A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage district known as the Feilding District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

HALCOMBE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial District of Wellington comprised within the boundaries of Subdivisions Nos. 2 and 3 of the Manchester Road District, as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 42, of the 18th May, 1883, inclusive of the Town District of Halcombe.

FEILDING DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial District of Wellington bounded towards the North-west and South-west by the Halcombe District, hereinbefore described; towards the North by a line produced due east from the intersection of the northern boundary-line of the Rangitikei Block with the Rangitikei River to the Oroua River; thence towards the South-east by the latter river to the Sanson District, as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 74, of the 7th September, 1882; and thence again towards the South-west by that district.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of October, 1884.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same: And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto for sale as a village settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall be disposed of as village-settlements and small-farm allotments for cash.
2. The day upon which the lands shall be open for application shall be Wednesday, the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, at the Land Office, Invercargill.
3. The lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall be disposed of for cash immediately on purchase.
4. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one section.
5. The price stated in the Schedule hereto shall be the price at which the lands shall be open for application.
6. If there should be more than one application for any allotment, the right to purchase the same shall be determined by auction amongst the applicants for the village allotments, and by lot amongst the applicants for the small-farm allotments.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section four of "The Juries Act, 1880" (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that any Maori whose capability may be certified under any regulations in that behalf, to be from time to time issued by the Governor in Council (which regulations the said Governor in Council is thereby authorized to make), shall be deemed to be duly qualified and liable to serve as a juror on any Maori jury or mixed jury for the trial of any case, civil or criminal, within the jury district in which such Maori so certified shall reside, and in which case the person or property of any Maori may be affected: And whereas it is expedient to make regulations for certifying the capability of Maoris for the purposes aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby order and declare as follows:—

Every Maori man between the ages of twenty-one and sixty years of age, who shall be of good fame and character, who shall reside within the colony, and whose capacity to serve as a juror shall have been certified to the Jury Officer of the

jury district within which such Maori man shall reside by a Resident Magistrate having jurisdiction within such district, shall be liable and qualified to serve as a juror upon all juries which may be empanelled for any trial or inquiry within such jury district, and in which trial or inquiry the person or property of any Maori may be affected.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 449, against 511 in August, a decrease of 62. The deaths in September were 175, a decrease of 26 on the number for August. Of the above deaths, males contributed 97; females, 78. Sixty-eight of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 38.86 per cent. of the whole number; 47 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the above four principal boroughs:—

The births in September were 251, against 280 in August, a decrease of 29. The deaths in September were 110, against 127 in August, a decrease of 17.

There were 14 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 2 males of 81 and 72, and two females of 70 and 65, died at Auckland; a male of 67, and two females of 68 and 67, at Wellington; 2 males of 65 and 63, and 3 females of 97, 78, and 73, at Christchurch; and a male of 72, and a female of 71, at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The number of deaths at the four towns fell from 25 in August to 19 in September, a lower mortality obtaining at Auckland and Wellington. From whooping-cough, which caused 8 deaths at the former town in August, there were 3 deaths in September. Diphtheria and croup were less fatal in September than in August, but the number of deaths for each month is small.

Constitutional Diseases.—An increase in the deaths from phthisis, from 8 in August to 16 in September, is the chief cause of the higher mortality from this class of disease.

Local Diseases.—There were 45 deaths in September, against 65 in August. Under all orders the decrease of mortality is considerable, except in case of diseases of the respiratory organs, which contributed 26 deaths in September, against 19 in August.

Developmental Diseases.—The mortality amongst children, which is the principal item, was the same for September as for August, and the number of deaths not remarkable.

Violent Deaths.—Five deaths of adults are noted as from accidental causes. A carpenter was killed by fall of a building; a girl, aged 17, by blow on the head caused by fall of a parcel; a labourer fell from his cart with fatal effect; a miner was killed by an explosion of dynamite; and the fifth case was one of accidental drowning. There was one suicide by shooting.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal zymotic diseases of the miasmatic order, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
