A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section seventeen of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876" (herein termed "the said Act"), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any district in New Zealand to be a borough under the said Act, from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation: And whereas it has been made to appear that the several conditions precedent prescribed by the said Act have been complied with:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, in the name and on behalf of His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, and as his duly-appointed Deputy, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby constituted a borough under the said Act as from the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five; and, in exercise of the like powers and authorities, I do hereby declare that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Mosgiel, and that the boundaries of such borough shall be those described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Otago, containing by admeasurement 975 acres, more or less, bounded towards the North-west by Sections Nos. 10, 9, 8, and 7 of Block VII., Taieri Survey District, a road-line, and Sections Nos. 12, 11, and 10 of Block VI.; towards the North-east by Section No. 8 of the last-mentioned block, a road-line, and Section No. 9 of Block II.; towards the South-east by Sections Nos. 4 and 5 of the last-mentioned block; again towards the North-east by the said Section No. 5, a road-line, and Section No. 26 of Irregular Block; again towards the South-east by a road-line south-east of Sections Nos. 25 and 24 to

the main road from Dunedin to Outram, and thence by a closed road south-east of the said Section No. 24 and Section No. 23 of the said block; towards the South-west by Section No. 22 of the said block, a road-line, Sections Nos. 3 and 9 of Block III., Taieri Survey District, and across a road-line to the most easterly corner of Section No. 3 of Block VII.; again towards the South-east by a road-line to Section No. 5 of the said block; and again towards the South-west by the said Section No. 5 to the point of commencement, the most southerly corner of Section No. 10.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881" (herein after called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except

in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, James Prendergast, in the name and on behalf of His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, and as his duly-appointed Deputy, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of the South-bridge Town District, and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven in number.

SCHEDULE.

SOUTHBRIDGE TOWN DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Canterbury, situate in the Southbridge Survey District, commencing at the south-western corner of Section No. 6816, and bounded towards the North-west by that section for a distance of 1171 links; thence across Harman's Road to the north-eastern corner of Section No. 5861; thence towards the North-east by a line running parallel to Jollie's Road to McKenzie's extension of the Township of Southbridge; thence again towards the North-west by the north-western boundary of the said extension to Section No. 4145; thence again towards the North-east by the said Section No. 4145 and Section No. 5106; again towards the North-west and North-east by the last-mentioned section and by the production of its south-western boundary-line to Section No. 8338; thence towards the South-east by the said Section No. 8338 and Section No. 12677 and the north-western boundary-line of the latter produced till it meets a line running parallel to and 1600 links distant at a right angle from Jollie's Road aforesaid; thence towards the South-west by the last-mentioned line to Smith's extension of the Township of Southbridge; thence again towards the South-east by the south-eastern boundary-line of that extension; again towards the South-west by the south-western boundary-line of Smith's extension of the Township of Southbridge aforesaid and that line produced across the North Rakaiia Road; towards the North by the northern side of that road to its intersection by a line running parallel to and 1600 links distant at a right angle from Jollie's Road aforesaid; thence again towards the South-west by the last-mentioned line to Section No. 4982; thence again towards the North-west by the said Section No. 4982 and by its southern boundary-line produced across Jollie's Road aforesaid; and thence again towards the North-east by Section No. 6816 aforesaid to the place of commencement.

And whereas the Minister for Public Works has laid before the Governor the memorial referred to in the section aforesaid, praying the Governor, by an Order in Council, to cause such land to be sold:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of "The Counties Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1882" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided that if the boundaries of any road district or subdivision be altered, or if any new road district be constituted, or if any road district be merged in a county, or if any town district be formed or its boundaries altered, thus causing any one or more of the ridings of the county to be not in conformity with the provisions of section twenty-three of the said Act, then and in such case the Council shall, within three months from the happening of one or other of such events, pass a special order altering the ridings accordingly, and the provisions of sections twenty-four and twenty-five of the said Act shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply thereto: And whereas those ridings of counties which are specified in the first column of the First Schedule hereto are not (for the reason specified in the second column of such Schedule opposite to the name of each such riding) now in conformity with the provisions of section twenty-three of the said Act, and no special order has with respect to the said ridings been passed by any County Council altering such ridings in terms of section twenty-six of the said Act: And whereas it appears expedient to make the alterations herein set forth with respect to the boundaries of the several ridings aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the said several ridings, and doth declare that, from and after the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, the boundaries of the said ridings shall be those respectively set forth opposite the name of each such riding in the Second Schedule hereto.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of February, 1885.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant or lunatic or other person under legal disability shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

SIR,—I have the honour to forward, for the information of your Excellency and Government, two copies of my commission as Her Majesty's Special Commissioner for the Protected Territory in New Guinea.

NEW GUINEA.

COMMISSION passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, appointing Major-General Peter Henry Scratchley, R.E., C.M.G., to be Her Majesty's Special Commissioner for the Protected Territory in New Guinea.

VICTORIA R.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India: To our trusty and well-beloved Peter Henry Scratchley, Esquire, late Lieutenant-Colonel and Colonel of our Corps of Royal Engineers, Honorary Major-General of our Forces, Companion of our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Greeting:

WHEREAS We have been pleased to take under our protection and jurisdiction the southern shore of New Guinea and the country adjacent thereto from the 141st meridian of east longitude, eastward as far as East Cape, including the islands adjacent thereto and in Goschen Straits, and southward of the said straits as far south and east as to include Kosman Island:

And whereas We are minded to make provision for the conduct of our affairs within the said Protectorate:

Now know you that We do, by this our commission, under our Sign Manual and Signet, appoint you, the said Peter Henry Scratchley, to be during our pleasure our Special Commissioner for the aforesaid Protectorate, and as such Special Commissioner to act in our name and on our behalf, and in all respects to represent our Crown and authority in matters occurring therein; and further to take all such measures and to do all such matters and things in the said Protectorate as in the interest of our service you may think expedient, subject to such instructions as you may from time to time receive from Us, or through one of our Principal Secretaries of State.

II. And We do require you, to the utmost of your power, to promote religion and civilization among the native inhabitants of the Protectorate, and you are especially to take care to protect them in their persons and in the free enjoyment of their lands and other possessions, and by all lawful means to prevent and restrain all violence and injustice which may in any manner be practised or attempted against them.

III. And We do hereby authorize and empower you, as occasion may require, to appoint all such officers as you may think necessary for our service in the said Protectorate, if provision shall have been made for their payment; and all such officers shall hold their offices during our pleasure.

IV. And We do hereby appoint that in the event of your death, incapacity, or absence, the powers and authorities hereby conferred shall, until our further pleasure be signified, become vested in our trusty and well-beloved Hugh Hastings Romilly, Esquire, or if he be absent or for any other reason be unable duly to exercise such powers and authorities, then in such person as our High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, or the person for the time discharging the function of such High Commissioner, shall appoint by an instrument under his hand and seal.

V. And We do hereby command and require all our officers and servants, and all other our loyal subjects, in New Guinea and its vicinity to be aiding and assisting unto you, the said Peter Henry Scratchley, in execution of this our commission, and unto any other person for the time being acting in execution thereof.

Given at our Court at Windsor, this twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, in the fourth-eighth year of our reign.

A limited number of private sidings only can be granted at stations, and such sidings only will be granted as the Railway Department, after full consideration, finds can conveniently and safely be allowed.

NOTES FOR JULY, 1884.
