A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, William Francis Drummond Jervis, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Winton and Gore Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

LUMSDEN DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east and East by the Mataura River from its source to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section No. 511, Hokonui Survey District; thence towards the South generally by the Hokonui Riding of the County of Southland, as described by special order in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 88, 31st August, 1883, to the

Oreti River; thence again towards the East by that river to the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 194, Taringatura Survey District; thence again towards the South generally by that road and the road forming the eastern and northern boundaries of Sections Nos. 216, 215, 143, 193, and 194, and a line due west from the south-western corner of Section No. 196, all of the said Taringatura Survey District, to the Aparima River; thence towards the West by that river to its confluence with the Hamilton Burn; thence by a right line due north to the Oreti River, and by that river to its confluence with the Windley Stream; and thence towards the North-west by the north-western boundary-line of the old Province of Southland to Eyre Peak; and thence to the source of the Mataura River aforesaid, the place of commencement.

WINTON DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North generally by the Lumsden District, hereinbefore described; towards the East by the Otapiri Stream to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 21, Winton Hundred; thence by the Forest Hill Hundred; towards the South by the New River Hundred; towards the South-west by the Waimatuku River to its source; and thence by a right line north-west to cut the Aparima River; and towards the North-west and West by the said Aparima River to the Lumsden District aforesaid.

GORE DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-west generally by the Lumsden District, hereinbefore described, from the Otapiri Stream to the Mataura River; thence towards the North-east by that river to a point due west of the Pyramid; thence towards the North by the Wendon and Greenvale Survey Districts; towards the East and again towards the North by the Glenkenich Survey District to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 27, Block V., of that district; thence again towards the North by said Section No. 27; again towards the North-east by a road south-west of Sections Nos. 13, 14, 11, and 10 of the said Block V., and 17, 18, 27, 23, 29, 30, 32, 37, and 41 of Block IX., Glenkenich Survey District aforesaid; towards the South and again towards the East by the Waipahee Survey District to the railway-line; thence again towards the North-east by the said railway-line; towards the South-east by the Waipahee River to Block XI.; again towards the South by Section No. 5 of Block XI., Waipahee Survey District, and by Blocks IX., XII., and XIII. of Waikaka Survey District; again towards the South-east by Blocks XIII. and VII. of said district, and Block I., Tuturau Survey District, to a point opposite the confluence of the Charlton Creek and the Mataura River; thence across the said river; towards the South-west and again towards the South by the Waimumu Survey District and the Forest Hill Hundred to the Otapiri Stream; and thence towards the West by the Winton District, hereinbefore described, to the place of commencement.

SIR,—I have the honour to request that your Excellency will be kind enough to take measures for the publication in the *New Zealand Government Gazette* of the following regulation which has been passed by me for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Order in Council of 1879.

I should be glad also if intimation were given that a knowledge of this regulation will not be presumed against vessels until 1st September, unless they shall have left a port in any Australasian Colony more than one month after the publication of the regulation in such colony.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, &c., &c.

A REGULATION (made in the name and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1879) to prohibit the supply of arms, ammunition, and explosive substances to natives of the Western Pacific Islands:—

(L.S.) G. WILLIAM DES VŒUX,
H.B.M. High Commissioner for the Western Pacific.
5th April, 1884.

1. In this regulation the expression "Western Pacific Islands" means and includes any of the following islands or places, namely:—

- (1.) The part of the Island of New Guinea eastward of the 143rd meridian of longitude.
- (2.) The Islands or Archipelago of New Britain and New Ireland.
- (3.) The Louisiada Archipelago.
- (4.) The groups of islands known as the Friendly Islands, the Navigators Islands, the Union Islands, the Phoenix Islands, the Ellice Islands, the Gilbert Islands, the Marshall Islands or Archipelago, the Caroline Islands, the Solomon Islands, the Santa Cruz Islands.
- (5.) All other islands in the Western Pacific Ocean not being within the limits of the Colonies of Fiji, Queensland, or New South Wales, and not being within the jurisdiction of any civilized power.

The expression "the waters of the Western Pacific Islands" means the waters within three miles of any of the islands or places included in the Western Pacific Islands.

The word "arms" means every kind of firearms and any part or parts of firearms.

The word "ammunition" means every kind of ammunition for firearms and any material for the preparation thereof.

The expression "explosive substance" means gunpowder, nitro-glycerine, dynamite, gun-cotton, blasting-powder, and every other substance used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion.

2. British vessels within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands shall not carry arms or ammunition. But this prohibition shall not be held to prevent or forbid the carriage by any such vessel, for the protection of the same and of the persons therein, and otherwise for the ordinary lawful purposes of such vessel, of arms and ammunition, in quantities not exceeding those herein specified, viz:—

One rifle or shot-gun and one pistol for every member of the crew of such vessel whose name shall be on the articles.

One hundred rounds of ammunition for every such rifle, shot-gun, or pistol on board.

Cannons or swivel-guns forming part of the ordinary equipment of any such vessel, together with one hundred rounds of ammunition for every such gun.

3. British subjects within the Western Pacific Islands shall not give, sell, or otherwise supply any arms, ammunition, or explosive substance to any native of any island or place within the Western Pacific Islands.

4. Any British subject who shall carry, or aid, or abet the carriage of any arms or ammunition in any British vessel within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands, except as permitted by this regulation, shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation.

5. Any British subject within the Western Pacific Islands who shall give, sell, or otherwise supply, or aid or assist in supplying, any arms, or any single firearm, or any ammunition or explosive substance, to any native of any island or place within the Western Pacific Islands, shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation.

6. Any person guilty of an offence against this regulation shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to punishment as follows:—

- (1.) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labour, and with or without a fine not exceeding £10; or
- (2.) A fine alone, not exceeding £10, without any imprisonment.

7. This regulation shall come into force on the first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and may be cited as "The Arms Regulation, 1884."
