A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the above-named Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is set apart for sale on deferred payments; and that Wednesday, the twentieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, shall be the day on which the said land shall be open for application at the Land Office at Auckland, in allotments as surveyed and marked on the selection map in that office.

Defining the Middle Line of further Portion of the Wellington-Napier Railway (*Awapuua Bridge Contract*).

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Wellington to Napier is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is, in the seventh section thereof, declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the aforesaid section seven of "The Public Works Act, 1879," and by sections one hundred and twenty-nine and one hundred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point in Mangatainoka Block number one (B), Native reserve, Provincial District of Wellington, to a point in Section number one hundred and seventy-three, Block eight, Woodville Survey District, Provincial District of Hawke's Bay, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 10,000, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honourable Walter Woods Johnston, the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and also in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Napier, in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay.

WHEREAS by "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may declare his intention to make, change, exchange, or alter the dedication of any public reserve now or hereafter vested in Her Majesty or the Governor for any of the purposes named in Class II. of the Schedule to the said Act, whether the same be granted or not; and, in the case of any reserves made under the authority of section one hundred and forty-four of "The Land Act, 1877," if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to change the purpose of such reserves or any part thereof from the purpose or presumed purpose for which it was set apart to any other purpose, or if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to exchange any of the land comprised in such reserve for other land of equal value, to be dedicated to one or more purposes named in the said Class II., the Governor may, by notice in the *Gazette*, declare his intention to make such change, exchange, or dedication, as the case may be, and in such notice declare the manner and terms in which the same is intended to be so made:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," aforesaid, declare my intention to change the specific purpose of the reserve described in the first column of the Schedule hereto to the specific purpose set opposite such description in the second column of the said Schedule.

COUNTY OF WAITAKI.—BY-LAW No. 5.

A By-law to regulate the Width of Tires.

In pursuance of the provisions of "The Counties Act, 1882," the Council of the County of Waitaki doth hereby order as follows, that is to say,—

1. On and after the gazettement of this by-law the width of the tires of all the wheels of every vehicle drawn on any of the county roads by five or more than five horses shall be not less than six inches; and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

2. It shall be lawful for any member of the Waitaki County Council, or for any person acting under the authority of the Council, or for any policeman or constable, to examine and measure the width of the tires of the wheels of any vehicle, cart, dray, wain, wagon, or other carriage affected by the first section of this by-law; and every owner or driver of any such cart, dray, wain or wagon, or other carriage, after such measuring and examination shall have been lawfully required, refusing to permit such examination and measuring, or turning or driving out of the road in order to hinder, evade, or avoid such examination and measuring, or in any way hindering or obstructing the same, shall, for every offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

3. Nothing herein contained shall apply to any vehicle upon springs used exclusively for carrying passengers or other persons and their luggage, or for the carriage of Her Majesty's mails, or for the conveyance of any piece of heavy machinery which cannot be taken apart without great expense, loss, or inconvenience.

4. Every vehicle carrying, or constructed to carry, goods or merchandise of any kind whatsoever for hire, and every vehicle carrying passengers for hire, in actual use on any county road, shall have the Christian name and the surname and place of abode of the owner thereof painted on some conspicuous part on the off-side thereof in white letters on a black ground, such letters not being less than one inch in length and of a proportionate breadth; and the owner of any such vehicle who shall neglect to have such name and place of abode painted as aforesaid, or who shall have the same so painted incorrectly, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum of not less than five shillings nor more than five pounds: Provided that for every day that any such vehicle shall continue to be used as aforesaid, and to have the name and abode unpainted or incorrectly painted as aforesaid, the owner thereof shall be deemed to have committed a fresh offence.

5. Every penalty imposed by this by-law shall and may be recovered in a summary way.

WATERWORKS BY-LAW.

BY-LAW of the Council of the Thames County, made by Special Order of the said Council on the 20th March, 1883, and sealed with the Common Seal of the said County.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them under "The Counties Act, 1876," and the several Acts altering and amending the same, and under "The Public Works Act, 1882," the Council of the Thames County ordains as follows, that is to say,—

All regulations and by-laws made by the Thames County Council in respect of the county water-race are hereby repealed.

Throughout this by-law the word "Council" shall mean the Thames County Council.

The word "waterworks" throughout this by-law means "the Thames Water-race" and other property vested in the Chairman, Councillors, and inhabitants of the County of Thames by section 9 of "The Thames Water-Supply Transfer Act, 1880," and includes all reservoirs, dams, tanks, and pipes, and all machinery and appliances used or connected therewith or incidental thereto.

The word "Engineer" throughout this by-law means any person appointed by the said Council as Engineer for the purposes of this by-law, and until such appointment the said word "Engineer" shall mean the person holding the office of Engineer for the time being of the said Council.

The following are the rates, terms, and conditions at and under which the Council will supply water for the under-mentioned purposes:—

1. That the price for water for strictly domestic purposes for each building shall be ten shillings (10s.) per annum, and the Council reserves the right to determine in any case what shall be considered a supply for strictly domestic purposes.

2. All machines using water continuously shall be charged at the rate of three pounds (£3) per sluice-head per week, and take precedence of all other machines, except the Queen of Beauty pump, during continuance of the present arrangement with the Company; and no deduction will be allowed for any stoppage of any battery, tailing plant, or other machinery, unless the same be caused from drought, accident to the race, or from any cause controlled by the Council.

3. All machinery not included in the foregoing clause, and using water occasionally, shall be charged at the rate of three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per sluice-head per week during the time they use it, and the owner or owners shall make an application in writing when water is so required, stating for how long it will be taken and the quantity required; and, in the event of there being more applicants than the race can supply with water, prior applications will have preference.

4. Any surplus water in the Karaka and Hape Creeks shall be charged at the rate of two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per sluice-head per week to consumers.

5. For ventilating mines, and for purposes not herein specified, at rates to be agreed on by special arrangements with the Council.

6. A sluice-head of water shall mean a stream of water capable of discharging 60 cubic feet of water per minute, and all parties using water from the race which is to be paid for by measurement shall provide and fix proper gauge-boxes for the measurement of the water used, in accordance with "The Mines Act, 1867;" and that such gauge-boxes shall at all times be kept in good order and condition for the measurement of the water at any time the Engineer may think fit, and at the expense of the parties using the water.

7. All parties using the water from the race shall make due provision for carrying away and disposing of the water so used.

8. The Council reserves the absolute right, without any compensation, at any time by day or night to stop the water of the race, either wholly or partially, for the purpose of repairs or cleaning, or in the event of any accident occurring to any part of the race.

9. Every person supplied with water from the waterworks shall provide such proper taps, stop-cocks, and other apparatus as the Engineer may require, and shall keep the same in good order and repair, so as to prevent the water running to waste; and in default of providing or keeping in repair any such apparatus, the Engineer may stop the supply of water to such person in any manner he thinks fit.

10. The Engineer, or any other person acting under his authority, may, between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 6 o'clock in the afternoon of any day (except Sunday), enter upon any land or into any dwelling supplied with water from the waterworks, to see if such water is being wasted or misused, and if such person is refused admittance or obstructed in such examination, the Engineer, or such other person, may stop the supply of water in any manner he thinks fit.

11. Any person may remove any pipe or other apparatus belonging to him connected with the waterworks, after giving to the Council fourteen days' notice in writing of such his intention, and of the time of such removal, or shall be liable for all damage done to any part of the waterworks thereby; and if any person removes any such pipes or apparatus without giving such notice he shall be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds sterling (£5), and to pay for all damage done to the waterworks by such removal.

12. No person, corporation, or society shall use or apply the water in or to any machinery or implements which in the opinion of the Engineer (who shall be the sole judge in the matter) may be injurious to the mains or connections, or any other part of the waterworks; and upon any breach thereof the Engineer may at once, and without notice, stop or cut off the water from such machinery or implements.

13. The County Council claim the sole right to all the water at the tail-race of any water-wheel, turbine, or other engine supplied from the race, and may trap and convey the same by conduit or flume to any other plant on the field, and charge for the same as if delivered from the race, reservoir, or mains.

14. All applications for water shall be made at the County offices, where the necessary forms can be obtained.

15. All connections for supply shall be made at the cost of the applicants, and to the satisfaction of the Engineer or such other person the Council may appoint; and no person shall

make any such connection without a permit from the Council. The Engineer shall from time to time measure the water used at the various works, and in the event of such measurement showing a larger quantity is being used than that for which application was made, then the person or persons so using shall be charged and pay for the surplus water so taken; but, in cases where a less quantity is used continuously than that applied for, a *pro rata* reduction in charge will be allowed.

16. All rates shall be payable on the first Saturday in each month, at the offices of the County Council, to the Treasurer or such other person as the Council may appoint.

Rates in Arrear.

17. At the expiration of fourteen days from the date of any water-rate being due, and after delivery of notice on the premises to which such water is laid on, it shall be competent for the Engineer to cut off any such supply in whatever manner may be deemed advisable.

Wrong or false Information.

18. Any person who shall knowingly give false information to the Engineer or any other officer of the Council appertaining to water-supply, or mislead the Engineer respecting the actual quantity of water used for driving any water-engine by turning down the valve in connection therewith, or by closing the port or ports of any turbine, or by any other act or deed, prior to or at the time of any measurement being so taken by the Engineer, as provided in rule 15, shall be guilty of an offence.

19. If any person does any of the following things,—

- (1.) Wilfully injures or destroys any part of the waterworks;
- (2.) Unlawfully drains off or diverts any water belonging to the waterworks;
- (3.) Wilfully or negligently allows any pipe or apparatus on his premises to be out of repair so that water is wasted, or alters any meter, or does or suffers any act whereby his supply of water is improperly increased;
- (4.) Not having agreed to be supplied with water from the waterworks, takes any such water from the supply furnished to another person;
- (5.) Being supplied with water from the waterworks, supplies another person who has not agreed to be so supplied with, or permits him to take any such water;
- (6.) Bathes or washes linen or other thing in any water of the waterworks;
- (7.) Throws any animal, or dirt, or rubbish of any kind into the race; throws or puts, or suffers to be thrown or put, any timber or firewood into any part of the race or waterworks, or trespasses on the trestle-work, pathway, or on the race reserve-line, or on any part of the waterworks;
- (8.) Allows any foul gas or liquid matter of any kind to flow or escape from any part of his premises, or from any pipe or drain connected therewith, into any such water;
- (9.) Obstructs the Engineer, or any person acting under the authority of the Council, in doing anything which the Engineer or Council is hereby empowered or otherwise entitled to do;
- (10.) Opens the ground so as to uncover any pipe belonging to the waterworks, or connects any pipe with such pipe, without giving the Council seven days' notice in writing of his intention so to do;
- (11.) Connects any pipe with a pipe belonging to the waterworks without giving the Council two days' notice in writing of the day and hour he purposes to do so;
- (12.) Connects any pipe with a pipe of the waterworks except in the presence of, or contrary to the directions of, the Engineer or person appointed by the Council to superintend the same, unless such Engineer or person fails to attend at the time named in the notice;
- (13.) Connects with a pipe of the waterworks any pipe of a strength or material not approved by the Engineer,—

he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds sterling (£5) for each such offence, and to a further sum equal to the cost incurred by the Council in repairing the injury done to any part of the waterworks by any such act.

Any person who shall be guilty of a breach of any of these by-laws, either by way of commission or omission, for which a penalty is not hereinbefore provided, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds sterling (£5) for each such breach.

SIR,—With reference to Lord Carnarvon's circular despatch of the 2nd February, 1877, I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council modifying the Order in Council of the 30th September, 1873, respecting the tonnage measurement of Italian vessels in this country.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," it is enacted that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," therein called the Principal Act, have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be remeasured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted on their certificates of registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:

And whereas Her Majesty, by Order in Council dated the 30th day of September, 1873, was pleased to direct that merchant sailing and steam ships belonging to the Kingdom of Italy, the measurement whereof had, after the 1st day of July, 1873, been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other

national papers of such ships, testified by the dates thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their registers or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships: Provided nevertheless that, if the owner or master of any Italian steamship should desire the deduction for engine room in such ship to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships, instead of under the Italian rule, the engine room should be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules:

And whereas the Government of His Majesty the King of Italy have, by Royal Decree dated the 30th day of July, 1882, modified the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to Italian steamships, and the said modified rules are now the same as those in force under the said Principal Act, and came into operation in the said kingdom of Italy on the 21st day of September, 1882:

Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that the steamships of Italy, the certificates of Italian nationality and registry of which are dated on or after the 21st day of September, 1882, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of Italian nationality and registry.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 271 in April, against 262 in March, an increase of 9. The deaths in April were 126, against 131 in March, a decrease of 5.

There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: two males of 89 and 66 and two females of 76 and 65 died at Auckland; a male of 67 and two females of 73 and 71 at Wellington; two females of 70 and 67 at Christchurch; and two females of 72 and 68 at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—These diseases caused 29 deaths, or 23·02 per cent. of the total deaths in April, against 52 deaths and a percentage of 39·70 in March. In April of 1882 the similar deaths amounted to 25, and the percentage to 29·07, but at that time the population of the four boroughs referred to was estimated at 78,655; whereas in April last the population was, chiefly owing to an enlargement of the Borough of Auckland, estimated at 89,761. Thus the number and percentage of these deaths may be stated as less for April, 1883, than for April, 1882. The deaths of children under five years of age from dysentery and diarrhoea amounted to 7 in April, against 39 in March. There were 7 deaths from typhoid fever, an increase of 4 on the preceding month.

Constitutional Diseases.—The number of deaths from these causes was the same (28) as in the preceding month. There was an increase in the deaths from phthisis, from 11 in March to 16 in April.

Local Diseases.—There was an increase of 9 in the deaths from these diseases in April as compared with March, the numbers having been 49 and 40 respectively. Of these, the deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs increased from 6 to 11. It will be observed, on reference to the annexed Provisional Meteorological Report, that the average mean temperatures in the shade during last month were considerably less than the average for previous years, and they were from 6·8 to 7·3 degrees lower than in the preceding month.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
