▲ PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance of section ninety-two of "The Public Health Act, 1876," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and notify that the island of Java and the islands of the Eastern Archipelago are infected with the disease called cholera, and that the Mauritius is infected with the disease called small-pox, being infectious or contagious diseases highly dangerous to the health of the people.

▲ PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Wellington-Napier Railway is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is, in the seventh section thereof, declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and such railway is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of the same:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by

the aforesaid section seven of "The Public Works Act, 1879," and by sections one hundred and twenty-nine and one hundred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

— SCHEDULE.

COMMENCING at a point in Section No. 67, Block V., Kopuaranga Survey District, the said point being the termination of a portion of the railway, as described in a Proclamation dated the 2nd April, 1883, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 29, of the 5th April, 1883; proceeding thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 8 miles 9 chains or thereabouts, and passing in, into, through, or over the following lands: Kopuaranga Survey Block V., Sections Nos. 67, 68, 49, 50, 26, 51, 11, 52, 79, and 201 respectively; Block L., Sections Nos. 202, 78, 65, and 60 respectively; and terminating at a point in the Mangaone Survey District on the Kopuaranga River above 3 miles 46 chains north of Section 57, Block L., Kopuaranga Survey District; all within the Wairarapa East County, Provincial District of Wellington: including all intervening places, lands, roads, streams, rivers, and watercourses; in the manner delineated upon the plan marked P.W.D. 11059, signed by the Hon. Edwin Mitchelson, the Minister for Public Works, and deposited in the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington; the total length being 8 miles 9 chains or thereabouts.

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jeroois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the thirteenth day of March instant, the boundaries of the district within which the Wellington District Court shall be held shall be altered, and that thenceforth the boundaries thereof shall be the boundaries hereinafter described.

WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor has, by Proclamation, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto for sale as a village settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with

the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall be disposed of as small-farm allotments upon deferred payments.

2. The day upon which the lands shall be open for application shall be Wednesday, the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, at the Land Offices at Patea and Hawera.

3. The sections shall be subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1877," and to the provisions of section nine of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879."

4. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one section.

5. The price stated in the Schedule hereto shall be the price at which the lands shall be open for application.

6. If there should be more than one application for any allotment, the right to occupy the same shall be determined by lot amongst the applicants.

7. Each applicant will be required to make the declaration prescribed by section sixty-two of "The Land Act, 1877," and shall at the time of application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the West Coast (North Island) Land District one-tenth of the price of the allotment. Such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the license-fee due on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

8. HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant or lunatic or other person under legal disability shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

WHEREAS by section ten of an Act of the Parliament of New South Wales passed in the thirty-fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "The Imported Stock Act, 1871," and numbered six, the Governor in Council is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to restrict or absolutely prohibit for any specified time the importation or introduction of any cattle or sheep, fodder, or fittings from any other colony or country in which there is reason to believe that any infectious or contagious disease in stock exists: And whereas there is reason to believe that one or other of the diseases known as rinderpest or foot-and-mouth disease in stock exists in almost every colony or country other than the Colonies of Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, Tasmania, Western Australia, and New Zealand:

Now, therefore, I, Lord Augustus William Frederick Spencer Loftus, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby withdraw the Proclamation dated the fifteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eight-three, under which sheep are admitted from the United States of America, subject to certain conditions therein set forth, and do now restrict and absolutely prohibit, for a period of two years from this date, the importation or introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings from any colony

or country, other than from the colonies hereinbefore mentioned, into any part of the Colony of New South Wales, except as regards any sheep which may have been shipped from the United States of America previous to the issue of this Proclamation.

NOTES FOR OCTOBER, 1883.

*Auckland.*—Very showery weather, with only a few fine days; maximum rainfall on 30th, 1-19 in.; prevailing N.E. and S.W. winds, and stormy from 11th to 14th from latter quarter; hail on 12th and 13th; fog on 10th.

*Wellington.*—Up to 9th fine, with moderate N.W. and N.E. winds; on night of 9th changed to S.E., with heavy rainfall, and continued showery and squally from S.E. and N.W. up to 23rd; stormy on 12th and 13th, with hail and slight snow on 13th; on 16th gale from N.W., without rain, also on 17th and 18th; very wet on 19th from S.E., with strong wind at night; 1-42 in. rain recorded on 20th, the maximum for month; from 24th to 28th fine; 23th, stormy from N.W., and heavy rain at night; remainder fine.

*Lincoln.*—Showery during middle of month, but small total rainfall, the maximum recorded on 12th, .30 in.; prevailing N.E. and S.W. winds, and at times strong; thunder on 30th; hail on 13th.

*Dunedin.*—Fine up to 10th, then cold and wind from S.W. to 14th, and showery; changeable until end of month; maximum rain recorded on 27th, .36 in.; snow on 13th; prevailing wind from S.W., and strong on 11th, 13th, 14th, and 15th.

GENERAL REMARKS.—Rainfall in North in excess of average, but in South less; the temperature generally under the average; unseasonable weather.

NOTES FOR NOVEMBER, 1883.

*Auckland.*—Fine up to 9th, then generally showery to end of month; maximum rainfall recorded on 11th, .66 in.; wind variable, strong on 10th and 11th from N.E., otherwise moderate; 5 days of thunder.

*Wellington.*—Fine first two days, S.E. wind; 3rd and 4th showery, and heavy rainfall on 4th and gale at night from S.E.; 1-1 in. rain recorded on 5th; from 5th to 12th fine, with moderate wind, chiefly southerly; 13th, severe thunderstorm and heavy rain, very oppressive, wind from N.W.; thunder also on 16th; continued showery and unsettled weather, and at times squally, up to 25th, wind from N.W. and S.E.; generally fine for remainder of month, with prevailing N.W. wind.

*Lincoln.*—Showery during middle of month, but otherwise generally fine; maximum rainfall recorded on 17th, .87 in.; generally N.E. and S.W. winds, and stormy on 11th from N.E., on 20th and 24th from S.W., and 29th from N.E.; thunder on 29th.

*Dunedin.*—Up to 20th unpleasant showery weather, then finer to end; maximum rainfall recorded on 18th, 2-67 in., and heavy fog on that date; prevailing N.E. and S.W. winds, and moderate, except on 5th and 18th strong from N.E.

GENERAL REMARKS.—Generally a showery, unpleasant month; rainfall in excess and temperature below the average, and squally.

NOTES FOR DECEMBER, 1883.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 280 in February, against 301 in January, a decrease of 21. The deaths in February were 114, against 112 in January, an increase of 2.

There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 1 male of 68 and 2 females of 75 and 66 died at Auckland; 1 female of 84 at Wellington; 1 male of 81 and 1 female of 66 at Christchurch; and 3 males of 77, 72, and 67, and 2 females of 80 and 77, at Dunedin.

The total number of deaths which took place in the four boroughs during February differs very slightly from the number for January, but, looking to the classes of disease which caused the mortality, considerable variation between the numbers for the two months is found.

*Zymotic Diseases.*—The deaths under this head for February number 33, an increase of 13 on the number for January. At Auckland there were 19 deaths, against 5 for the previous month; 11 out of these 19 resulted from diarrhoea. Both at Auckland and Wellington, however, the mortality from zymotic diseases last month was much lower than in February, 1883, when diarrhoea and scarlet fever caused 18 deaths at Auckland and 20 at Wellington.

*Constitutional Diseases.*—13 deaths from phthisis are observed—an unusually large number.

*Local Diseases.*—The total number of deaths was 37, against 49 in January, and 35 for February, 1883. Diseases of the heart and respiratory organs caused fewer deaths last month than in January.

*Developmental Diseases.*—10 children under 5 years died from debility.  
*Violent Deaths.*—5 were accidental, including the death of a child at Dunedin from burns, and a case of accidental poisoning at Wellington.  
 The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
