A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken for further portion of the Foxton-New Plymouth Railway, namely, Hawera to Mokoia:

And whereas all conditions precedent required by law to be observed and performed prior to the taking of such land in the manner hereby provided have been observed and performed:

Now, therefore, I, George Marsden Waterhouse, in the name and on behalf of His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, and as his duly-appointed deputy, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by section one hundred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is taken for the further portion of the said line of railway hereinbefore specified.

There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: a male of 66, and 5 females of 82, 81, 75, and 69 (two), died at Auckland; 2 males of 69 and 68 at Wellington; a female of 66 at Christehurch; and 2 males of 74 and 73 at

died at Auckland; 2 males of 69 and 68 at Weilington; a lemane of 60 at Christenard, and 2 males of 10 median.

The death-rates at Auckland, Wellington, and Christenarch for June were lower than for May. At Dunedin the rate was slightly higher, chiefly owing to an increased number of deaths in June from symotic and constitutional diseases.

Zymotic Diseases.—The proportion of the total deaths at the four towns, which fell from 27·20 per cent. in April to 22·58 per cent. in May, was still lower in June, the rate being 13·83 per cent. Three deaths took place at Auckland, caused by typhoid fever and diarrhea; 1 at Wellington from pyemia; and 1 at Christehurch from crysipelas. At Dunedin there were 8 deaths, including 2 of children from measles, 2 from croup, 1 from whooping cough, 1 from typhoid fever, 1 from crysipelas, and 1 from rheumatism.

The mortality for June from the zymotic class of disease at the chief towns collectively was lower than for any previous month since May of 1883, when the actual number of deaths was the same (13); but the proportion of the mortality from all causes greater, being 16·05 per cent. of the total deaths.

Constitutional Diseases.—Of the total number of deaths 10 occurred at Dunedin—a very large number, including 5 deaths from cancer, and 5 from phthisis.

Local Discases.—The total mortality was 48 deaths, against 40 for the previous month. The deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs were 16, 7 of which were at Christchurch.

Violent Deaths.—These were all suicidal. A male of 21 years, and another of 40 years, destroyed themselves by shooting. The third, aged 53 years, poisoned himself with strychnine.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
