THE HONOURABLE THE MINISTER OF LANDS PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto for sale as a village settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

3. The lands enumerated in the First and Second Schedules hereto shall be sold for cash immediately on purchase, and the lands enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto shall be sold on deferred payments.

4. The lands which are disposed of by sale upon deferred payments shall be subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1877," in cases where the allotments are twenty acres or under, and to the provisions of the said Part III. relating to rural land where the allotments exceed an area of twenty acres; also to the provisions of section nine of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879."

5. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one section upon either immediate or deferred payments, and no person who has previously taken up an allotment in any village settlement shall be allowed to acquire an allotment in the Danevirke Village Settlement.

6. The prices stated in the Schedules hereto shall be the prices at which the lands shall be open for application.

7. If there should be more than one application for any allotment in the First Schedule, the right to purchase the same shall be determined by auction amongst the applicants only, at the upset prices named therein; and if there should be more than one application for any allotment in the Second or Third Schedules, the right to occupy the same shall be determined by lot amongst the applicants.

8. Each applicant for a deferred-payment section in the Third Schedule will be required to make the declaration prescribed by section sixty-two of "The Land Act, 1877," and shall at the time of application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the Hawke's Bay Land District one-tenth of the price if the allotment is twenty acres or under, and one-twentieth if the area is greater than twenty acres. Such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the license-fee for the six months due on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

9. The purchaser of any lands described in the First and Second Schedules, upon the full payment of the purchase-money, and the purchaser of any lands described in the Third Schedule, upon the like payment, and also the fulfilment of the terms and conditions prescribed by "The Land Act, 1877," "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," and "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1882," relating to

land on deferred payments, will be entitled to his Crown grant, to be issued in the usual way upon payment of the fees prescribed by law.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this tenth day of April, 1884.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE MINISTER OF LANDS PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant or lunatic or other person under legal disability shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this tenth day of April, 1884.

Present:

THE HONOURABLE THE MINISTER OF LANDS PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the twenty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present order, delegate, but only with respect to the piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Ormond Public Domain Board, namely,—

MICHAEL BOLAND,  
ARTHUR KEMPTHORNE,  
ALEXANDER MCKENZIE,  
ABRAHAM SKILLICORN, and  
ROBERT DOUGLAS McDougall

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Thursday in each month, at two o'clock p.m., at Ormond House, Ormond North, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.
2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.
4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Tuesday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.
5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.
6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may, at any monthly or special meeting, appoint a Chairman.
7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

WHEREAS by "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may declare his intention to make, change, exchange, or alter the dedication of any public reserve now or hereafter vested in Her Majesty or the Governor for any of the purposes named in Class II. of the Schedule to the said Act, whether the same be granted or not; and, in the case of any reserves made under the authority of section one hundred and forty-four of "The Land Act, 1877," if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to change the purpose of such reserves or any part thereof from the purpose or presumed purpose for which it was set apart to any other purpose, or if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to exchange any of the land comprised in such reserve

for other land of equal value, to be dedicated to one or more purposes named in the said Class II., the Governor may, by notice in the *Gazette*, declare his intention to make such change, exchange, or dedication, as the case may be, and in such notice declare the manner and terms in which the same is intended to be so made:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," aforesaid, declare my intention to change the specific purpose of a portion of the reserve described in the first column of the Schedule hereto, the area of which is described in the second column of the said Schedule, to the specific purpose set opposite such description in the third column of the said Schedule.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and "The Animals Protection Act Amendment Act, 1881," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that cock-pheasants and Californian quail may be taken or killed within the Hawke's Bay District, comprising the Counties of Hawke's Bay, Waipawa, and Wairoa, from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, both inclusive (subject, nevertheless, to the restrictions in the said Acts mentioned). ## PORT CHARGES, HOBART.

*Pilotage.*—The charge for pilotage upon a foreign-going vessel arriving at the Port of Hobart and landing cargo is—Pilotage inwards: Sailing-ships, 6d. per ton register; steamships, 4d. per ton register. Maximum pilotage, £15.

Pilotage outwards is not compulsory, but the master of an outward-bound vessel can secure, at a small cost, the services of a pilot if he requires one.

Intercolonial traders are liable to the same charge for pilotage as foreign-going ships, unless the masters hold exemption certificates.

*Harbour Dues.*—For services performed by Harbour-master: For each remove, 4d. per ton register, provided that the total amount for all or any one remove shall not exceed the sum of £7 10s.

*Light Dues.*—Light dues are paid by all intercolonial traders and foreign-going vessels: For each occasion of entering the Port of Hobart—Steamships, 4d. per ton register; sailing-ships, 6d. per ton register.

*Charge upon Vessels not liable to pay Wharfage Rates.*—For every intercolonial trader or foreign-going ship, for each occasion of entering the Port of Hobart, upon which passengers are landed, but upon which no goods liable to pay wharfage rates are landed from such vessel, a fee or charge of 3d. per ton register shall be paid to the Collector of Customs when entering the ship inwards at the Customhouse.

*Exemptions.*—All vessels calling for coal or supplies, anchored in the port, or coming alongside wharf, having passengers for another port and none for Hobart, the passengers are allowed to land without entailing any port charges upon the ship. All vessels arriving and sailing in ballast, or which do not break bulk, or only to such an extent as may be necessary to provide funds for repairs, coaling, refittings, or refreshments required by such vessels, are wholly exempted from the payment of all port charges, lighthouse dues, and all port dues whatsoever, except only those of pilotage, in cases where the service of a pilot has been actually required and received.
