IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the thirteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, making delegation of certain powers in man-ner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present order, delegate, but only with respect to the piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Manutahi Public Domain Board, namely,— The PATEA COUNTY COUCIL

The PATEA COUNTY COUCIL (herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipula-tions hereinafter contained, that is to say,— 1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Wednesday in each month, at eleven o'clock a.m., at the office of the County Council, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the fifth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five. 2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or

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by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted

at such meeting. 3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. 6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.
