A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the fifty-fourth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown lands situate within a gold field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor, or for alienation by occupation licenses on deferred payments under any law for the time being in force in the land district in which such mining district is situate:

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto were, by Proclamation dated the sixteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, set apart for agricultural leases:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to revoke the said Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation of the sixteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, accordingly.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear that the valuation roll of the Borough of Sydenham was not received from the Property-Tax Commissioner by the Sydenham Borough Council within the time limited by "The Rating Act, 1882," and the burgess roll of the said borough could not therefore be made within the times prescribed by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876": And whereas the said valuation roll has since been forwarded by the said Commissioner, and the said burgess roll has since been made; and it is expedient that such burgess roll should be validated:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," doth hereby declare that the burgess roll of the said Borough of Sydenham so made as aforesaid, for the year commencing on the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, shall be as valid to all intents and purposes as if the same had been regularly made.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this second day of July, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Harbours Act, 1878," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may vest the management of any wharf the property of Her Majesty in any local governing body or person, upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit: And whereas it is thought desirable to vest the wharf and goods-shed connected therewith at Kaikoura in the Kaikoura County Council on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said fourteenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the Kaikoura Wharf and goods-shed connected therewith in the Kaikoura County Council, subject to the following conditions: Provided always that the rights hereby granted shall only be for the period of fourteen years, and this Order in Council may at any time be altered, modified, or revoked:—

CONDITIONS.

1. That all Her Majesty's subjects shall, at all reasonable times and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and of ingress and egress thereon.

2. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

3. That the said County Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf, goods-shed, and all erections on the wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights: Provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Marine Department.

4. That any person authorized by the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any officer acting with his approval, may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf, goods-shed, and any buildings erected on the wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and that, upon his leaving at the last-known address of the said Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the said Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

5. That the said Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf any building or structure whatever, except with the consent of the Marine Department.

6. That the said Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and goods-shed, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Marine Department, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Marine Department.

7. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the said Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations thereunder.

8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime altered, modified, or revoked.

9. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor on giving to the said Council six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Governor, or the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, or any person acting under his or their instructions, and delivered at the last-known address of the said Council, their successors, administrators, or assigns. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto was Crown-granted to the Superintendent of Otago for a site for a pound: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, it is expedient to vest the said land in the Corporation of the Borough of Invercargill:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the fourth section of "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," doth hereby declare that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the said reserve shall become vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and burgesses of the Borough of Invercargill, in trust for a site for a pound.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency Sir William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order that the Government work known as the Cambridge-Rotorua Road shall and may be constructed on or through the several parcels of land more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, and delineated in the plan marked P.W.D. 10013, deposited in the office of the Minister for Public Works at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, in the said colony.

Notice of Intention to change the Purpose of a Reserve.

WHEREAS by "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may declare his intention to make, change, exchange, or alter the dedication of any public reserve now or hereafter vested in Her Majesty or the Governor for any of the purposes named in Class II. of the Schedule to the said Act, whether the same be granted or not; and, in the case of any reserves made under the authority of section one hundred and forty-four of "The Land Act, 1877," if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to change the purpose of such reserves or any part thereof from the purpose or presumed purpose for which it was set apart to any other purpose, or if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to exchange any of the land comprised in such reserve for other land of equal value, to be dedicated to one or more purposes named in the said Class II., the Governor may, by notice in the *Gazette*, declare his intention to make such change, exchange, or dedication, as the case may be, and in such notice declare the manner and terms in which the same is intended to be so made:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," aforesaid, declare my intention to change the specific purpose of the reserve described in the first column of the Schedule hereto to the specific purpose set opposite such description in the second column of the said Schedule.

And whereas by the one hundred and forty-fifth section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said one hundred and forty-fourth section may, at the expiration of one month but not later than six months after the publication in the *Gazette* of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the *Gazette*:

And whereas the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto were, by the several warrants the dates of which are specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and the notifications of which were published in the *Gazettes* specified in the fourth column, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Act for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule:

NOTICE is hereby given that JOSIAH EARL, of the firm of J. EARL AND SON, of San Francisco, California, one of the United States of America, Merchants, temporarily residing at Sydney, in the Colony of New South Wales, has applied to register, under "The Trade Marks Act, 1866," the trade marks numbered 1 to 4, of which the following is a description, *viz.*:—

Description of Trade Marks.

No. 1 is a rectangular oblong, surrounded by a dark- and faint-line border. Within it, at the top, are the words "San Francisco," and the words "Rubber Paint." Immediately below these is a device consisting of dark- and faint-line circles, surrounding the words "Manufactured by the" at the top, and "San Francisco Rubber Paint Co." at the bottom. Within this an inner circle contains a Maltese cross, on which is represented a view of a house backed by trees, with three barrels or kegs in the immediate foreground. The space between the Maltese cross outline and the inner circle is filled in by the colour of the lettering. Below the device, in separate lines, are the words, "Ready for the Brush;" "Pure White and all Shades and Colours;" "Put up in $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, 1, and 5 gallon cans,"

and then a small vacant space in which may be inserted the name and address of vendors.

No. 2 is a rectangular oblong, surrounded by a dark and faint-line border. Within it, at the top, is the word "Atlantic," and the words "Rubber Paint." Immediately below these is a device consisting of a rectangle, formed by double lines, the upper and lower two of which are prolonged at either end. Within this rectangle is represented a dragon surrounded by flames, standing upon a slab on which are the words "Semper idem." Within the left-hand space formed by the prolonged top and bottom lines and the outer border are printed vertically the words "Cable Address," and within the right-hand space, also vertically, the words "Earl, San Francisco." Below the device, in separate lines, are the words, "Mixed ready for Use," "Pure White," "and any," "shade or colour desired," and a small vacant space, in which may be inserted the name and address of the vendor.

No. 3 consists of an oblong label, having a dark or black ground, the middle of which is occupied by a white or light space, having a curved top. In this inner space is represented a stag standing in grass, with cliffs in the background, surrounded by a double circle, on each side of which is shaded scrollwork, and above, in a curved line, the words "The original formula," "In use thirty years." The dark ground is printed upon in white or light colour, and has scrollwork or flourishes surrounding the words thereon, and in the right-hand upper corner is represented a flying insect. In a curved line stretching from side to side are the words "Pioneer Mixed Paint," and, also in a curve, immediately above the inner light space the words "Manufactured under." At the left-hand side are, upon a curved ribbon, the words "Consists of"; and, in irregular curves, the words "Pure," "White Lead," "Zinc," "and"; and, in a straight line, the words "Linsseed Oil." On the right-hand side, in curves, the words "Pure White," "or any Shade," "Mixed ready," and, in a straight line, the words "For the Brush"; and in the middle, below the inner light space, the words "J. Earl & Son."

No. 4 consists of a blue circular space, within which may be printed any device, and which is surrounded, but not touched, by a wide red circle, having upon it the words "Royal Silicate Paint"; and this red circle has an outer blue circular border. The top and sides consist of dark and faint lines, while the bottom is two parallel double lines, between which are the words "Pure white and any desired shade," forming an approximately square border, in the corners of which, anglewise, are the words "The Best," "The Cheapest," "The Brightest," "Most Durable."

Bonuses on Colonial Industries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following bonuses will be paid on articles produced in the Colony of New Zealand, as under:—

SILK.

A bonus of fifty per cent. on the value realized for the first thousand pounds' (£1,000) worth of cocoons of the silkworm, or silkworms' eggs, produced in the colony, to be paid on quantities of not less value than fifty pounds (£50) nor more than one hundred pounds (£100) produced by any one person.

MANGANEISEN AND MANGANESE-BRONZE.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first two thousand five hundred pounds' (£2,500) worth of manganese, and a similar bonus for a like amount of manganese-bronze, produced in the colony from New Zealand ores, and sold at a fair market price in a foreign market.

MARBLE.

A bonus of three hundred pounds (£300) will be given for the first fifteen hundred pounds' (£1,500) worth of New Zealand marble exported from the colony, and sold in a foreign market at a price of not less than 9s. per cubic foot.

ANTIMONY.

A bonus of five hundred pounds (£500) will be given for the first 250 tons of antimony regulus produced in the colony from New Zealand ores, and sold at a fair market price in a foreign market.

Conditions.

1. Notice of intention to claim any of the above bonuses must be given in writing to the Colonial Secretary not later than the 31st December, 1883.
 2. The claim must be made before the 30th June, 1884.
 3. The first claimant of any bonus who proves to the satisfaction of the Government that he has fulfilled all the conditions to be the recipient of the bonus.
 4. The other conditions as to quantity, priority, quality, and value to be fulfilled to the satisfaction of an officer appointed for the purpose by the Government.

WROUGHT-IRON.

A bonus of one thousand pounds (£1,000) will be given for the production, in New Zealand, by a direct process, of 200 tons of "iron blooms," of marketable quality, from ore produced in New Zealand.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.
2. Notice of the intention to erect ironworks and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before the 31st December, 1883.
3. The bonus must be claimed before the 31st December, 1884.
4. In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above conditions, he may claim the whole of the bonus.
5. The iron in respect of which any bonus is claimed, and the ore from which it is manufactured, will be examined by an officer to be appointed by the Government, who may require the production of *bona fide* account-sales of quantities not less than 100 tons weight, showing that such iron has been sold at a fair market price as wrought-iron.

VESSELS ENTERING NEW RIVER.

THE New River Harbour Board has notified that the sand-spit which during the past three years has choked up the channel is now cleared away, and that the old channel along the rocks is open.

To strangers requiring a pilot.—In case there should be too much sea and the pilot not able to board, the vessel will be steered by the semaphore up to the Bombay Rock, on which there is an iron beacon, surmounted by a barrel painted white. The course from abreast of the beacon to the first white buoy, proceeding upwards, is N.E. by N., where vessels can anchor in safety half-way between the buoy and the west shore, and where the pilot can board with safety. The depth on the bar at high-water ordinary tides is fourteen feet. Masters should not run in for the harbour during ebb tide unless with a good commanding breeze.
