A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Prisons Act, 1882," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a prison, and, from and after the gazetted of any such Proclamation, or from any later time specified in the Proclamation, such house, building, enclosure, or place shall be deemed a prison: And whereas it is desirable to proclaim the Police Gaol at Lawrence to be a prison:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby declare that the house and buildings at Lawrence, in the Provincial District of Otago, now constituted as a Police Gaol under the said Act, and all enclosures used or occupied therewith, shall, from and after the publication of this Proclamation in the *Gazette*, be a prison within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Prisons Act, 1882."

*Altering Boundaries of Resident Magistrates' Districts of Hauraki and Waikato.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts to be called Resident Magistrates' districts, and such districts from time to time to abolish, and the

boundaries to define and alter, and, in any such Proclamation, to fix a time on and from which any such district shall be constituted or abolished, as the case may be:

And whereas by Proclamations bearing date the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in him, did define the boundaries of the Resident Magistrates' Districts of Hauraki and Waikato, as described in the said Proclamations respectively:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said districts so defined as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in me as aforesaid, do hereby alter the boundaries of the said Districts of Hauraki and Waikato respectively, and define them as described in the Schedule hereto, as and from the first day of December proximo.

SCHEDULE.

HAURAKI DISTRICT.

BOUNDED towards the East, West, and North by the Frith of the Thames and the sea from Orere Point to Cape Colville; towards the North-east and again towards the East by the sea from Cape Colville aforesaid to Ngakuriawhare; thence towards the South-east generally by a right line in the direction of the summit of Te Aroha Mountain to its intersection by another right line, being the production in a northerly direction of the western boundary of Section No. 15, Block IV., Katikati Survey District; thence by that line to the south-western corner of Section No. 15 aforesaid; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section No. 16, Block IV.; thence by Section No. 16 aforesaid, and by Sections Nos. 65 and 53A of Block VIII., Katikati Survey District, and by a right line to the north-western corner of Section No. 63, Block VIII.; thence by Sections Nos. 63, 62, and 70 of Block VIII., Katikati Survey District, to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line due west to the confiscation boundary-line, and by that line in a southerly direction to the north-eastern angle of the Waiharakeke East Block, No. 2723; thence towards the South generally by a right line to the south-eastern angle of Section No. 9, Block VII., Wairere Survey District, and by the south-eastern boundary-lines of Sections Nos. 9, 10, and 15 of said Block VII., and Section No. 13, Block VI., Wairere Survey District; thence by a right line to the south-eastern angle of Section No. 1, Block VIII., Maungakawa Survey District, and by the south-eastern boundary of that section to the Waitoa River, and by that river, the Te-pae-o-tu-Rawaru Stream, the south-western boundary-line of the

Pakarau Pa Block, No. 767, and the south-eastern boundary of the Matakirae Block, No. 356, to the Piakoiti Stream; and towards the South-west generally by the Piakoiti Stream which forms part of the south-west boundary of said block and the Piako River to its intersection by a right line drawn between the summit of Te Aroha Mountain and the north-eastern angle of the Waikato Military Settlements Block; thence by a right line to Hapuakohe Pass; thence by a right line to the most northerly source of the Whangamarino River; thence by a right line to the nearest point of the Wharekawa Range; thence by a line along the summit of that range and Wairoa Range, and by the leading spur to Orere Point, the place of commencement.

#### WAIKATO DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-west, West, and North from the mouth of the Awaroa Stream; by the northern shore of the Whangape Lake; thence by the Whangape Stream; thence by the right bank of the Waikato River to the Whangamarino River; thence by that river to its most northerly source in the Patarao Range; thence towards the North-east generally by the Hauraki Resident Magistrate's Districts, hereinbefore described, to the north-eastern angle of the Waiharakeke East Block, No. 2723; thence by a line along the summit of the Te Aroha Range to the nearest point to Otanewainuku Mountain, and thence by a right line to the said mountain; thence towards the South-east by a right line to Mōkukakapo; thence by a right line to Rangitoto; thence towards the South by a right line to the source of the Mokau River; thence towards the South-west by a right line bearing north 22° 30' west to the summit of the watershed between the Waipa River and the West Coast; thence towards the West by that summit to Pirongia Mountain, by part of the western boundary of the Military Settlements Block to the north-western angle of that block; thence by a right line to the summit of the watershed between the Waikato River and the West Coast, at a point due east of Waikarea; thence by that summit to a point due west of the mouth of the Awaroa Stream in Whangape Lake; and again towards the North by a right line to said mouth, the place of commencement.

WHEREAS Her Majesty the Queen in Council has been pleased to issue an order, dated the twenty-third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, directing that, on and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, Part II. of "The Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881" (44 and 45 Vict., cap. 69), shall apply to a group of British possessions, including New Zealand, in the said order specified; and has, by such order, further directed that the Governor of each of the said possessions shall cause the said order to be proclaimed in the colony under his government:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jerovis, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and publish the said Order in Council of the twenty-third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by "The Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881," or otherwise, in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

On and after the 1st day of January, 1884, Part II. of "The Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881," shall apply to the group of British possessions hereunder mentioned, that is to say, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, New Zealand, Tasmania, Western Australia, and Fiji.

2. The Governor of each of the said possessions shall cause this order to be proclaimed in the colony under his government.

#### SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

##### SOCIETY ISLANDS.

228. *Tetuaroa*: *Position*.—Information has been received that the position of *Tetuaroa* (Tetiara) Island is lat. 17° 2' S., long. 149° 32' W., and not 149° 47' W., as given on page 599 of Findlay's South Pacific Directory, 4th edition, 1877.

NOTE.—H. O. Chart No. 77 gives the position of the eastern point of this island, lat. 17° 7' S., long. 149° 32' W.

##### FRIENDLY ISLANDS—VAVU GROUP.

229. *Port of Nei-Afo*.—The "Hugon" anchored in the port of Nei-Afo, the entrance to which is very much cramped by the reef of coral which extends to the north-east of Sandy Point (the north point of Kopanghi). The entrance is about 120 yards wide, and to cross the shelf of coral which bars the entrance to the westward of Sandy Point it is only necessary to keep midway between the two shores; it can thus be crossed in about 7½ fathoms.

The anchorage is restricted owing to the great depths in the middle of the bay, which appears to be a superb basin, but presents the inconvenience of enormous depths in almost its entire extent.

The "Hugon" did not get out without difficulty.

Bearings magnetic. Variation, 9° 30' easterly in 1883.

##### FRIENDLY ISLANDS.

The following information is from a report of Captain Ménard, commanding the French corvette "Hugon" in 1882:—

230. *Tongatābu*: *Directions*.—Entering *Tongatābu* from the northward, bring *Mallenoah* to bear S. 44° 30' E., and the north point of *Attataa* S. 45° 30' W. If the weather is clear, the temple at *Nukalofa*, a white building situated on a hill about 100 feet in height, overlooking the white houses of the village, can be seen. Steer for it, bearing S. 3° 30' W., to pass between the buoys on *Juno* and *Nautilus* Banks. If these buoys are not in place, make sure of your position and proceed with caution after reaching the parallel of the north point of *Attataa*. The bearing of the temple, S. 3° 30' W., passes 350 yards from *Juno* and *Nautilus* Banks.

*Juno* Bank (5½ feet) can be distinguished by the brown patch it makes in the water. *Nautilus* Bank is more

dangerous; it is covered with 13 feet of water, and its colour does not distinguish it from the surrounding bottom, which can be here seen at a depth of about 6 fathoms.

*Anchorage*.—The "Hugon" anchored in 11 fathoms, mud bottom, with the temple bearing S. 79° 30' W., and the west point of *Tafao* (*Faffao*) Island N. 12° 30' E.

*Pilots*.—The Government Pilot did not present himself on board the "Hugon" until she was inside the *Juno* Buoy.

*Soundings*.—Captain Ménard had soundings taken in the bay, and was unable to find a trace of the line of depths of from 5 to 8 fathoms, put down on the charts to the north-westward of *Mallenoah*. This line was gone over in four different places by the boats and in two other places by the "Hugon," and no bottom was found at 10 fathoms. No discoloration can be seen, even from the tops.

The bank of 1½ feet, marked on the chart to the southward and westward of *Mallenoah*, was not found; the boats sounded 275 yards from the position of this bank, upon which there was no sign of breakers, although the sea at the time was somewhat rough.

Bearings magnetic. Variation 9° 30' westerly in 1883.

##### CAROLINE ISLAND.

233. *Description*.—*Caroline* Island or atoll is of coral formation, of the lagoon type, and in shape is an irregular elongated oval.

It is five and three-quarters miles long from N.N.E. to S.S.W., and its circumference, measured on the outer or encircling reef, is, approximately, thirteen miles. The greatest breadth is at the lower end, where it measures one and one-eighth miles, and the average width is three-quarters of a mile. The atoll consists of a chain of twenty-five small islands, well covered with trees and shrubbery. The enclosing reef fringes the shore, and on its outer edge the surf breaks with considerable violence.

There is a passage through or over this reef, near the lower end, which is deep enough to permit ships' boats to penetrate to the lagoon at high-water.

*Climate*.—The climate of the island, though warm, is pleasant, and the temperature is equable. The weather, though mostly fine, is somewhat changeable, occasional sudden showers occurring, generally at night or early in the morning.

*Winds*.—The prevailing winds in April and May are from the northward and eastward.

*Inhabitants*.—The island is inhabited at the present time by seven persons—four men, one woman, and two children, who are engaged in the planting and care of coconut trees, now about 8 feet high. There are two mahogany trees on the southern island.

*Water*.—The source of fresh water is the rains, which percolate through the sands and collect upon the coral rock. There are two shallow wells on the lower island and one on the upper or northern island.

*Supplies*.—Several varieties of birds abound, the principal ones being herons, frigate birds, gannets, boobies, &c.; the game birds are curlew, snipe, and plover. There are no animals except a species of small rat, and but few fowls. Fish are abundant and in great variety.

*Tides*.—For the outer reef it is high-water, full and change at four hours; springs rise 1 foot 7 inches; neaps rise 5 inches.

Observations show no relation between the tides in the lagoon and those outside. The lagoon is open to windward, and the tides are evidently much affected by the wind.

*Position*.—The *Transit* Pier on the lower island: Lat. 10° S.; long. 150° 15' W. (The longitude is subject to verification on the return of the eclipse expedition to Washington.)

The *Transit* Pier still remains on the island, and is crowned with a marble slab bearing the following inscription: "U.S. Solar Eclipse Party, May 6, 1883."

The meridian line established by the transit instrument was used in surveying.

*Directions*.—Vessels intending to visit *Caroline* Island should pass to the south-westward or lee side of the atoll, and sight the flagstaff standing among the trees, 130 feet W.N.W. ¼ W. from the *Transit* Pier. It is easily distinguished, and in the day-time an English ensign will probably be hoisted as the vessel nears the land. When the flagstaff bears S.E. by E. ¼ E., if the vessel stands close to the reef, which is bold, the boat-landing may be distinguished near the fluke of an anchor just inside the surf on the reef.

It is formed by an indentation in the reef rocks, about 50 feet deep, into which the boat must be pulled on the back of a roller. A sheer to port should be given to the boat when within the indentation, to avoid some projecting coral rock on the starboard hand. When this is passed a landing may be made on the flat coral reef. The reef does not dry at low-water.

The entrance described in Hydrographic Notice No. 32 of 1879 as existing on the eastern or windward side of the island does not penetrate to the central lagoon, but leads into a small

*cul-de-sac.* A very small craft might, perhaps, enter in very calm weather.

There is a small lagoon in the northern island, as stated in Hydrographic Notice No. 21 of 1878.

Every public library maintained by rates will be entitled to share in the distribution according to its income from rates; and every library maintained by subscriptions and voluntary contributions will be entitled to share according to its income from subscriptions and voluntary contributions: Provided in either case that the income for the year has not been less than £2; and that admission to the library, if within a borough, is open to the public free of charge.

The income of each library may be stated either for the year ending 31st December, 1883, or for the year ending with that day in the year 1883 on which the annual accounts of the library were made up.

The distribution will not be in proportion to the several incomes of the libraries; but a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of each income, and the vote of £6,000 will be divided in proportion to the amounts as thus augmented, but so as that no institution shall receive more than £50, and that no payment shall be made in respect of income derived from endowments or grants from Borough or County Councils, or of moneys received for building purposes and not simply for the library itself.

Application to share in the distribution must be made in the form of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made; and such declaration shall be in the following form:—
