A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for portions of the Canterbury Interior Main Line of Railway, viz., the Waimakariri Gorge Section, the northern portion (five and a half miles), and the Malvern Section: And whereas all conditions precedent required by law to be observed and performed prior to the taking of such land in the manner hereby provided have been observed and performed respectively:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by sections one hundred and thirty and two hundred and twenty-nine of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken for the portions of the said line of railway hereinbefore specified.

A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the forty-fourth section of "The Sheep Act, 1878," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and order that the Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and all other Proclamations issued under the before-mentioned section, are hereby rescinded.

And I do further proclaim and declare that the places mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be places at which all sheep to be introduced by land into the several sheep districts in the Schedule hereto respectively mentioned shall be crossed over the boundaries of such districts.

SCHEDULE.

NAPIER, AUCKLAND, AND WELLINGTON SHEEP DISTRICTS.

ON the boundary between the Wellington and Napier Sheep Districts, where the coast-line crosses the Waimata Stream.

Near Woodville, where the main road from Napier to Palmerston North crosses at the bridge over the Manawatu River, on the east side of the Manawatu Gorge.

Near Woodville, where the main road from Napier to Masterton crosses at the ferry on the Manawatu River.

Where the main road from Napier to Taupo crosses the boundary of the Napier and the Auckland Sheep Districts.

NELSON AND CANTERBURY SHEEP DISTRICTS.

At the bridge across the Arnold River, where the main road from Reefton to Greymouth crosses the boundary of the Nelson and Canterbury Sheep Districts.

MARLBOROUGH AND CANTERBURY SHEEP DISTRICTS.

The ferry on the Waiau-ua River, known as Arthur's or Upper Waiau Ferry.

The ford or bridge on the Waiau-ua River, opposite the homestead of Leslie Hill's Run.

The ford on the Waiau-ua River, about opposite the Township of Waiau.

MARLBOROUGH AND NELSON SHEEP DISTRICTS.

Where the main road from Blenheim to Nelson, *via* the Tophouse, crosses the boundary of the Marlborough and Nelson Sheep Districts.

Where the main road from Blenheim to Nelson, *via* the Rai Valley, crosses the boundary of the Marlborough and Nelson Sheep Districts.

Where the main road from Amuri to Reefton, *via* Cannibal Gorge, crosses the boundary of the Marlborough and Nelson Sheep Districts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this eleventh day of September, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to make general regulations for the several purposes in the said Act specified: And whereas it is expedient to revoke section five of the general regulations relating to "quarantine," made by Order in Council dated the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and to make a general regulation in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby rescind and revoke section five of the Schedule to the Order in Council dated the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the general regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto.

And doth order and declare that the general regulation hereby made shall apply to the whole colony, and shall come into force upon the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

SCHEDULE.

GENERAL REGULATION.

Quarantine.

5. Cattle arriving from any place beyond the seas and placed in quarantine, shall remain therein for such time not

exceeding ninety (90) days as the Board shall in each case specially direct or require: Provided always that cattle arriving from any place beyond the seas, save and except from the Australasian Colonies, shall, immediately upon arrival, be placed in quarantine, and remain therein for not less than thirty (30) days.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the twenty-fourth section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the reserve made for public recreation in the Provincial District of Auckland, and known as the Hamilton East Recreation-ground, and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of "The Public Domains Act, 1881"; and such domain shall hereafter be managed, administered, and dealt with in manner directed by the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this eleventh day of September, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881":

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Hamilton Domain Board, viz.,—

THE MAYOR, COUNCILLORS, AND BURGESSES OF THE BOROUGH OF HAMILTON

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., at the Borough Council Chambers, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

2. Any one obstructing or preventing the construction of such gratings, or the maintenance of the same in a state of efficiency, and any one destroying or damaging the same, or any of them, shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, to be recovered in manner provided by the said Act.

WHEREAS by "The Diseases in Stock Act, 1872," among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make orders and regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and to rescind the same: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind No. 17 of the regulations dated the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and doth make the following regulation in lieu thereof; that is to say,—

REGULATION.

17. *Sheep introduced from neighbouring Colonies.*—Every sheep introduced by sea into the colony from any place in any of the Australasian Colonies or New Zealand, except King's Island, shall, immediately on being landed, be removed to some quarantine ground determined by the Governor in Council, or to some store or place in the city of Melbourne of which the Chief Inspector of Stock may, by writing under his hand, approve for that purpose, and which shall be deemed a quarantine ground, and shall be detained there until it has been dipped once, or oftener, as the Chief Inspector may direct, in the medicaments provided by the regulations under "The Scab Act, 1870," No. 370, and until the Chief Inspector shall, by writing under his hand, authorize its removal.

And the Honourable John Felix Levien, Her Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 296 in August, against 307 in July, a decrease of 11. The deaths in August were 111, against 98 in July, an increase of 13.

There were 19 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: five males, aged 66, two 71, 76, and 79, and four females of 65, 66, 76, and 77, died at Auckland; two males of 67 and 77, and six females of 67, 74, 75, 79, 80, and 90, at Wellington; and two females of 69 and 75, at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—These diseases caused 19 deaths in August, against 17 in July; of these 19, whooping cough caused 8, all of children. There were 2 deaths from typhoid fever, both in Wellington. One death occurred from diphtheria in Christchurch, against 3 in the previous month; and 1 occurred in each month at Dunedin from the same cause.

Constitutional Diseases.—The number of deaths from these diseases slightly decreased from that in the previous month, although the deaths from phthisis increased from 11 to 13.

Local Diseases.—There was a marked increase in the deaths from these diseases, the numbers having been 47 in July and 56 in August. Diseases of the nervous system were somewhat more fatal, but the number in August included 5 deaths of children from convulsions. Diseases of the respiratory organs caused 17 deaths in August, against 11 in July.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
