WHEREAS for the safety and proper maintenance of the beach-road from Napier to Clive, in the County of Hawke's Bay, and for the safety and proper maintenance of the railway from Napier to Woodville, it has been found desirable to protect the banks of, and to alter and divert the course of, the River Ngaruroro, between the said railway and the sea-coast to the eastward of the said railway: And whereas the said alteration and diversion have been partially executed by the County Council of Hawke's Bay, and it is desirable to complete such alteration and diversion:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, inter alia, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881:"
