ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixteenth day of July, 1883.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the ratepayers of the Manawatu Road District failed, by misadventure, to hold an election of members of the Road Board for the said district within the extended time appointed by the Governor under an Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three; and it is expedient to further extend the time within which an election of members of the said Board can be held:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Road Boards Act, 1882," doth hereby order and declare that the time for holding the election of members of the said Manawatu Road District under the last-mentioned Act is hereby extended, and that such election may take place before the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the valuation roll prepared by the Property-Tax Commissioner, under "The Rating Act, 1882," was not furnished to the Otaki Road Board in sufficient time to prepare therefrom the ratepayers' roll as required by section forty-one of "The Road Boards Act, 1882," and the election of members of the Board for the said road district has not, consequently, been held during the month of June

last, as required by an Order in Council under the said "Road Boards Act, 1882," and dated the seventeenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three; and it is expedient to further extend the time for holding the election in the said road district:

SPECIAL ORDER.

Resolved—"That the resolution passed by the Waipawa County Council on the 3rd of May last, adopting the alteration of the Patangata and Waipawa Road Board Districts as hereafter set out, be confirmed."

Passed by the County Council of Waipawa on the 7th day of June, 1883.

That the present boundaries between the Patangata and Waipawa Road Board Districts be altered as follows, viz.: Commencing at the south-east corner of Block XLVI.; thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of that block and Block XLVII. to the north-east corner of said Block XLVII.; thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of said Block XLVII. to the Te Aute or Great North Road; thence in a northerly direction along that road to its intersection with Block XLIX. The above to be abolished, and the following boundaries substituted in lieu thereof: Commencing at the north-west corner of Block XIV.; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of that block to its north-east corner; thence in a straight line in a south-east direction to the junction of the Patangata and Tamumu Roads; thence in an easterly direction along the Waipawa and Tamumu Road to the new Waipawa River; thence up that river to the south-east corner of Block XLVI.: all in the Waipukurau Survey District.

THE following special order made by the Waipawa County Council is published in accordance with "The Counties Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1882."

SPECIAL ORDER.

At a meeting of the Waipawa County Council held on the 5th day of July, 1883, the following resolution was passed, viz.:—

Resolved—"That the alterations of the boundaries of the Tamumu and Oero Road Board Districts as follows be confirmed: 'That the present portion of the boundary-line between the Tamumu and Oero Districts, commencing at the north-east corner of Block XXX., Mangakuri District, at a point where the said block joins the Mangarara Stream, and running from thence in a southerly direction to the Omakare Stream, and from thence in an easterly direction to the sea, be abolished, and the following boundaries substituted in lieu thereof, viz.: Commencing at the north-west corner of Block XXIX., Mangakuri District, where it joins the Mangarara Stream; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of said Block XXIX., and Blocks XXVIII., XXVII., XXVI., XXV., and XXIV., to the north-east corner of said Block XXIV.; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary-line of said Block XXIV. to the south-west corner of Block XXIII.; thence in an easterly direction along the southern boundary-line of said Block XXIII. to its south-east corner; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of Block XXXVII. to the north-west corner of Block XXXVIII.; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary-line of Blocks XXXVIII. and XXXIX. to the north-east corner of Block XXXIX.; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of Block XL. to the north-east corner of that block; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary-line of block to the sea.'"

I hereby certify that the above special order, altering the boundaries of the Tamumu and Oero Road Districts, was duly made by the Waipawa County Council, in accordance with section 33 of "The Counties Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1882."

*By-law No. 1 (Standing Orders), made by the Taratahi-Carterton Road Board, County of Wairarapa West.*

THE following by-law, made by the Taratahi-Carterton Road Board, is published in accordance with "The Road Boards Act, 1882."

THOMAS DICK.

By-Law No. 1 (Standing Orders) of the TARATAHI-CARTERTON ROAD BOARD, adopted by the Board at a meeting held the 30th day of June, 1883.

1. The ordinary monthly meetings for the despatch of business shall be held at the Council Chambers, Carterton on the last Saturday in each month, to commence at 11 o'clock in the forenoon.

2. The business shall be conducted in the following order, viz.:—(a) Minutes of preceding meeting to be read and confirmed; (b) treasurer's report to be read and received or otherwise dealt with; (c) engineer's or works committee's report to be read and received, or otherwise dealt with; (d) Inward correspondence to be read, and business arising out of it to be despatched; (e) outward correspondence to be read and adopted or otherwise dealt with; (f) deputations to be received and heard; (g) tenders to be opened and dealt with; (h) accounts to be passed for payment; (i) to consider works to be undertaken; (k) miscellaneous and general business.

3. No motion or amendment shall be deemed in order unless seconded, except any motion or amendment made by the chairman, which shall not require to be seconded. The chairman shall have the power of ruling whether any motion or amendment must be made in writing or verbally, and whether notice of any motion or amendment must be given previous to consideration thereof.

4. The chairman may take part in any discussion, without leaving the chair.

5. No cheques shall be signed on behalf of the Board unless the accounts covered by them shall have been previously certified to by the chairman as having been passed by the Board.

6. Any member shall have authority, without previously obtaining the sanction of the Board, to expend in the interval between any two meetings any sum not exceeding ten pounds on urgent repairs in the subdivision which he represents.

7. Whenever practicable all works shall be let by publicly advertised tender; and no work amounting in cost to twenty pounds or more shall be undertaken except upon such tender, provided that this restriction shall only apply to new works, and not to road maintenance.

8. Whenever the Board has agreed to construct any work upon the promise of a voluntary contribution or subscription, such work shall not be commenced and no tender shall be accepted for same until the full amount so promised shall have been paid over to the Board's treasurer.

9. All points of order arising out of the interpretation of these Standing Orders or otherwise shall be decided by the chairman.

10. Any Standing Order may at any time be temporarily suspended by the unanimous consent of the whole Board, and Standing Order No. 2 may be at any time temporarily suspended by the unanimous consent of the members present.

I certify that the foregoing By-law No. 1 has been duly passed by the Taratahi-Carterton Road Board.
