A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage district known as the Oxford District; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

WEST OXFORD DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east by a right line from Ashley Head to Block Hill; thence towards the East generally by a right line to the source of the River Ashley, and by the right bank of that river to Section No. 32765; thence by that section and Sections Nos. 21713, 23104, 20779, 20778, 20780, 21903, 26015, 17831, 20519, 12705, 17828, 12741, 12728, 2377, 1504, 1391, 1560, 1561, 1839, 1889, 1890, and 16980 to the River Eyre; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Reserve No. 1651, and by that reserve and Sections Nos. 26568, 26373, 31939, 30860, 27041, 24534, 28027, 29947, and by the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 32487 to the road-line which forms the southern boundary of that section; thence by that road-line and by the road-line which forms the boundary between Sections Nos. 32020 and 32019 to the Waimakariri River; thence by a line due south to the right bank of that river; thence towards the South-west and West by the right bank of the Waimakariri River to a point in line with the northern boundary-line of old Run 270, Class 3; thence towards the North by a right line to and by that boundary-line to the summit of the Puketiraki Range; and thence towards the North-west generally by that range to Ashley Head, the place of commencement.

EAST OXFORD DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east from a point on the right bank of the River Ashley in the Upper Valley in line with the north-eastern boundary of Native Reserve No. 893, by a right line to and by that boundary to the River Garry; thence across the River Garry and by its left bank to the River Ashley; thence by a line due south to the right bank of the River Ashley; thence towards the South by the right bank of that river to its intersection by a right line drawn between trig. pole No. 16, situated on the north bank of that river, and the north-west corner of Section No. 9791; thence

towards the South-east by that line to the north-west corner of said Section No. 9791, and a right line thence to the north-west corner of Section No. 13684, the boundary-lines between old Runs 223, Class 2, and 203, Class 2, old Runs 95 and 108, Class 2, old Runs 135 and 119, and the last-mentioned boundary-line produced to the right bank of the Waimakariri River; thence towards the South by that bank; and thence towards the West generally by the West Oxford District, hereinbefore described, to the point of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

A PROCLAMATION.

Agreements for Relief of Distressed Seamen between Great Britain and Austria-Hungary and Great Britain and Denmark.

AGREEMENTS for the mutual relief of distressed seamen have been made between the British Government and the Governments of Austria-Hungary and of Denmark. These agreements are similar to that made between Great Britain and Sweden and Norway, which is published at page 1281 of the *New Zealand Gazette* for 1881.

Making By-laws for the Control of Traffic over Gore Railway Bridge.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 144 of "The Public Works Act, 1882" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), I, Walter Woods Johnston, the Minister for Public Works, do hereby make the following by-laws for regulating the traffic over the railway bridge at Gore, being a bridge used both for ordinary and railway traffic, such by-laws to come into force from and after the 1st day of December, 1883, that is to say,—

1. All horses which are not driven in harness, or led by bridle or halter, and all cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, mules, and donkeys, crossing the bridge, must have a man in charge behind and before them.
2. Passengers will not be allowed to enter upon the bridge within ten minutes, horses or light-wheeled vehicles and drays within twenty minutes, and cattle and sheep or pigs within thirty minutes, of the advertised time of arrival and departure of any train from the Gore Railway Station.
3. Horsemen or wheeled vehicles will not be allowed to travel at a greater rate than six miles an hour across the bridge.
4. Traction engines and portable engines employed in agriculture, flax-dressing, and other purposes may pass over the bridge on their own wheels, provided they have no fewer than four travelling wheels with tires not less than five inches broad. The boiler must be empty, and all fire must be drawn at least half a mile distant from the bridge.
5. No greater weight than three tons gross on any one pair of wheels with tires less than five inches broad will be permitted to cross the bridge.
6. The restrictions provided in clause two of these by-laws for advertised trains shall be in force with respect to special trains.
7. Any person in a state of intoxication will not be permitted to enter upon the bridge whilst in such condition.
8. Any person or persons entering upon the bridge within the prohibited hours, or resisting any gatekeeper in the execution of his duty, or in any way offending against any of these by-laws, will be subject to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each offence.

Public Libraries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £6,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 31st January, 1884, and no claim will be considered that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, before the 22nd January, 1884.

Every public library maintained by rates will be entitled to share in the distribution according to its income from rates; and every library maintained by subscriptions and voluntary contributions will be entitled to share according to its income from subscriptions and voluntary contributions: Provided in either case that the income for the year has not been less than £2; and that admission to the library, if within a borough, is open to the public free of charge.

The income of each library may be stated either for the year ending 31st December, 1883, or for the year ending with that day in the year 1883 on which the annual accounts of the library were made up.

The distribution will not be in proportion to the several incomes of the libraries; but a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of each income, and the vote of £6,000 will be divided in proportion to the amounts as thus augmented, but so as that no institution shall receive more than £50, and that no payment shall be made in respect of income derived from endowments or grants from Borough or County Councils, or of moneys received for building purposes and not simply for the library itself.

Application to share in the distribution must be made in the form of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made; and such declaration shall be in the following form:—
