WHEREAS by "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that, where the foreshore has been legally vested in any Harbour Board or other local been legally vested in any Harbour Board or other local governing body, it may from time to time, subject to the provisions of the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," license and permit any part of the foreshore to be used or occupied, inter alia, for the erection of baths and bath-houses, and any enclosure or fence necessary for the protection or privacy of the same: And whereas by the said Act it is also provided that every licensee shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have power to make and construct any necessary reclamation for the purpose of erecting on the foreshore comprised in his license, or upon any land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore which shall be specified in such license, any building, structure, erection, or other works to enable him to obtain the full benefit of such license: And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that every such license shall be in writing under the seal of the Board or body granting the same, and may be for any period not exceeding fourteen

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 468, against 562 in October, a decrease of 94. The deaths in November were 135, a decrease of 65 on the number for October. Of the above deaths, males contributed 70; females, 65. 63 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 46.67 per cent. of the whole number; 39 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 years of age and 5 years and upwards, and the Proportions per Cent. of Deaths from each cause, in the Boroughs of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, that were registered during the Month of November, 1883.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—
The births were 279 in November, against 331 in October, a decrease of 52. The deaths in November were 83, against 121 in October, a decrease of 38.

There were 7 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: two females of 76 and 69 died at Auckland; three females of 82, 73, and 70 at Wellington; a male of 91 at Christchurch; and a male of 71 at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The number of deaths from these causes in the four principal boroughs fell from 32 in October to 18 in November. The decrease was caused chiefly by a lesser mortality from whooping-cough in the latter month—5 deaths, against 18 in October. Of these 5 deaths, 3 occurred in Dunedin, against 12 in October. There was 1 death from scarlet fever last month at Auckland.

Constitutional Diseases.—These complaints resulted in 13 deaths during November, against 17 in the previous month.

Local Diseases.—The number of deaths for November was 33, or a decrease of 18 on the number in October, owing principally to a reduced mortality from diseases of the respiratory organs. Bronchitis was less prevalent in all the boroughs during November than in October, the total number of deaths being only 6 against 16. Pleurisy, asthma, and congestion of the lungs, to which 6 deaths were ascribed in October, were only fatal in one case during November.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
