In pursuance of all powers and authorities conferred upon me by "The Public Health Act, 1876," and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in that behalf, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and notify that the Colony of Fiji is no longer infected with the diseases called smallpox, cholera, and measles, being infectious or contagious diseases, highly dangerous to the health of the people, and that a Proclamation to that effect given under my hand, and issued under the Seal of the Colony, on the 17th day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the seventeenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, has no force or effect from the day of the gazetting hereof. gazetting hereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twentieth day of August, 1883.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL. N pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the sixtieth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act,

1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby absolutely prohibit the introduction into the Colony of New Zealand from the countries following, that is to say, Europe, Asia, Africa, America, and the islands in the Atlantic, Pacific, and Indian Oceans, save and except the Australasian Colonies, of all cattle, sheep, horses, swine, and goats, and also of fresh meat, skins, hides, hair, horns, hoofs, offal, or other parts of any such animal, and of all hay, straw, and fodder, and of all fittings which have been used in the transport of any such animal:

And with the like advice and consent doth declare that this Order in Council shall come into force from and after the date hereof: Provided that this Order in Council shall not apply to animals which shall have been shipped from any of the above-mentioned countries before the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under:—

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

MANGANEISEN AND MANGANESE-BRONZE. A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first two thousand five hundred pounds' (£2,500) worth of manganeisen, and a similar bonus for a like amount of manganese-bronze, produced in the colony from New Zealand ores, and sold at a fair market price in a foreign market.

MARBLE.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given for the first fifteen hundred pounds (£1,500) worth of New Zealand marble exported from the colony, and sold in a foreign market at a price of not less than 9s. per cubic foot.

ANTIMONY.

ANTIMONY.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 250 tons of antimony regulus produced in the colony from New Zealand ores, and sold at a fair market price in a foreign market.

Conditions.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colmial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1893.

2. The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1884.

3. The first claimant of any bonus who proves to the satis-

faction of the Government that he has fulfilled all the con-

ditions to be the recipient of the bonus.

4. The other conditions as to quantity, priority, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

WROUGHT-IRON. A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production in New Zealand, by a direct process, of 200 tons of "iron blooms," of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

Conditions.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.

2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1883.

3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st December, 1884.

4. In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but, if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above conditions, he may claim the whole of

producer on the above conditions, he may craim one whole of the bonus.

5. The iron in respect of which any bonus is claimed, and the ore from which it is manufactured, will be examined by an officer to be appointed by the Government, who may require the production of bonâ fide account-sales of quan-tities not less than 100 tons weight, showing that such iron has been sold at a fair market price as wrought-iron.

Special (Sinking) Rules under "The Regulation of Mines Act, 1874."

"The Regulation of Mines Act, 1874."

The penalties for the violation of any special rules established under "The Regulation of Mines Act, 1874," and for offences against the Act, are provided for in sections 22 to 28, in Part VI.

SINKING RULES.

Manager.

1. The owners or agents shall employ efficient officers and persons in and about the pits, and shall provide sufficient machinery, labour, and materials for carrying on the operations in a manner conducive to the safety of the persons employed.

Enginewright.

2. The enginewright is required to see that the authorized signals are understood and strictly observed by the enginemen, banksmen, and sinkers. A copy of such signals must be placed in each enginehouse. Any omission properly to observe any of the signals will be punishable as an offence under the Act.

3. The enginewright is also required to see that the sinking and water tubs, ropes, chains, pulleys, shackles, hooks, and other sinking gear are in good working order. Whenever he

shall find that any of such working articles and materials are defective, he shall immediately order the discontinuance of the use thereof, and he shall see that they are discontinued accordingly, and that other proper articles are substituted.

4. He must personally examine at least once every day the

engines, boilers, capstans, and other machinery, and all parts connected therewith; also the fastening of the ropes to the drums, and all other things appertaining to the sinking

arrangements.

5. He must also see that each boiler is thoroughly cleaned at least once in every month, and oftener if required. He will be required to ascertain and see that the tubes in loco-motive or stationary-engine boiler-flues used in the sinking operations are cleaned as often as necessary.

Engineman.

6. The engineman is required personally to work his engine, and he must not under any circumstances leave it, or allow any person to interfere with or to work his engine during his shift, except when personally ordered by the manager or

enginewright.

7. The engineman must not move the engine except when he receives the proper and authorized signal from the banks man; nor under any circumstances must be leave the handle of his engine whilst the tub, or trunk, or cradle, or any material whatever is hanging on the rope in the shaft, any-where between the bank and the sinkers, or other persons who may be in the shaft.

8. He must always personally see that the ropes are properly adjusted before any person descends the shaft, and before the sinking operations are resumed after any stoppage of more than twenty-four hours at one time, and also, after there has been any repair to any part of the winding tackle, he must run the ropes up and down the shaft with an ordi-

nary loaded tub.

nary loaded tub.

9. He must be particular to steady the rope before each tub or load leaves the top, and also specially before each tub or load leaves the bottom of the shaft.

10. He must not allow more than four persons at one time, and no person at any time to descend the shaft except in a proper tub or trunk. He must also carefully observe and diligently attend to all signals given to him.

11. He must carefully look after and attend to the boilers, and matter ranges safety values and feed numbers and

steam- and water-gauges, safety-valves, and feed-pumps, and other matters under his control. If he shall discover any defect in any part of the machinery, he must immediately report the same to the enginewright, and in his absence to the manager. Until such defect is remedied, he must cease working such machinery.

12. He must, when lowering the tub or any material, stop

the engine when the load is eight yards from the bottom of the pit, and he must also immediately give three distinct signals to the sinkers or other persons in the pit, so as to inform them of the position of the tub or material in the shaft. Under no circumstances must he again start his engine until he has been signalled to do so, and then he must do not sent the shaft.

do so carefully and steadily.

Head Banksman.

13. The head banksman, subject to the manager's or underviewer's directions, shall have full control over the pit-top, and over all persons employed above and below during the progress of sinking.

The head banksman in charge of the shifts shall report to

the head banksman on the incoming shift all instructions. Each head banksman shall carefully examine chains, ropes, capping, running bridge, pumps, and hoops, and at once report if any weakness or defect is found in anything

belonging to the pit-top.

The banksman in charge of the pit-top shall not let a stranger go down the shaft, or let any person remain on the pit-top without written instructions from the manager.

The banksman shall carefully run the bridge over the pit

The banksman shall carefully run the bridge over the pit every time the sinking-trunk or water-barrel comes to the top. All picks, drills, wedges, and other tools must be carefully placed in the trunk when the bridge is over the pit. It is strictly forbidden to put anything in the trunk without having first landed the same on the bridge.

Not more than four men to ride on the sinking-trunk at one time. The banksman shall not allow sinkers to take tools of any kind down with them when men are in the shaft.

The banksman must lash all timber or tools sent down the

pit when on the bridge.

The banksman alone shall give all signals to the engineman, and must not leave the pit-top when men are in the

The banksman shall report to the manager any person that gives a signal or disobeys his instruction.

Sinkers.

One man in each shift will have the entire charge of the pit bottom, subject to the orders from time to time of the manager, underviewer, deputy, or master sinker. This man, called the chargeman, must, before the sinkers proceed with

their work, carefully examine the sides of the pit at the beginning of his shift, and he must remove all loose pieces of stone, bind, or other material. He must also, whenever the men have been out of the bottom of the pit, before the working operations are commenced, or the men descend, examine the ventilation and other arrangements for safety, as directed

the ventilation and other arrangements for safety, as directed by the manager, underviewer, deputy, or master sinker.

15. He must also see that the tubs are properly loaded and steadied before being sent away, and that the outside is free from stones or clay. He must also see that tools and other gear are securely tied to the tub bar before they are sent up.

16. Not more than four persons at any one time, and no person at any time must be allowed to ascend or descend excent in a proper trunk

except in a proper trunk.

17. No person must ride with or against a loaded tub.
18. In no case whatever, nor under any circumstances, must a shot which has missed fire be drilled out. Whenever a shot has missed fire, the working operations must be suspended for at least one hour after the men have come to bank. The chargeman must see that this rule is strictly bank. The carried out.

19. The chargeman must see that the lines are properly kept, and that all bricking and other works are performed in a workmanlike manner, according to contract, or according to the orders of the manager, underviewer, deputy, or master

20. All persons employed will be under the direction of the manager, underviewer, deputy, or master sinker for the time being.
