ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this second day of July, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the valuation roll prepared by the Property-Tax Commissioner under "The Rating Act, 1882," was not furnished to the Waitaki Road Board in sufficient time to prepare therefrom the ratepayers' roll, as required by section forty-one of "The Road Boards Act, 1882," and the election of members of the Board for the said road district has not, consequently, been held during the month of June last, as required by an Order in Council made under the said "Road Boards Act, 1882," and dated the seventeenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three; and it is expedient to further extend the time for holding the election in the said road district:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Road Boards Act, 1882," doth hereby order and declare that the time for holding the election of members of the said Waitaki Road Board under the last-mentioned Act is hereby extended, and that such election may take place before the seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
