Authorizing Messrs. P. and J. McLeod to build a Wharf at Helensville, Kaipara.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of December, 1882.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE
GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted, *inter alia*, that in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence the Governor in Council may authorize any person to construct harbour works (other than the reclamation of land from the sea or any harbour, or the construction of any graving dock, dock, or breakwater in any harbour or in the sea) for the use and benefit of the public, and to use and occupy such part of the foreshore, or of any tidal land or tidal water, as may be necessary for the construction or use of such harbour works: And whereas by the seventeenth section of the said Act it is also enacted that every such Order in Council shall be made upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit, and the rights thereby conferred shall only be granted for a limited period, not exceeding in any case fourteen years, and may at any time be altered, modified, or revoked:

And whereas Messrs. P. and J. McLeod desire to build a wharf, for the use, benefit, and convenience of the public, in Kaipara Harbour, a place where no Harbour Board is in existence, and the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod have applied to the Governor in Council for the issue of this order:

And whereas the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod have deposited plans of the said wharf (marked M.D. 722 and 723) at the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in the manner prescribed

by the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of the said Act, and, it having been made to appear to the Administrator of the Government in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, the Administrator of the Government in Council hath this day approved of the said deposited plans, subject to the conditions set forth in this Order in Council:

Now, therefore, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorize the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod to build, in the Kaipara River, Kaipara Harbour, on the site shown on the plan marked M.D. 722, for the use, benefit, and convenience of the public, a wharf, in accordance with the said plan marked M.D. 723, and to use and occupy such portion of the foreshore or of any tidal land or tidal water as may be necessary for the construction and use of such wharf, subject to the following conditions, that is to say,—

1. That all persons shall, at all reasonable times, either in the daytime or at night, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, after the same shall have been completed in accordance with the said plan, and to have ingress to and upon the said wharf, and egress therefrom, and regress thereto, as occasion may require.

2. That the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections thereon in good order and repair, and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at their own cost any such lights: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

3. That the dues and rates to be charged for the use of such wharf shall be the same as are charged for the use of the Railway Wharf at Helensville,

ERRATUM.—In *New Zealand Gazette* No. 93, of the 8th November, 1882, page 1622, notification setting apart land on deferred payments in Auckland, Waimata Survey District, section 13, 315 acres, for "Block VIII.," read "Block IV."

and shall be paid to the Railway Wharfinger at Helensville.

4. That any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected thereon, and view the state of repair thereof; and that, upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring them, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

5. That the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod shall not erect or suffer to be erected on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Minister.

6. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by the Harbourmaster at Kaipara.

8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

9. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at the last known address of the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod.

10. That the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod shall not sell, mortgage, lease, or otherwise part with, charge, or encumber the said wharf, or any right or privilege hereby conferred upon it, without the consent in writing of the Minister.

11. Nothing contained in this Order in Council shall be deemed to prevent its revocation at any time and without any notice in case the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf.

And publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the said Messrs. P. and J. McLeod, and to all persons concerned or interested in the said wharf, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Public Works Act, 1882," it is enacted that, if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under that Act or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise however, for public works, is not required for public use, the Governor may, by an Order in Council, publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein set forth:

And whereas the Minister acting for the Minister for Public Works has laid before the Governor the memorial referred to in the section aforesaid, praying the Governor, by an Order in Council, to cause such land to be sold:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities aforesaid, do hereby order and authorize the land described in the Schedule hereto to be sold and dealt with in the manner and subject to the conditions of the fourteenth and following sections of the above in part recited Act.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land containing 13 acres 1 rood 2 perches, more or less, being portion of Railway Reserve No. 4 (in red), Block IX., on the map of the Arnold Survey District. Bounded towards the North by Sections 1420 and 1112; towards the South by a line across said Reserve No. 4 (in red), by Section 1113, by Kaiata Creek, and Sections 1114 and 1419; and towards the West by Reserve No. 34 (in red): as the same is more particularly delineated on the map attached to the memorial above referred to.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT
IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Education Act, 1877," the Administrator of the Government, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, doth make the regulation hereto attached prescribing the fees to be paid by pupils for receiving instruction in higher education at the District High School therein mentioned; and, with the like advice and consent, doth order that the said regulation shall take effect from the date hereof.

REGULATION.

In the District High School at Riverton the fees for higher education within the meaning of section fifty-six of "The Education Act, 1877," shall be ten shillings a quarter for not more than one subject, and five shillings a quarter for each subject in excess of one.

Notification of Consent to Deviation of Waimate Railway.

JAMES PRENDERGAST,

WHEREAS the Waimate Railway Company (Limited) propose, in terms of the forty-third section of "The District Railways Act, 1877," to deviate the railway from the line of works laid down in the plan and described in the book of reference prepared under section four of the said Act, and to take and use for the purpose of such deviation land not comprised within the limits of deviation set forth in such plan and book of reference: And whereas the consent in writing has been obtained of the owners of the land through which the said deviation of the railway passes:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, Knight, Chief Justice, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby notify and declare that I do hereby consent to such deviation of the Waimate Railway, as set forth in the plan and Schedule hereto attached.

SCHEDULE.

THE middle line leaves limits of deviation at a point in Reserve No. 145 about 100 links to the eastward of the Gorge Road, and about 2000 links to the south of the junction of the said Gorge Road with Queen Street, in the Borough of Waimate; thence crosses said Gorge Road and Crown lands lying to the west of the said road in a south-westerly direction to the Waimate Creek; thence crosses the said creek; thence crosses Rural Section No. 6411 and enters Rural Section No. 6298 at a point about 1650 links from the junction of boundary-line between Rural Sections Nos. 6411 and 6298 with the Gorge Road; thence in a south-westerly direction passes through Rural Sections Nos. 6298, 10724, 6302, and I.P.R. to Rural Section No. 10406, where it re-enters original limits of deviation at a point on northern boundary-line of said Rural Section No. 10406 distant about 6½ chains (650 links) from junction of said boundary-line with the Gorge Road.

The middle line leaves limits of deviation at a point in Rural Section No. 15888 about 200 links south of the easternmost corner of Rural Section No. 12378; thence intersects south-west end of boundary-line between Rural Sections Nos. 12378 and 11585; thence in a south-westerly direction passes through Rural Sections Nos. 11585, 12379, 15888, 15887 to a point in the eastern boundary of Rural Section No. 17868 25 links south of Rural Section No. 14754; thence passes through Rural Section No. 17868 at a distance of 25 links from Rural Sections Nos. 14754 and 17849 to a point about 200 links from the southernmost point of Rural Section No. 17849; thence passes through said Rural Section No. 17849 for a distance of about 500 links; thence passes through Rural Sections Nos. 17868 and 17867 to a point in said Rural Section No. 17867 distant about 25 links from its southern boundary and 350 links from its eastern boundary where the said middle line re-enters original limits of deviation.

The middle line leaves original limits of deviation at a point in Rural Section No. 22167 distant about 1050 links from western boundary of Section No. 17867 and 2900 links from the main road; thence passes in a generally westerly direction through Rural Section No. 22167 to the Waihao River Terrace at a point about 2300 links to the south-east of

intersection of the said terrace with the main road; thence passes along the face of the said terrace to the main road at its crossing of the north branch of the Waihao River; thence crosses the said north branch at a distance of 20 feet from the centre of the present traffic bridge to the intersection of the main road with the Elephant Hill Road; thence across the said Elephant Hill Road, which is to be diverted as shown on plan; thence through Rural Section No. 22624 to the south branch of the Waihao River; thence across the said south branch and Rural Section No. 20175 to the Elephant Hill Road; thence across the said Elephant Hill Road at a point about 2500 links from where said road crosses the south branch of the Waihao River; thence through Rural Section No. 18960 to a point about 2000 links east of Rural Section No. 20508 and 600 links south of Elephant Hill Road, where the said middle line re-enters the original limits of deviation: as the same is more particularly delineated upon the plan marked P.W.D. 9528, hereto attached.

Alterations in Na Mbukalou Light.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 41, dated the 22nd March, 1881, on the establishment of a light at Na Mbukalou, Suva Harbour, information has been received from Captain C. A. G. Bridge, H.M.S. "Espiegle," dated the 16th June, 1882, that the following alterations have been made in the light:—

The light (green), elevated 25 feet above high water, is now shown from a lantern painted white, on a pole placed close to high-water mark, W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. from its previous position; it is obscured southward of a line passing 50 yards north of the easternmost of the two white buoys within the harbour entrance, also obscured northward of a line passing 50 yards south of the black buoy marking Wai-Lami Spit.

The bearing is magnetic. Variation $9\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ easterly in 1882.

NOTE.—The church on the hill above Na Mbukalou has been removed.

NOTES FOR JULY, 1882.

Auckland.—Constantly wet and stormy, chiefly from W. and S.W.; maximum rain recorded on 28th, 2-680 in.; very strong wind on 2nd and 16th from W., and on 11th from E.; thunder on 15th, 21st, and 22nd; hail on 15th, 19th, and 22nd.

Wellington.—Unpleasant showery squally weather almost throughout month; strong winds on 6th from S.E., 8th, 12th, and 14th from N.W., on 15th from S.W., and 26th and 27th from N.W.; thunder on 14th and 15th; hail on 8th and 15th; fog on 20th and 22nd; very heavy rainfall during night of 27th, 2-9 in. recorded on 28th, causing floods and doing much damage; only a few fine days; prevailing N.W. wind.

Lincoln.—Showery month, though rainfall about the average; the maximum fall recorded on 23rd, .46 in.; strong winds on 12th from N.E., and 22nd and 23rd from S.W., otherwise moderate and prevailed from N.E. and S.W.

Dunedin.—Fine until middle of month, when cold wet weather set in with prevailing S.W. and W. winds, and stormy on 22nd, 30th and 31st; maximum rain recorded on 30th, 2-508 in.; snow fell on 17th, 18th, and 30th; fog on 28th.

GENERAL REMARKS.—A very wet unpleasant month, with strong S.W. and W. winds, very low pressure. Earthquakes occurred at Wellington on 24th at midnight, slight, and on 25th, early morning, slight.

NOTES FOR AUGUST, 1882.

Auckland.—From 1st to 19th showery, with low barometer; 20th to 21st fine and mild, mostly cloudy, with high pressure; strong wind on 13th from S.E. to S., and 26th from S. to S.W., otherwise moderate and variable; maximum rain on 3rd, .615 in.

Wellington.—First three days tolerably fine, but dull from N.E., then almost continued wet weather up to 15th, with S.E. wind and frequently stormy; 2-4 in. rain recorded on 14th, the maximum for month, causing floods; hail on 16th and 18th, remainder showery with intervals of fine days; wind chiefly N.W., and stormy on 18th, 23rd, 27th, and 30th; altogether a wet unpleasant month.

Lincoln.—Generally pleasant weather with light showers; the maximum rainfall recorded on 5th, .60 in.; variable winds and moderate; hail on 17th and 19th.

Dunedin.—Changeable with light showers; the maximum rainfall on 19th, .18 in.; strong S.W. wind on 25th, 28th, and 29th, otherwise moderate and prevailed from that quarter; hail on 16th; fog on 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th.

GENERAL REMARKS.—Fine generally in North and South, but at Central Station much rain and stormy weather prevailed.

NOTES FOR SEPTEMBER, 1882.

Auckland.—Variable weather, showery but not much rainfall; the maximum recorded on 26th, 1-160 in.; from 22nd to 28th very stormy from S.W. and W., from which quarter the wind prevailed; violent thunder storm on 26th; hail on 24th and 25th; fog on 6th and 7th.

Wellington.—Generally stormy weather, with prevailing N.W. wind; very strong wind on 6th, 7th, 8th, 14th, 20th, 21st, 25th, and 27th from N.W., and on 9th, 15th, and 23rd from S.W.; maximum rainfall recorded on 15th, .85 in.; small total rainfall, but some heavy showers; thunder on 25th and 26th; hail on 9th and 23rd.

Lincoln.—Fine weather; very small total rainfall, the maximum recorded on 9th, 1-08 in., nearly the total fall; moderate and variable winds; thunder on 23rd.

Dunedin.—Fine during early part but showery and changeable during latter; the maximum rainfall on 9th, .418 in.; moderate winds prevailing from S.W. and W.; on 24th squally and cold from that quarter, also snow and hail.

GENERAL REMARKS.—Stormy and wet weather with heavy showers, though total rain not excessive in the North; frequent thunder and hail and N.W. and S.W. winds; generally fine at Southern stations.
