Ordinary Licensing Districts defined.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of "The Licensing Act, 1881," it is enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the commencement of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time define districts to be licensing districts under the said Act, and from time to time may alter and redefine the boundaries of the same:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, alter and redefine the boundaries of the Heathcote Licensing District, which shall henceforth be those described in the First Schedule hereto, and proclaim and define the parts of the colony mentioned and described in the Second Schedule hereto to be ordinary licensing districts for the purposes of the said Act.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Heathcote.—Bounded on the Northward by the Avon Licensing District, the Borough of Sydenham, and the Borough of Christchurch; on the Eastward by the sea; on the Southward by the Akaroa County; and on the Westward by the River Halswell to the Old River-bed, and the west edge of the Old River-bed to the Great South Road, the place of commencement: exclusive of the Woolston Licensing District, hereinafter described.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Woolston.—All that area in the Provincial District of Canterbury, situated in the Christchurch Survey District, and bounded towards the North-east from Hargood's Road by a canal reserve, and by the south-west boundary-line of said reserve produced to the Heathcote Estuary; towards the East by high-water mark of said estuary to the River Heathcote; towards the South and South-west generally by the centre of said river to a point in line with the south-eastern side of Navigation Street; and towards the North-west by a right line to and by said side of said street, and that side produced to the north-eastern side of Ferry Road, and by said road and by Hargood's Road to the Canal Reserve, the place of commencement.

Sumner.—All that area in the Provincial District of Canterbury, situated in the Sumner Survey District, bounded towards the North-east generally by the high-water mark of Avon and Heathcote Estuary and the ocean, from Section No. 23780 to Section No. 532; thence towards the South-east by Sections Nos. 532, 3987, 3955, and 21418; towards the South-west by

Section No. 15420, and that section-boundary produced across the road; towards the North-west, again towards the South-west, again towards the North-west, South, and again towards the South-east by Section No. 24077; again towards the South-west by Sections Nos. 10323, 18430, 33904, 24012, 24011, and 23780, and the northern boundary-line of Section No. 23780 produced to high-water mark, first mentioned: as the same is delineated on the plans in the Survey Office, Christchurch.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application:

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the authority of sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, and one hundred and twenty-four of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the middle line of a further portion of the branch line of railway from Waipahi to Heriot Burn, from the main line, Waitaki-Bluff Railway, being one of the railways specified in "The Public Works Act, 1879," was defined: And whereas pursuant to the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the Minister for Public Works has caused to be made and, on the nineteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Dunedin, in the Provincial District of Otago, such maps and plans as were necessary to explain the said further portion of the said branch line of railway and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans were referred to in such Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas "The Public Works Act, 1879," enacts that such of the railways mentioned therein as are unfinished may be completed under the provisions of "The Public Works Act, 1876," "The Public Works Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1878," and "The Public Works Act, 1879:" And whereas the two hundred and twenty-ninth section of "The Public Works Act, 1882," enacts as follows: Any public work authorized under the authority of any Act repealed by this Act, or of any Act or Ordinance repealed by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and any land required to be taken, purchased, or acquired for such work, or anything commenced under any such authority as aforesaid, may be continued, taken, purchased, or acquired, executed, carried out, enforced, and completed under the provisions of this Act: And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for the said further portion of the said branch line of railway from Waipahi to Heriot Burn, from the main line, Waitaki to Bluff:

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the authority of sections one hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and twenty-three, and one hundred and twenty-four of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the middle line of the line of railway from Hamilton to Cambridge, being one of the railways specified in "The Railways Authorization Act, 1881," was defined: And whereas pursuant to the one hundred and twenty-fifth section of "The Public Works Act, 1876," the Minister for Public Works has caused to be made and, on the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Auckland, in the Provincial District of Auckland, such maps and plans as were necessary to explain the said line of railway and the land through which the same passes, and such maps and plans were referred to in such Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas the two hundred and twenty-ninth section of "The Public Works Act, 1882," enacts as follows: Any public work authorized under the authority of any Act repealed by this Act, or of any Act or Ordinance repealed by "The Public Works Act, 1876," and any land required to be taken, purchased, or acquired for such work, or anything commenced under any such authority as aforesaid, may be continued, taken, purchased, or acquired, executed, carried out, enforced, and completed under the provisions of this Act: And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for a portion of the said line of railway from Hamilton to Cambridge:

Defining the Middle Line of Portion of the Nelson-Greymouth Railway—Nelson to Roundell Section (Wai-iti Contract).

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Nelson to Greymouth is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is, in the seventh

section thereof, declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the aforesaid section seven of "The Public Works Act, 1879," and by sections one hundred and twenty-nine and one hundred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point in Rural Section number forty-six, Wai-iti Survey District, to a point in Section number fifty-two, Gordon Survey District, all in the Provincial District of Nelson, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 10109, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honourable Walter Woods Johnston, the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Nelson, in the Provincial District of Nelson.

SCHEDULE.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Hurunui to Waitaki is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is, in the seventh section thereof, declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the aforesaid section seven of "The Public Works Act, 1879," and by sections one hundred and twenty-nine and one hundred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be from a point about seven miles from Lyttelton, and one chain east of the western boundary of Windmill Street, to a point on the Hurunui-Waitaki Railway aforesaid, as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 10155, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honourable Walter

Woods Johnston, the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Christchurch, in the Provincial District of Canterbury.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point on the Hurunui-Waitaki Railway about 7 miles from Lyttelton and 1 chain east of the western boundary of Windmill Street; proceeding thence in a generally westerly direction for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts, and terminating at a point on the Hurunui-Waitaki Railway aforesaid, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, viz.: Rural Section No. 17, Borough of Sydenham, Provincial District of Canterbury; and including all adjoining and intervening lands, roads, reserves, and watercourses; in the manner delineated upon the plan marked P.W.D. 10155, signed by the Hon. Terms and Conditions of Sale of the Makarewa Village Settlement, Southland Land District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this eighteenth day of June, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same: And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, bearing date this twenty-first day of June, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto for sale as a village settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto shall be disposed of as small-farm for cash and upon deferred-payments.

2. The day upon which the lands shall be open for application shall be Wednesday, the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, at the Land Office, Invercargill.

3. The lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto shall be sold for cash immediately on purchase, and the lands enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto shall be sold on deferred payments.

4. The lands which are disposed of by sale upon deferred payments shall be subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1877," and to the provisions of section nine of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879."

5. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one section upon either immediate or deferred payments.

6. The prices stated in the Schedules hereto shall be the prices at which the lands shall be open for application.

7. If there should be more than one application for any allotment offered either for cash or on deferred payments, the right to acquire the same shall be determined by lot amongst the applicants only.

8. Each applicant for a deferred-payment section in Schedule II. will be required to make the declaration prescribed by section sixty-two of "The Land Act, 1877," and shall at the time of

application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the Southland Land District one-tenth of the price of the allotment. Such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the licensee for the six months due on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

9. The purchaser of any lands described in Schedule I., upon the full payment of the purchase-money, and the purchaser of any lands described in Schedule II., upon the like payment, and also the fulfilment of the terms and conditions prescribed by "The Land Act, 1877," "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," and "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1882," relating to land on deferred payments, will be entitled to his Crown grant, to be issued in the usual way upon payment of the fees prescribed by law.

SAILING DIRECTIONS FOR THAMES RIVER, N.Z.

Marine Department,
Wellington, 7th June, 1883.

THE Harbourmaster at the Thames reports that the colour of the light on Curtis's Wharf at that port has been changed from green to white; and that the buoys in the Thames River have, with one exception, been done away with, and beacons erected instead on the banks of the river up to the Hauraki Saw-mills. The beacons are diamond-shaped, painted black, with a large white ball in the centre, and stand 8 feet off the ground measured to the lower angle of the diamond; the face of the beacon measures 7 feet each way; consequently their extreme height will be about 15 feet.

The sailing directions for approaching the river are as follow: When about four miles from the mouth of the river the Fairway Buoy will be seen, which should be left on the port hand. The Fairway Buoy is black-and-white chequers, with the word "Fairway" painted on it in white letters. After passing the Fairway Buoy, Opani Point, in a line with a clump of willows at Kopu, should be steered for, leaving the Swashway Buoy (black) and the Sandspit Beacon (upright spar with cask perch also black) on the port hand, taking care not to approach either too close, as the sandbank on that side is making out. Upon arriving off Opani Point about 1½ cables length off, a red buoy will be seen, which must be left on the starboard hand about a cable off. From the red buoy steer up to the first beacon on the left bank of the river, thus clearing Kopu Wharf. When pretty well up to the beacon another one will show nearly astern, and by looking up the river on the right-hand side another beacon will be seen: these two last-mentioned are to be kept in line ahead and astern, as they show mid-channel. The same will occur upon arriving in the vicinity of the next, when another will be seen astern, and one upon the opposite bank, to be kept, as before, ahead and astern, and so on from side to side until arriving at the saw-mills.
