A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken, under "The Public Works Act, 1882," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of roads in the Collingwood Road District, Provincial District of Nelson:

And whereas the Collingwood Road Board has laid before the Governor the memorials and maps mentioned in, and signed and certified as required by, the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by section eleven of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes of roads; and that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the land so described shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in Her Majesty, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, or interests of what kind soever, for use as roads.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS a certain railway was proclaimed in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the fourteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, under the name of the Canterbury Great Northern Railway (part between Addington Station and Rangiora), and the said railway now forms part of the Hurunui-Waitaki Railway:

And whereas the two hundred and twenty-ninth section of "The Public Works Act, 1882," enacts that any public work authorized under the authority of any Act repealed by this Act, or of any Act or Ordinance repealed by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and any land required to be taken, purchased, or acquired for such work, or anything commenced under any such authority as aforesaid, may be continued, taken, purchased, or acquired, executed, carried out, enforced, and completed under the provisions of this Act:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required for further portion of the said Hurunui-Waitaki Railway:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and in pursuance of the power conferred upon him by the one hundred and thirtieth and

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-fourth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown lands situate within a gold field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor, or for alienation by occupation licenses on deferred payments under any law for the time being in force in the land district in which such mining district is situate:

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the land specified in the Schedule hereto was, with other lands, by Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, proclaimed as set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago did, on the eighteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three,

pass a resolution recommending that the said land should be withdrawn from the deferred-payment system :

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation :

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jeroois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby revoke the Proclamation above referred to, so far as it relates to the sections therein mentioned, and included in the Schedule hereto, and do proclaim and declare that the said sections are hereby withdrawn from the operation of the deferred-payment system.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the twenty-fourth section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," I, William Francis Drummond Jeroois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Otago, and known as the Hawea Recreation-ground, and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1881"; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of August, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Hawea Domain Board, viz.,—

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the Schoolhouse, Hawea Flat, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the twenty-seventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may, at any monthly or special meeting, appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency Sir William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order that the Government work known as the Cambridge-Rotorua Road shall and may be constructed on or through the several parcels of land more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, and delineated in the plan marked P.W.D. 10013, deposited in the office of the Minister for Public Works at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, in the said colony.

THE following Regulations for the conduct of elections of members of the Pharmacy Board, having been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published in accordance with "The Pharmacy Act, 1881."

THOMAS DICK.

WHEREAS by "The Pharmacy Act, 1880," it is provided that every election shall be held in manner prescribed by regulations to be made by the Board, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council: His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, therefore, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined regulations, made in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act; that is to say,—

1. The Registrar shall conduct the elections of the members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.

2. In the month of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the month of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the month of August in every succeeding third year thenceforward the Registrar shall proceed to the election of seven persons, being registered chemists of New Zealand, to serve as members of the Pharmacy Board of New Zealand.

3. If any vacancy shall occur after the period of the first election held under these regulations and before the triennial election then next ensuing the Registrar shall, upon being notified by the Board that a vacancy has occurred, proceed to the election of a person, being a registered pharmaceutical chemist, to fill such vacancy; and the person so elected shall hold office until the next ensuing triennial election and no longer.

4. At every election for members to serve on the Board the Registrar shall give twenty-one days' notice, by advertisement in the *New Zealand Gazette* and such other papers as may from time to time be approved of by the Board, of his intention to proceed, on a certain day to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of fit and proper persons to serve as members on such Board; and he shall also, in such advertisement, name a day, being not less than twelve days nor more than fifteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also, in such advertisement, name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.

5. Any person registered as a pharmaceutical chemist in New Zealand desirous of nominating any other person as a candidate shall fill up a nomination paper in the form of

the First Schedule hereto, stating therein the Christian, or first, name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required by such Schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than two persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also by the person therein named as a candidate, accepting such nomination. Such nomination paper must be lodged with the Registrar before 4 o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the day fixed for nominations.

6. The Registrar shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of persons nominated than are required to fill the vacancies created, make a return to the Board and declare such person or persons to be duly elected member or members of the Board; but, if the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies, a poll shall be taken, and the Registrar shall cause voting-papers to be printed in the form of the Second Schedule hereto, and shall sign each paper and cause such to be enclosed in an envelope, not fastened, with the name and address of the Registrar printed thereon, and one of such voting-papers and printed envelopes shall be sent by post, under a fastened cover, to the registered or last-known address of each and every registered pharmaceutical chemist of New Zealand resident in New Zealand.

7.
