Pharmacy Act, 1880," it is provided that every election shall be held in manner prescribed by regulations to be made by the Board, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council: His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, therefore, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined regulations, made in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act;

that is to say,—

1. The Registrar shall conduct the elections of the members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.

2. In the month of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the month of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the month of August in every succeeding third year thenceforward the Registrar shall proceed to the election of seven persons, being registered chemists of New Zealand, to serve as members of the Pharmacy Board of New Zealand.
