THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that, where the foreshore has been legally vested in any Harbour Board or other local governing body, it may from time to time, subject to the provisions of the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," license and permit any part of the foreshore to be used or occupied, *inter alia*, for the purpose of any local enterprise or object which the Governor in Council may approve: And whereas by the said Act it is also provided that every licensee shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have power to make and construct any necessary reclamation for the purpose of erecting on the foreshore comprised in his license, or upon any land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore which shall be specified in such license, any building, structure, erection, or other works to enable him to obtain the full benefit of such license: And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that every such license shall be in writing under the seal of the Board or body granting the same, and may be for any period not exceeding fourteen years from the date thereof, and may prescribe a sum of money to be payable either at stated periods or on or before the granting thereof for the use of the foreshore so granted, and may prescribe any other terms or conditions, general or particular, to be observed or performed by the person to whom the same is granted: And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted that, in any case where there is no Harbour Board, or no Harbour Board empowered to grant any such license as aforesaid, the Governor in Council may in his discretion grant and issue a license for all or any of the purposes herebefore mentioned, and all the provisions of the said Act in respect of such licenses shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply accordingly: And whereas Robert Blair, of Auckland, has applied for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore, in order to erect and maintain thereon a certain boom across the Hikutaia River, Thames, for the purpose of confining floating timber; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 910 and 911), showing the place in the said river where it is intended to erect such boom, and the area of foreshore or land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purposes: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed works will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas the foreshore of the Hikutaia River has not been legally vested in any Harbour Board, and it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the said Robert Blair under the said Act, for the purposes aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the said Robert Blair as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the said Robert Blair to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which are particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a boom for confining any floating timber of any kind or description whatsoever belonging to or under the control of the said Robert Blair, such license to be held and enjoyed by the said Robert Blair upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say,—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark necessary for the construction of a boom across the Hikutaia River, which is shown on the said plans marked 910 and 911.

2. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, Robert Blair shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of five pounds, and thereafter an annual sum of two pounds, in respect of such boom, to be paid in two half-yearly instalments on the thirtieth day of June and the thirty-first day of December, the first of such half-yearly payments to be made on the thirty-first day of December next ensuing.

3. On the master or owner of any vessel or boat notifying to Robert Blair, or his agent, manager, or any other person who appears to have the charge or management of his affairs at the Thames or on the Hikutaia River, that such master or owner desires to take his vessel or boat past the boom, the said Robert Blair shall forthwith provide, free of expense to the vessel or boat, a sufficient number of men to work the movable part of the boom, so that the vessel or boat may pass through without delay.

4. Should it at any time become necessary for the convenience of the traffic on the Hikutaia River that the opening in the boom should be wider than shown on plan marked M.D. 911, the Minister may, by a notice in writing left at the last known address of Robert Blair, require him to provide an opening of the width specified in such notice, and he shall thereupon, with all convenient speed, cause such opening to be made.

5. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the said Robert Blair shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

6. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, and Robert Blair may be required to remove the boom from the Hikutaia River, and the bed thereof, at his own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to Robert Blair three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at the last known address of Robert Blair.

7. Robert Blair shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing through the boom, or by contact with it, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect of his.

8. In case the said Robert Blair shall—  
(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;  
(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boom;  
(3.) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause two of these conditions; or  
(4.) Become bankrupt or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the said Robert Blair or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to Robert Blair, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council and the rights and privileges thereby conferred have been revoked and determined; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said boom, and all other erections or buildings thereto belonging, to be removed, and may recover the cost incurred by any such removal from Robert Blair, or his legal or personal representatives.

LEVUKA.—*Lights.*—According to a report of Captain Chateauminois, of the French cruiser "Limier," the Port of Levuka is lighted as follows:—

1. A fixed white (upper) light, elevated 262 feet above the sea and visible sixteen miles, shown from a white pyramid 26 feet in height.
2. A fixed red (lower) light, elevated 210 feet above the sea and visible five miles; shown from a white pyramid 29 feet in height.
3. A fixed green light, elevated 16 feet above the sea and visible two miles; shown from a wooden post on Queen's Wharf.

The red and white lights are only visible between the bearings N.W. by N. (N. 43° 20' W. magnetic) and S. by W. (S. 1° 40' W. magnetic), over an arc of 135°.

Bearings true and from seaward. Variation, 9° 35' easterly in 1884.

SUVA HARBOUR.—*Buoyage.*—According to the report of the commanding officer of the French cruiser "Limier," the buoyage of the Port of Suva is as follows:—

Two white buoys at the north point of the reef forming the eastern side of the outer entrance to Tomba-Ko-Suva.

One white buoy on the northern edge of the isolated patch of 2 fathoms lying to eastward of the north point of the same reef.

A white buoy lying S.S.E. (S. 32° 10' E. magnetic) from the preceding, indicating the north side of a shoal of 6 feet.

A black buoy on the shoal of 16½ feet which prolongs the north-east point of the reef forming the western side of the outer pass (N'Daveta Levu).

A black buoy on the southern point of a bank which prolongs the low rocky point forming the east side of the entrance to the River Wai-Lami.

A black buoy is to be placed on the south point of a shoal forming the east side of the entrance to the inner port (Nai-Ngalo-Ngalo).

Two beacons, one black, situated on the extremity of a small jetty which prolongs Yellow Point (on the eastern side of the outer port), and the outer white to southward of the preceding.

A black beacon on the north side of the entrance to Walou Creek.

The white buoys can be passed close to, leaving them to starboard, and the black buoys to port.

A small jetty has been constructed at Na Mbukalou, near the church.

MAGELLAN STRAITS.—*Landmarks.*—Only the ruins of the beacon on Cape Gregory remain. A house on the beach two and a quarter miles N. 15° E. (N. 5° 20' W. magnetic) from Cape Gregory is a very good mark for anchoring. The French

cruiser "Volage" anchored in 14 fathoms of water with the flagstaff of the house bearing W. (S. 69° 40' W. magnetic) and Cape Gregory bearing S. 31° W. (S. 10° 40' W. magnetic).

Bearings true. Variation, 20° 20' easterly in 1884.

**VOLAGE BAY.**—*Description.*—Just to the eastward of the Abra de Sarmiento, on the south coast of Long Reach, there is to be seen a deep bay, which appears to be perfectly sheltered. The sides of the high mountains which surround it are vertical, which would indicate that the shore is steep to and the entrance safe. At the head of this bay there is a valley through which runs a watercourse.

The "Volage" anchored in this bay in 13½ fathoms, midway between the two shores. This bay, Volage Bay, is continued by a small harbour, with which it communicates by a narrow channel, and where small vessels may find excellent shelter. A cascade falls into the harbour near its head, which comes from a small shallow lake into which several watercourses empty.

This article is appended hereto.

*Lights for Fishing Vessels and Boats.*

Art. 9. Open fishing boats and other open boats shall not be required to carry the side lights required for other vessels, but shall, if they do not carry such lights, carry a lantern having a green slide on the one side and a red slide on the other side; and on the approach of or to other vessels such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side, nor the red light on the starboard side.

Fishing vessels and open boats when at anchor, or attached to their nets and stationary, shall exhibit a bright white light.

Fishing vessels and open boats shall, however, not be prevented from using a flare-up, in addition, if considered expedient.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 504, against 490 in March, an increase of 14. The deaths in April were 166, a decrease of 23 on the number for March. Of the above deaths, males contributed 95; females, 71. 71 of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 42.77 per cent. of the whole number; 61 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births were 295 in April, against 305 in March, a decrease of 10. The deaths in April were 125, against 118 in March, an increase of 7.

There were 9 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: A male of 79 and a female of 75 died at Auckland; a male of 74 at Wellington; a male of 66 and a female of 66 at Christchurch; and 3 males of 86, 76, and 70, and a female of 71, at Dunedin.

*Zymotic Diseases.*—The total number of deaths from zymotic disease in April was 34. At Auckland the mortality was serious—20 deaths are shown, against 15 in March and 6 in April of last year. Of the 20 deaths, 12 were caused by diarrhoea (11 children), and 4 by typhoid fever.

At Wellington the mortality for April is the same as that for March, but in the later month a death appears from diphtheria, and 2 from whooping cough. The figures for Christchurch and Dunedin are not great.

*Constitutional Diseases.*—The principal items are 6 deaths from cancer and 14 from phthisis. The total number of deaths in the four towns was 27, of which 11 took place at Auckland, 7 being from pulmonary consumption.

*Local Diseases.*—17 deaths of children were caused by debility. The number is most exceptionally high. 7 deaths were at Auckland and 6 at Wellington.

*Violent Deaths.*—The total is 3, all accidental. A child was suffocated in bed, a youth run over by a train, and an adult killed by a steam motor.

Fatal accidents from tram engines and cars have been noticed frequently of late. The particulars are as follow:—

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
