# PACIFIC OCEAN.

THE following information relating to the Ellice, Gilbert, Marshall, Caroline, and Admiralty Islands, also to the coasts of New Ireland and New Hanover, has been gathered from reports furnished by Captain Cyprian A. Bridge and Lieutenant R. N. Ommanney, of the visit of H.M.S. "Espiègle" to those parts in 1883.

All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1884: Ellice; Gilbert, and Marshall Islands, 9° E.; New Ireland, 6° E.; Caroline Islands, 2° to 6° E.

# ELLICE ISLANDS.

Nurakita (Sophia Island).—This island is low, flat, and covered with dense bush, through which the branches of many dead trees protrude. Above this bush one coccanut palm and two or three other trees are to be seen, which, on

paim and two or three other trees are to be seen, which, on making the island at a distance of about sixteen miles, appear as black spots on the horizon.

The island is surrounded with a fringe reef, and a bank extends off it with 14 fathoms water at a distance of 1 mile and 8 fathoms, at about half a mile from the beach; outside the depth of 14 fathoms the water deepens considerably.

Loveling is difficult expect in capace.

Landing is difficult except in canoes.

There are a few natives living on the south side of the

Anchorage: The "Espiègle" anchored off the south-west side of the island in 7 fathoms water, with the left extreme

bearing N.E. & N., and the right extreme E.N.E.

Nukulailai (Mitchell Island).—The principal village, where
the king and missionary live, is on Motuloa Island, the northern one of the cluster.

There is a small village and church on Fangawa, the western island, which, however, was not inhabited at the time of the "Espiègle's" visit.

No signs of houses or natives were seen on the south-west

side of the cluster.

Anchorage: The anchorage of Fangawa Island is not good,

heing on a small bank of coral rock.

The "Espiègle" anchored in 7 fathoms 1½ cables from the shore reef, and, with 30 fathoms of cable out, had 17 fathoms under her stern, and no bottom at 20 fathoms a few yards farther out. This bank is best found by eye from aloft, being easily seen with a favourable light.

The off-lying reef hitherto shown on the chart does not exist in expect that position. It was not seen from the

exist in or near that position. It was not seen from the masthead, and was searched for unsuccessfully in a boat.

The natives state that there are two boat-passages into the lagoon, one in the northern and one in the south-western

Water: There is water on Fangawa and on one of the small northern islands. The only supplies obtainable are

small northern islands. The only supplies obtainable are fowls and pigs.

Funafuti (Ellice Island).—The "Espiègle" entered the lagoon by the north passage, and found the bearings given very useful; but it should be noted that the bearing E. \( \frac{3}{4} \) S. is that of the northern of the two small islets north of Funafuti, the largest of the cluster. These two islets are covered with trees and bushes.

Anchorage: The "Espiègle" anchored in the eastern part of the lagoon, off the village and mission station.

The observation spot close to the mission church, was

The observation spot, close to the mission church, was found to be in lat. 8° 30′ 57″ S., long. 179° 12′ 30″ E. Passage: An examination of the 4-fathom channel shown on the chart resulted in 5 fathoms being the least water obtained at high-water neap tides. The "Espiègle" used this channel in leaving the lagoon at low-water neaps, and

41 fathoms was the shoalest cast. Between this passage and the mission station there are several shoal patches, and immediately inside the passage they are numerous, but are all easily seen from aloft with a good light. This and masthead pilotage are absolutely necessary. Until a complete examination of this passage is made, it appears advisable to sound it by boat before taking a vessel through. It would be useful for a vessel leaving, with the

sun to the northward. To the westward of the fourth islet an apparently deep

and good passage was seen from the masthead.

Oaitupu (Tracy Island).—The "Espiègle" anchored off
the north-west side of this island in 7 fathoms, with the
extremes bearing E. and S.E. ½ S. Traders report a better
anchorage off the village, about one and a half miles farther
to the southward, with the double-ridge roofed white church

Oaitupu has two lagoons, a small one at the northern part, and a larger one at the south-eastern, the latter having two entrances, one of which is practicable for boats at high water. There is a small islet situated in the entrance.

Water: There is a large well in the centre of the village; the water is, however, a little brackish.

Population in 1883 was 430.

Landing is difficult, and best effected in the native canoes. Winds: The island is subject to violent storms in December, which do considerable damage to the cocoanut

#### GILBERT ISLANDS.

Arori (Hurd Island).—There was no opportunity for observations when the "Espiegle" was off this island, but it was presumed to be at least ten miles to the westward of the

chart position, or in long. 176° 50' E.

Anchorage: Traders report that small vessels have anchored off the reef in 25 fathoms, but so close that a shift of wind to the southward or westward renders the position most

dangerous.
Villages: The following names were obtained from the natives: Nanimona, the southern one; Tamoa, the centre;

natives: Nanimona, the southern one, and Tamaroa, the northern.

Nukunau (Byron Island).—The island is not divided as shown on the chart, but appears as three islands from a distance, in consequence of the centre being low and sandy with a large clump of trees on it. There is no anchorage for a large vessel.

large vessel.

Peru (Francis Island).—There is anchorage on the west side of this island, to the northward of the most western point of the reef, in from 5 to 7 fathoms, about 1½ cables from the reef, with the north-west point of the island bearing N. 28° W., and the south-west point S. 76° E.

The bank is very steep, and coming from the southward

care must be taken to avoid a shoal running out from the west point of the reef.

Taputeouea (Drummond Island): Peacock Anchorage.—The sandbank to the south-eastward of Peacock Anchorage

As there are several villages opposite the anchorage, the Village of Utiroa cannot be considered a good mark for it. After rounding the north point, about a mile distant from the reef, steer to the southward until the first gap between the

reef, steer to the southward until the first gap between the islands bears E. by S. ½ S., then steer for it, keeping a good look-out from aloft to clear the point of the reef.

Apamama (Hopper Island).—The following positions were determined by the officers of the "Espiègle:" Long. of south point of cluster, 173° 53′ 30′ E. (approximate); west point of western island, lat. 25′ 30″ N., long. 173° 42′ E. (approximate)

mate).

Maraki (Matthew Island).—The north point of this island was found to be in long. 173° 15′ E. (approximate).

The principal village is on the west side of the island about one and a half miles to the southward of the north point. No anchorage could be found off this part of the island; numerous tide-rips were seen off the north point, and the current was observed to be running to the eastward at

the rate of three-quarters of a mile an hour.

Makin (Pitt Island).—The principal village is on the south-west side of the north island. There is no anchorage; no bottom could be obtained with 25 fathoms of line close to

the fringe reef.

Remarks.—Too much reliance should not be placed on the information received from trading vessels as to anchorages in this group, as they frequently anchor close to the reefs, and trust to the wind remaining in the same direction to keep them off it. The masters of these vessels appear in the habit of reporting good anchorage in places where this practice

Winds and Weather.—The weather in June was hot and dry, the wind was generally between east and south-east and light. The current, which was westerly in the southern part of the group, began to set to the northward and eastward, north of Apamama.

#### MARSHALL ISLANDS.

MARSHALL ISLANDS.

Mulgrave Island: Port Rhin.—The 2½-fathom patch shown on the chart as situated 5 cables S.E. ½ S. from the observation spot was not seen from the "Espiègle," which vessel passed close to that position, although the water was so clear that bottom was plainly visible in 10 fathoms.

Arhno Atoll.—Between the eastern passage and the southwest point of the north-east island there are quite a dozen small islands.

The eastern passage is one and a half miles from the westernmost of these islands. At high-water neaps 34 fathoms were found in this passage. Between the eastern passage and the small islands there are two small passages frequently used by small craft. Traders report the first boatpassage to the westward of High Island to be the best and deepest of all the passages.

Majuro Atoll (Arrowsmith Island).—The entrance to this

atoll is about one and a half miles wide, but there is a shoal bank of coral dividing it into two channels, the least depth in which is about 7 fathoms. There is reported to be not in which is about 7 tathoms. There is reported to be not less than 3 fathoms on this bank; there appeared from the "Espiègle," however, to be less water in many places.

The entrance is easily recognized by the small islet on its

western side.

The west channel is close to this islet, the reef the islet stands on forming the west side. When entering, this is perhaps the easier channel to distinguish, but it has the disadvantage for a sailing-vessel of being farther to leeward

during casterly winds.

A vessel making this channel from the eastward should keep the small islet a little on the port bow, steering W. by S. until the passage is seen; a S.S.W. course leads through it. Having passed through, steer for a remarkable small sharp can in the ideal on the acts side of the stell until the white gap in the island on the east side of the atoll, until the white buildings on Ejeet Island are seen, when a course may be shaped for the anchorage.

A sailing-vessel entering the east channel with an easterly wind must luff close round the reef off the island on the east which thus the found the feet of the feath of the east side of the entrance; when through, steer for the beforementioned sharp gap bearing E. by S., until the white buildings are seen. This course leads close to two shoal patches (both easily seen), one about a mile from the entrance, the other laying off a small sandy spit four or five miles to the eastward of it.

Current: Inside the lagoon there is an almost constant westerly current; vessels working up should keep over to the north shore to avoid the strength of it. The anchorage off Eject Island is nine and a half miles from the entrance of the lagoon.

Messrs. Henderson and Macfarlane have a tank on Eject Island containing 6,000 gallons of water; they depend on

rain for the supply.

Beacon: A beacon has been placed on the shoal situated  $1\frac{1}{4}$  cables S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. from the southern flagstaff on Eject Island, and when a vessel is observed in the lagoon towards sunset a light is placed on it by the traders.

Caution: There is no passage on the east side of the atoll. Vessels have frequently lost considerable time looking for this The openings between the islands are only fit for

Jaluit (Bonham Island).—The north shoal in Jaluit anchorage is now marked by a small buoy, which, however, does not watch at high-water springs; the southern shoal has a small stick on it, and dries at low-water springs. Both shoals are easy to see.

Vessels can be supplied here with fresh water.

Anchorage: The north-west point of the island with the rading station on it, bearing N. 27° E. distant 3 cables, is that recommended.

Near the time of spring tides the stream runs in the west passage with great strength. There is a southwest passage into the lagoon, usually called "Barrossa Passage," through which sailing-vessels go out; it bears from the anchorage off Hernsheim and Co.'s premises S. 53° W. Coal: In 1883 there were 1,000 tons of coal stored here.

Namorik (Baring Islands).—These islands are flat and about 50 feet in height. Houses were seen on the west side, and the fringing reef is strewn with large black boulders. The south point was found to be in lat. 5° 35' N., long. 168°

Winds and Weather.—In June the wind, which was usually a little to the northward of east, and always had easting in it, was almost invariably light. Squalls, though on some days frequent, were not heavy. They often occasioned a shift of wind, and were not uncommonly followed by a short period of nearly deed calm. Sharp squalls, however, must be of nearly dead calm. Sharp squalls, however, must be looked for now and then. Just before the arrival of the "Espiègle" at Jaluit there had been a sudden and violent squall from the westward. Much rain was experienced by the "Espiègle," and on some days very dull weather, which rendered navigation amongst the coral reefs a difficult mat-

Currents.—In general, easterly currents of less than one knot an hour were experienced.

#### CAROLINE ISLANDS.

Rainy weather, light variable winds with easting in them, and, as a rule, moderate casterly currents were experienced between the Marshall and Caroline islands.

Etween the Marshall and Caroline islands.

Kusaie (Ualan Island): Chabrol Harbour.—The muddy bottom of this harbour, though affording good holding ground, renders the water turbid; still with a good sun the shoals can be seen. D'Urville Point is not apparently the east extreme of Lelè Island. A small islet seems to have been formed of sand on the neighbouring strip of reef, and to have become joined to the base of the promontory at D'Urville Point. D'Urville Point.

Ponapè Island: Port Metalamin.—The three detached shoals in this harbour are most difficult to see from a vessel, even at low water and with a good light. They were not visible from the masthead of H.M.S. "Espiègle" when entering the harbour, but were afterwards examined by boat, and found to be correctly placed on the plan. Their surface being the same colour as the water, they were not easy to see even when close to in a boat. There is no indication of them at low-water springs with a slight swell setting into the harbour.

Positions: From observations taken both on shore and after the north point of Tauche Island was found to be in lat. 6° 51′ N., and long. 158° 18′ E. (approximate). This position agrees nearly with that given by the French corvette "La Danaide," and places Narmaur Island in long. vette "La Danaide," ar 158° 8' E. (approximate).

158° 8' E. (approximate).

Current: An easterly current of about twenty miles a day was experienced between Ponapè and Nukuor, the weather being wet and the winds light and variable.

Nukuor (Monteverde Island).—There is only one passage into the lagoon, and that is on the south-east side. It is about 20 yards broad, and has been used by trading schooners. The tide runs strongly through it, the ebb forming a heavy race outside dangerous to boats.

Greenwich Islands.—These islands form an atoll of much the same character as Nukuor, having twenty-eight small islands on its eastern side, the western side being coral reef.

There is an entrance for boats on the southern side about one mile to the westward of the western island. A vessel will be close to it when the extremes of the islands bear N. 7° E. and N. 82° E.

position; there was also sufficient swell to cause breakers had shoal water existed.

Eap or Yap Island: Tomil Harbour.—Sailing-vessels should not enter without a pilot. The services of Captains Halcomb or O'Keefe can be obtained by heaving-to outside.

Very little remains of the piers off Rul Village, but the pier off Tomil is nearly completed and is a good landmark.

The highest point of the island is only 1,170 feet, the peak bearing S.W. by S. ½ S., two and a half miles from it, is 1,050 feet in height, and the land immediately to the north-meeting of Pal attains a height of 420 feet.

It is high water, full and change, at 7 hours 15 minutes; springs rise 4 feet 6 inches.

Rock: A rock having only 12 feet water on it was reported to lie off the entrance to Tomil Harbour, about 5 cables E. ½ S. from Entrance Rock. Time, however, did not admit of the locality being examined.

Winds and Weather: The following information was gained from Captain Holcomb, a United States citizen, resident for several years at Yap, and a navigator in the

resident for several years at Yap, and a navigator in the neighbouring seas. Typhons and cyclonic storms are unknown in Yap. The north-east trade blows with tolerable freshness and steadiness from the beginning of October to the end of May. The south-west monsoon prevails during June, July, and August, but is frequently broken by short spells of easterly winds. Rain falls occasionally all the year round, but the rainy season is between the beginning of June and the beginning of September. The climate was described as being remarkably pleasant. Though hurricanes are unknown, strong south-west gales generally blow towards the close of the south-west monsoon season, late in August or September. This is also the season of very light winds, when sailing-vessels get about amongst the islands with difficulty.

Palao or Pelew Islands: Korror Harbour.—When off Channel Point and passing the reef to the north-eastward of it, vessels should keep on the eastern side of the channel, this part carrying the deepest water, and the reef being steep-to, whereas on the west side of the reef is shelving. Leaving Korror Harbour by this channel at half flood (neap

tides) 5½ fathoms was the least sounding obtained.

The shoal situated 4 cables N.E. by N. from Channel Point cannot have more than 3 fathoms on it at low-water

Tides.—In the narrow part of the channel south-east of Channel Point the tides set directly through, and outside it they attain considerable strength; the ebb tide was found running fully 3 knots an hour five days after new moon, and caused a considerable race for some distance off the entrance. To the north-eastward of Channel Point they set across the channel.

from Korror to Molegojok.—The "Espiègle" Passageassed inside the reef north of Korror Island, and anchored off the Villages of Ackashar and Molegojok, which are about fifteen miles distant from the entering channel to Korror Harbour.

arbour.

Molegojok may be easily recognized by a long stone pier stending nearly to the edge of the reef. Ackashar is about extending nearly to the edge of the reef. Ackashar is about one and a half miles south of Molegojok.

The reefs are very imperfectly known and the coral heads

inside them numerous, making the navigation in some places intricate. Some of these heads being exceedingly small, a vigilant look-out aloft is absolutely necessary.

Off Ackashar there is a narrow and intricate passage through the reef; and about four miles farther to the south-

ward there is a good and safe opening. The island on the reef off the east coast of Baobeltaob placed in lat. 7° 29' N. does not exist.

Eil Malk.—The reef eastward of Eil Malk extends nearly

two miles farther east than shown on the chart; its extreme bears about S. by E. from Uruktapel Bluff.
Revolving storms, supposed to be the tail ends of typhoons,

are said by white residents to occur in the Pelew Group at intervals of from ten to twelve years. They have been experienced as early as August, and may be encountered up to November.
