A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Southland did, on the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, pass a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervis, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Wednesday, the fourteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in the principal land office of the district.

And, further, in pursuance of the fifth section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," I do hereby fix the price at which the land so described shall be sold to be the price set opposite each allotment in the Schedule hereto.

Altering Boundaries of Counties of Waitemata and Rodney.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in me by section seven of "The Counties Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1892," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the ninth day of October, one thousand eight

hundred and eighty-three, all that portion of land mentioned and described in the First Schedule hereto shall be added to the County of Waitemata, and that from and after the aforesaid date the boundaries of the said County of Waitemata shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto, and that from and after the aforesaid date the boundaries of the County of Rodney shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

DESCRIPTION OF LAND TAKEN FROM THE COUNTY OF RODNEY AND ADDED TO THE COUNTY OF WAITEMATA.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Auckland bounded towards the North-west by the Parishes of Makarau and Puhoi, and by a line along the middle of the Waiwerawera River to its mouth; towards the East by the ocean to the Orewa River; thence towards the South and South-east by that River and Waterloo Creek to the northern corner of Section No. 225, Parish of Waiwera; thence by that section and Sections Nos. 53, 14, and 50, said Parish of Waiwera, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to the south side of the road at the northern corner of Section No. 253, Parish of Pukeatua; thence by the southern side of the road forming the north-western boundary of Section No. 253 aforesaid and the north-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 252, 251, and 250, Parish of Pukeatua aforesaid; thence by the eastern side of the road forming the western boundary of the last-mentioned section and of Section No. 249; thence by the southern side of the road forming the northern boundaries of Sections Nos. 94, 93, 92, 91, 89, 88, 87, 86, 85, and 84 of the last-mentioned parish; thence towards the East by the last-mentioned section to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 306, Parish of Pukeatua; thence again towards the South and towards the South-west by the Waipapa-Kauri Stream to its confluence with the Kaukapakapa River; thence by that river to the eastern boundary-line of Section No. 64, Parish of Kaukapakapa; thence towards the West by that section and the south-western and north-western boundary-lines of Section No. 65 of the last-mentioned parish; thence by Sections Nos. 62, 59, 56, 51, and 26, all of the Parish of Kaukapakapa aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence towards the North and East by the northern and eastern boundary-lines of Section No. 27; thence again towards the North by Section No. 23, Parish of Kaukapakapa aforesaid, to the Parish of Waiwera; thence again towards the West generally by the parish of Kaukapakapa aforesaid, and the Parish of Makarau aforesaid.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

COUNTY OF RODNEY

Is bounded towards the North generally by Hobson and Whangarei Counties; towards the North-east and South-east by the ocean to the Waiwerawera River; thence towards the South by a line along the middle of that river to the Parish of Waiwera, and by that Parish to the Parish of Makarau; thence towards the West and South-east by the latter parish and by a line along the middle of the Makarau River to Kaipara Harbour; and towards the South-west by that harbour and the Wairoa River to Hobson County aforesaid.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

COUNTY OF WAITEMATA

Is bounded towards the North-west, North-east, and again towards the North-west by Rodney County, hereinbefore described, and the Hauraki Gulf; towards the East by the said Hauraki Gulf; towards the South and again towards the East by Waitemata Harbour, and by a line along the middle of the Whau Creek to the Whau Portage Road, and by that road to Manukau Harbour; towards the South-east by the said Manukau Harbour; and towards the South-west and again towards the North-east by the ocean and Kaipara Harbour to Rodney County aforesaid.

Appointing Persons named in Schedule Trustees under "Maori Real Estate Management Acts, 1867-77."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this second day of October, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant or lunatic or other person under legal disability shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judge named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto for sale as a village settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same; that is to say,—

Regulations to be observed in Lock Hospital, Auckland.

WM. F. DRUMMOND JERVOIS,

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Contagious Diseases Act, 1869," His Excellency Sir William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby make the following provisions for the moral and religious training and instruction of the persons detained in the female reformatory at Auckland known as "Lock Hospital," and for the management and government of the said reformatory, namely:—

1. The Lock Hospital, Auckland, is hereinafter referred to as "the said reformatory."

2. "The said Act" means "The Contagious Diseases Act, 1869." All persons committed to the said reformatory under the provisions of the said Act shall be under the direction and control of the matron, and shall be placed on such diet as shall be prescribed by the Visiting Surgeon to such reformatory.

3. Medical examinations under the said Act shall be conducted by the Visiting Surgeon, on the first and third Mondays in each month, at the said reformatory, at 10 a.m.

4. Women detained in the said reformatory shall attend Divine service therein, in accordance with the tenets of their respective denominations; and ministers of all denominations shall have an opportunity afforded to them of conducting a religious service within the said reformatory.

5. A separate register shall be kept, in a book specially appropriated to the purpose, in which the names of all women detained in the said reformatory shall be entered, with the religious persuasion to which they shall declare themselves to belong, and this register shall be open for inspection to all persons visiting the said reformatory.

6. A book shall be kept in which the date of all visits made by ministers of religion shall be entered by them, with any remarks which may appear to such ministers to be appropriate.

7. Stated days and hours shall be appointed, subject to the approval of the Mayor of Auckland, at which ministers of religion may visit women of their own persuasion detained in the said reformatory. The time of such visits to be so arranged as not to interfere with any period of relaxation.

8. In cases of dangerous illness permission may be accorded to ministers of religion to visit women detained in the said reformatory at other times than those regularly stated.

9. No woman detained in the said reformatory shall be required or invited to attend any religious service, or to join in any religious exercise whatever, conducted by a minister or other person of a different denomination from that to which such woman belongs: Provided always that any woman so detained may be permitted so to attend on making a request in writing, or orally before witnesses, to the matron.

10. Ministers of religion and visitors are prohibited from any conversation on religious or controversial subjects with inmates of the said reformatory not registered as of their own denomination, unless at the special request of the inmates themselves, conveyed through the matron, in the manner provided for in the preceding rule.

11. All patients shall rise from and retire to bed, and shall observe such hours for meals, as may from time to time be appointed by the medical officer.

12. All lights used by patients shall be extinguished at 8 p.m. each evening.

The income of each library may be stated either for the year ending 31st December, 1883, or for the year ending with that day in the year 1883 on which the annual accounts of the library were made up.

The distribution will not be in proportion to the several incomes of the libraries; but a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of each income, and the vote of £6,000 will be divided in proportion to the amounts as thus augmented, but so as that no institution shall receive more than £50, and that no payment shall be made in respect of income derived from endowments or grants from Borough or County Councils, or of moneys received for building purposes and not simply for the library itself.

Application to share in the distribution must be made in the form of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made; and such declaration shall be in the following form:—
