### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Waimea to Switzers is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is, in the seventh section thereof, declared to be a special Act authorizing the

construction of such railway; and the same is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a portion of such railway:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zcaland, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the aforesaid section seven of "The Public Works Act, 1879," and by sections one hundred and twenty-nine and one hundred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said portion of the said railway shall be from a point about four chains in a south-westerly direction from the north-west corner of Block VII., Township of Riversdale, to a point in Preemptive Right No. 1, Block IV., Wendon District, Provincial District of Otago, as defined and set forth in the "chedule hereto. The said middle line and the land through which the same passes are set forth in the map and plan marked P.W.D. 10154, and authenticated for the purposes of this Proclamation by the signature of the Honourable Walter Woods Johnston, the Minister for Public Works, and which said map and plan is deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Invercargill, in the Provincial District of Otago.

WHEREAS a petition was presented to the Governor, signed by not less than three-fifths of the county electors contained within that portion of the County of Manawatu included within the boundaries particularly set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and which said portion comprises in the whole an area of more than two hundred thousand agrees in extent and contains more than one hundred. thousand acres in extent, and contains more than one hundred thousand acres in extent, and contains more than one hundred county electors: And whereas the said petition prayed the Governor to constitute the said portion of the County of Manawatu a vew county, and to set forth the boundaries of the proposed new county: And whereas such petition has been publicly notified as by law required:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, by virtue and exercise of the powers vested in me by "The

Counties Act, 1876," do hereby proclaim and declare that the aforesaid portion of the County of Manawatu shall, as from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, constitute a new county, to be called the County of Oroua; and that the boundaries of the said new county so constituted shall be those particularly set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and the said new county is hereby constituted accordingly

And I do further proclaim and declare that the said County of Oroua shall be divided into five ridings, to be called the Kiwitea Riding, the Waituna Riding, the Ashurst Riding, the Taonui Riding, and the Fitzherbert Riding, the boundaries whereof shall be those particularly set forth in the Second Schedule hereto:

And in exercise of the like power, and with the like advice and consent, as aforesaid, I do further proclaim and declare that the number of members of the County Council of the said County of Oroua shall be: For the Kiwitea Riding, one member; for the Waituna Riding, two members; for the Ashurst Riding, two members; for the Taonui Riding, two members; and for the Fitzherbert Riding, two members.

# FIRST SCHEDULE.

2. The day upon which the lands shall be open for application shall be Wednesday, the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

3. The lands shall be sold upon deferred payments, and be
