A PROCLAMATION.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter he known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth: after set forth:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the

hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of the Tinwald Town District, and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five in number.

ALL that area in the County of Ashburton bounded towards the North-west generally by Sections Nos. 17616, 15047, 22263, and 6422; towards the North-east by the Ashburton River; towards the South-east by a right line drawn from the south-eastern angle of Section No. 17074 at right angles to the south-western boundary of Section No. 4354; towards the South-west by said Section No. 17074, a road-line, and Section No. 17075; towards the South-east by said Section No. 17075; again towards the South-west by Section No. 23368 and Reserve No. 1780, by a right line to the south-western corner of Section No. 3, subdivision of Reserve No. 350; and again towards the South-west by Sections Nos. 4, 6, 7, and 8, again towards the South-west by Sections Nos. 4, 6, 7, and 8, subdivisions of Reserve No. 350.

WHEREAS by a special order published in the New Zealand Gazette of the eighteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the Clutha County Council altered the boundaries of the Clutha Road District, and thus caused the boundaries of the Richardson Riding to be not in conformity with the provisions of section twenty-three of "The Counties Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1882:" And whereas the said County Council has neglected to pass a special order altering the said riding as required by the said Act within three months from the said eighteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby order that, from and after the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four,

the boundaries of the aforesaid Richardson Riding shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

ALL that area bounded towards the North-west and North generally by the Ridings of Clinton and Pomahaka respectively; towards the North-east by the County of Bruce; towards the South-east by Block XIII., Clutha Survey District, and Block XII. of the said district to the Puerua River; thence towards the South generally by that river and the Little Puerua River to the southern boundary of Section No. 23, Block IX., Warepa Survey District; thence by the southern boundaries of Sections Nos. 23, 22, 20, 19, and 17 of the said Block IX., and by a bush reserve in that block to Section No. 3, Block VIII.; thence by the said Section No. 3 to the Owake River; thence by that river and the south-western boundary of Run No. 72A to the Waiwera River; and thence again towards the North-west by the Wairuna Riding.
