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Land taken for Portions of Foxton-New Plymouth Railway, between 1 mile 25 chains and 16 miles.

 A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS a portion of a certain railway was proclaimed in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, under the name of the Foxton to Manawatu Railway (Foxton to Palmerston), and the said railway now forms part of the Foxton to New Plymouth Railway:

And whereas the two hundred and twenty-ninth section of "The Public Works Act, 1882," enacts that any public work authorized under the authority of any Act repealed by this Act, or of any Act or Ordinance repealed by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and any land required to be taken, purchased, or acquired for such work, or anything commenced under any such authority as aforesaid, may be continued, taken, purchased, or acquired, executed, carried out, enforced, and completed under the provisions of this Act:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required for portions of the said Foxton to New Plymouth Railway:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue and in pursuance of the power conferred upon him by the one hundred and thirtieth and two hundred and twenty-ninth sections of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby proclaim and declare that the said land so described in the Schedule hereto is taken for the said portions of the said railway from Foxton to New Plymouth.

ALL that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement 1 acre, being part of Public Reserve No. 477, Block I., in the Mount Robinson Survey

District, commencing at a point on the western boundary of public road, Foxton to Palmerston, 6913 links distant from the south-east corner of said reserve. All that piece of land containing by admeasurement 6 acres 2 roods 21 perches, being part of the Lower Horangi Block, Manawatu District, commencing at the junction of the Oroua River with the south boundary of the public road intersecting the said block. Bounded—Generally Northerly by the said public road, by lines 105, 1360, 2014, 1281, 2562, 1283, and 1159 links respectively; North-east by a public road, 96 links; generally Southerly by lines, 1225, 1282, 2583, 1321, 2021, 50, 1340, and 105 links respectively; Westerly by the Oroua River, 30 links, to the point of commencement.

All that piece of land containing by admeasurement 7 acres 3 roods 15 perches, being part of the Lower Horangi Block, Manawatu District, commencing at the junction of the southern boundary of the road-line with the eastern boundary of the public road bearing 113° 59'. Bounded—Generally Northerly and Westerly by lines, 1428, 171, 979, 934, 1882, 542, and 2010 links respectively; towards the East by another part of the said public road bearing 23° 39', 170 links; generally Southerly and Easterly by lines, 1854, 503, 1875, 959, 1000, 188, and 1355 links respectively; South-westerly, 128 links, by the public road aforesaid to the point of commencement.

All that piece of land containing by admeasurement 3 acres 1 rood 7 perches, being part of the Lower Horangi Block, Manawatu District, commencing at an angle of the public road formed by lines bearing respectively 23° 39' and 59° 35'. Bounded—Generally North-westerly by the south boundary of the said public road, 4078 links; East by Section No. 89, Karere Block, 84 links; South-east by a line, 4164 links; West by the said public road, 136 links, to the point of commencement.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may at any time, upon the petition of the Mayor and Council of a borough, by a Proclamation publicly notified, alter the boundaries of such borough so as to include therein any part of the foreshore: And whereas a petition has been presented to me by the Mayor and Councillors of the Borough of the City of Auckland, praying me, amongst other things, to alter the boundaries of the said borough so as to include therein the piece of land described in the First Schedule hereto, being part of the foreshore of the Waitemata Harbour:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said borough are hereby altered so as to include within the limits of the said borough the land described in the First Schedule hereto, the said land being added to the East Ward of the said borough; and that the said borough shall henceforth be bounded as specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that area containing by admeasurement 1 acre 3 roods, more or less; and bounded towards the North by Waitemata Harbour, 1354 links; and towards the East, South, and West by the boundary-lines of the Borough of Auckland, 76 links, 1350 links, and 76 links respectively: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

Town District of Stratford, Taranaki, constituted.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition, so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of the Stratford Town District; and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners of the said district shall consist of five in number.

SCHEDULE.

Special Mining District under Section 66 of "The Mines Act, 1877."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section sixty-six of "The Mines Act, 1877," power is given to the Governor to proclaim special mining districts for the pre-emption of homesteads, and for the purposes contemplated in the said section:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said section sixty-six of "The Mines Act, 1877," and of all other powers and authorities thereunto enabling me, do hereby proclaim and declare the piece of land described in the Schedule hereto to be a special mining district for the purposes of the sixty-sixth section of "The Mines Act, 1877."

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, situate in the Counties of Tuapeka and Southland. Bounded towards the North and North-east by Vincent and Maniototo Counties respectively from Lorn Peak to Lammerlaw; thence by Taieri County to and by Lee's Stream to the north-west boundary of the Traquair Hundred; thence towards the South-east, East, and North by the said hundred to the West Taieri Hundred; thence again towards the South-east by the said West Taieri Hundred to the County of Bruce; thence towards the South and again towards the South-east by Bruce County to Mount Stuart Trig. Amending Regulations for Addition of Interest on Floating Balances, Public Trustee's Account.

IN COUNCIL.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Trust Office Act Amendment Act, 1873," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, James Prendergast, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the

advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby order and declare that the regulations prescribed by the Governor in Council on the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, in respect of interest on floating balances to credit of estates held in the Public Trust Office, shall be and the same are hereby amended in part as follows:—

In lieu of provision (3) of regulation number "4" providing—
 "That interest shall only be added to the balance at credit of an estate so as to form part of the principal on the thirtieth day of June in each year, the following provision shall take effect, viz.:—
 "(3.) Interest shall only be added to the balance at credit of an estate (so as to form part of the principal fund thereof) on the thirty-first day of December in each and every year."

And such amended regulation shall form and be read as part of the regulations so prescribed as aforesaid.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 425, against 473 in November, a decrease of 48. The deaths amounted to 164 in December, an increase of 20 on the number for November. Of the above deaths, males contributed 92; females, 72. 82 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 50.00 per cent. of the whole number; 66 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The following Table shows the Causes of the Deaths of Persons of both Sexes under 5 years of age and 5 years and upwards, and the Proportions per Cent. of Deaths from each cause, in the Boroughs of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, that were registered during the Month of December, 1882.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 229 in December, against 258 in November, a decrease of 29.

The deaths in December were 114, against 87 in November, an increase of 27.

There were 9 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: two males aged 67 and 73 died at Auckland; a male of 78 and a female of 68 at Wellington; a female of 69 at Christchurch; two males of 67 and 72, and two females of 67 and 76, at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases in December were more numerous than in November, the numbers having been 20 and 15 respectively. The increase is due to the larger number of deaths from diarrhoea—3 in November, 9 in December. The deaths from zymotic diseases were fewer than in December, 1881, when the number was 24.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases also caused a larger number of deaths than in the previous month: the deaths from phthisis having increased from 9 in November to 15 in December.

Local Diseases.—There was a large increase in the deaths from these causes in December, the numbers having been 40 in November and 50 in December. The increase is attributable to a larger number of infantile deaths given as from convulsions, and an increase in the deaths from diseases of the heart, these deaths having been 5 in November and 10 in December.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases also caused a larger number of deaths than in the previous month: the deaths from phthisis having increased from 9 in November to 15 in December.

Local Diseases.—There was a large increase in the deaths from these causes in December, the numbers having been 40 in November and 50 in December. The increase is attributable to a larger number of infantile deaths given as from convulsions, and an increase in the deaths from diseases of the heart, these deaths having been 5 in November and 10 in December.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
