A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the branch line of railway from Racecourse to Southbridge, with a sub-branch to Little River and thence to Akaroa (Hurunui-Waitaki), is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is, in the seventh section thereof, declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and such railway is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of the same:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the aforesaid section seven of "The Public Works Act, 1879," and by sections one hundred and twenty-nine and one hundred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point on the shore of Lake Forsyth distant about 5 chains from the south-westernmost corner of Rural Section No. 1850, in the Little River Road District, the said point being the termination of a portion of the Little River and Akaroa Railway, as described in the Proclamation dated the 2nd September, 1882, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 74, of the 7th September, 1882; proceeding thence in a generally easterly direction for a distance of four miles or thereabouts, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands, &c.: Along the north shore of Lake Forsyth Railway Reserve, Reserve No. 385, Rural Sections Nos. 6265 and 6489, Native Reserve No. 887, and terminating at a point in the said Native Reserve No. 887 distant about 9 chains from the easternmost corner of Rural Section No. 2662: including all adjoining and intervening roads, reserves, streams, rivers, and watercourses; all within the Little River Road District, Provincial District of Canterbury, Colony of New Zealand; in the manner delineated upon the plan marked P.W.D. 10965, signed by the Honourable Edwin Mitchelson, the Minister for Public Works, and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Christchurch, in the Provincial District of Canterbury; the total length being four miles or thereabouts.

Notice as to Classification of Land in the Waimate District Railway District.

WHEREAS the Assessors appointed to revise the classification, for the purposes of section ten of "The District Railways Act, 1877," of the land comprised within the Waimate District Railway District have, after hearing the Railway Company and the ratepayers and property-owners interested, recommended a re-classification of the said lands, and that the same should henceforth be divided into four classes, as hereinafter mentioned, in lieu of two classes as heretofore:

Alterations and Additions to Scale of Fares and Charges in force on New Zealand Railways.

PART IV.—LOCAL RATES.

HURONUI-BLUFF.

Class H.—Wool.

Wool from railway stations lying between Ealing and Deborah inclusive, and from stations on the Albury, Waimate, Duntroon, and Ngapara Branches, will be charged classified rates up to seventy-one miles, and $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per bale per mile for undumped, and $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per bale per mile for double-dumped, for each additional mile.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 412, against 468 in November, a decrease of 56. The deaths in December were 148, an increase of 13 on the number for November. Of the above deaths, males contributed 78; females, 70. 48 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 32.43 per cent. of the whole number; 37 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 233 in December, against 279 in November, a decrease of 46. The deaths in December were 103, against 83 in November, an increase of 20.

There were 12 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: four males, one of 78, two of 72, and one of 69, together with a female of 70, died at Auckland; a female of 66 at Wellington; a male of 72, and two females of 84 and 68, at Christchurch; and two males of 75 and 67, and a female of 67, at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality from this class of disease was slightly less in December than during the previous month, there being no deaths from scarlet fever, and less prevalence of diphtheria, croup, and whooping cough.

Constitutional Diseases.—The total number of deaths for December is 7 in excess of the number for November. Cancer contributed 3 deaths towards this increase.

Local Diseases.—It is the increase in deaths from these complaints that causes the total mortality for December to exceed that of the previous month. Under all the principal orders more deaths are found for December. There were 17 deaths from diseases of the nervous system, including 6 cases of apoplexy. Heart disease caused no less than 8 deaths. Under diseases of the respiratory organs 7 cases of bronchitis are observed.

Accidental Deaths.—It is matter for regret that 2 deaths are noticed as occurring from accidents with tram-cars. Both the persons killed were adults. One death took place at Christchurch and the other at Dunedin.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths in this class amounted to 369, or 26.76 per cent. of the total deaths. Diphtheria caused 18 deaths, of which 7 were of children under 5 years of age. Whooping cough caused 53 deaths, all but 3 having been of children under 5 years of age. The deaths from typhoid fever amounted to 35, 3 only having occurred in Dunedin. Dysentery and diarrhoea caused the largest number of deaths, viz., 150; the majority, 136, having been of children under 5 years of age. The mortality from these last-named causes was much less in Christchurch than in the other boroughs.

Constitutional Diseases.—The chief causes of death among these diseases were cancer and phthisis. The former caused 45 deaths, almost equally divided in number between the four boroughs, and the latter 141, of which 4 were children under 5 years of age. The largest number of deaths from phthisis occurred in Dunedin.

Local Diseases.—Diseases in this class caused 532 deaths, or 38.58 per cent. of the total number. Diseases of the nervous system caused 159 deaths, of which 57 were of children under 5 years of age. It will be observed that diseases of the organs of circulation (diseases of the heart, &c.) caused 79 deaths, 1 having been that of a child. Thus diseases of the heart caused 1 in every 10 deaths of persons over 5 years of age. Diseases of the respiratory organs caused 143 deaths; of these, the deaths of children under 5 years of age amounted to 67; bronchitis and pneumonia having been the principal causes of death.

Violent Deaths.—Forty-four accidental deaths occurred in these boroughs during the year; among them were those of 8 persons drowned, 2 deaths were homicidal, and 9 persons committed suicide. Thus, on an average, 1 of every 25 deaths was from accident or violence.

Of the 1,379 deaths in the boroughs 130, or nearly 10 per cent., were of persons over 65 years of age; 24 persons were upwards of 80 years of age at death; and 1 male reached the ripe age of 90, and 1 female the age of 91.
