And whereas the Land Board of Otago did, on the 18th day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirteenth day of August, 1883.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the twenty-fourth section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Auckland, and known as the Kawakawa Recreation-ground, and de-

scribed in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1881"; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Act.

ALL that parcel of land situate in the Kawakawa Survey District, Provincial District of Auckland, containing 14 acres 3 rods, being Lot 47, Parish of Ruapekapeka. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirteenth day of August, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Kawakawa Domain Board, viz.,—

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained; that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., at the Public Hall, Kawakawa, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
3. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.
4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.
5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.
6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may, at any monthly or special meeting, appoint a Chairman.
7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of August, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act") it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant or lunatic or other person under legal disability shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judge named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of August, 1883.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, order that a road, known as the Victoria Okaihau Road, shall be constructed on or through land held or occupied by Native owners, and situated in the Parish of Maungataniwha, County of Mongonui.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirteenth day of August, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence the Governor in Council may authorize any person to construct harbour works (other than the reclamation of land from the sea, or any harbour, or the construction of any graving-dock, dock, or breakwater in any harbour or in the sea), and to use and occupy such parts of the foreshore, or of any tidal land or tidal waters, as may be necessary for the construction or use of such harbour works in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence: And whereas by the seventeenth section of the said

Act it is also enacted that every such Order in Council shall be made upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit, and the rights thereby conferred shall only be granted for a limited period, not exceeding in any case fourteen years, and may at any time be altered, modified, or revoked:

And whereas the Hobson County Council (hereinafter called "the said Council") desire to build a wharf for the use, benefit, and convenience of the public in Kaipara Harbour, a place where no Harbour Board is in existence, and the said Council have applied to the Governor in Council for the issue of this order:

And whereas the said Council have deposited plans of the said wharf (marked M.D. 811, 824, and 825) at the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in the manner prescribed by the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of the said Act, and, it having been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, the Governor in Council hath this day approved of the said deposited plans, subject to the conditions set forth in this Order in Council:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorize the said Council to build at Whakahara, in the Wairoa River, Kaipara Harbour, on the site shown in the plans marked M.D. 824 and 825, for the use, benefit, and convenience of the public, a wharf, in accordance with the said plan marked M.D. 811, and to use and occupy such portion of the foreshore, or of any tidal land or tidal water, as may be necessary for the construction and use of such wharf, subject to the following conditions, that is to say,—

1. That all persons shall, at all reasonable times, either in the day time or at night, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, after the same shall have been completed in accordance with the said plan, and to have ingress to and upon the said wharf, and egress therefrom, and regress thereto, as occasion may require.

2. That the said Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections thereon in good order and repair, and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights:

Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

3. That any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected thereon, and view the state of repairs thereof; and that, upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the said Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring it, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

4. That the said Council shall not erect or suffer to be erected on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.

5. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the said Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

6. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the said Council, and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister.

7. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the said Council six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at the last known address of the said Council.

9. That the said Council shall not sell, mortgage, lease, or otherwise part with, charge, or encumber the said wharf, or any right or privilege hereby conferred upon it, without the consent in writing of the Minister.

10. Nothing contained in this Order in Council shall be deemed to prevent its revocation at any time and without any notice in case the said Council shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf.

And publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the said Council, and to all persons concerned or interested in the said wharf, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 552, against 499 in June, an increase of 53. The deaths in July were 168, a decrease of 5 on the number for June. Of the above deaths, males contributed 100; females, 68. 49 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 29.17 per cent. of the whole number; 28 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 307 in July, against 293 in June, an increase of 14. The deaths in July were 98, against 113 in June, a decrease of 15.

There were 14 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: four males, aged 86, 84, 83, and 71, and two females, both 73 years of age, died at Auckland; two males of 68 and 65 at Wellington; two males of 87 and 73, and a female of 76, at Christchurch; and two males of 84 and 65, and a female of 83, at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases amounted to 17 in July, or 17·35 per cent. of the total deaths, against 22 deaths and 19·47 per cent. in June. Diphtheria caused 4 deaths in July, of which 3 occurred in Christchurch; whooping cough also caused 3 deaths—all in Christchurch—against 5 in the same borough in June. There were 3 deaths from typhoid fever in July against 2 in June.

Constitutional Diseases.—There was a slight decrease in the number of deaths from these diseases compared with the number in the previous month. Cancer caused 2 deaths in July and 6 in June, and phthisis caused 11 deaths in July against 14 in June.

Local Diseases.—These diseases caused 47 deaths in July against 43 in June and 32 in May. In July, 1882, the deaths from these diseases were 33 in number. Diseases of the heart caused 10 deaths in July against 6 in June, and diseases of the urinary organs 6 deaths in July against 2 in June. There were 11 deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs in July and 10 in June.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
