Altering Boundaries of Counties of Selwyn and Akaroa.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in me by section seven of "The Counties Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1882," and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, all that portion of land mentioned and described in the First Schedule hereto shall be added to the County of Selwyn, and that from and after the said date the boundaries of the said County of Selwyn shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto; and that from the date aforesaid the boundaries of the County of Akaroa shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto respectively.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA TO BE TAKEN FROM THE COUNTY OF AKAROA, AND
ADDED TO THE COUNTY OF SELWYN.

The Road District of Taitapu, as described in *New Zealand Gazette* for 1884, page 1208.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

COUNTY OF SELWYN.

BOUNDED towards the North-east, South-east, and North by Ashley County, from the saddle near the source of the Hurunui River to the mouth of the Waimakariri River; towards the East by the ocean to Lyttelton Harbour; towards the South by that harbour to the Borough of Lyttelton; thence towards the West, again towards the South, and towards the South-east by that borough to its north-western boundary; thence by a line due north to the summit of the Port Hills; thence towards the South-east and East generally by a line along the summit of the Port Hills to the south-east corner of Section No. 1093, by Sections Nos. 3535 and 32581, the Ahuriri Bush Road South, and Section No. 1879 to the River Halswell, and by a line along the middle of that river to Lake Ellesmere; thence again towards the South-east by a right line to the ocean at Taumutu; thence by the ocean to the mouth of the Rakaia River; thence towards the South-west and again towards the South by a line along the middle of that river to its source near Whitcombe's Pass; thence by a right line due west to the Southern Alps; and towards the North-west by the summit of the Southern Alps to the place of commencement.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

COUNTY OF AKAROA.

BOUNDED towards the North-east and South by Lyttelton Harbour and the ocean; and towards the West by the County of Selwyn, hereinbefore described.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir William Francis Drummond Jervois, Lieutenant-General in Her Majesty's Army, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE following special order, made by the Cook County Council, is published in accordance with "The Counties Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1882,"

SPECIAL ORDER made by the Cook County Council on the 11th September, 1884.

RESOLVED—1. That the boundaries of the Tolago Riding be amended as follows: Bounded towards the South by the southern boundary of the Whangara Block to the western boundary of that block; thence by the western boundary of that block to the Taumatarata Block; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of the Taumatarata, Rangikohua, and Arakihi Blocks to the eastern boundary of the Waikohu Riding; towards the West by the Waikohu Riding; towards the North by the Waiapu Riding; and towards the East by the ocean to the point of commencement.

2. That the boundaries of the Waikohu Riding be amended, and be those of the Waikohu Road District as amended this day.

3. That the Waimata Riding be now constituted, and that its boundaries be as follows: Bounded towards the North by the Tolago Riding, as amended this day; towards the East by the ocean; towards the South by the Borough of Gisborne; and towards the West by the Gisborne Riding and part of the Waikohu Riding to the southern boundary of the Tolago Riding, the point of commencement.

4. That one member be allowed for the Waimata Riding.

I certify that the foregoing special order was made by the Cook County Council on the 11th September, 1884, and that all the provisions of the Counties Act have been complied with.
