BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Reserves and Endowments in Mining Districts Act, 1882," and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby declare that the laws for the time being in force relating to mining districts and to Wardens' Courts shall have operation within the endowment described in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant or lunatic or other person under legal disability shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

Authorizing Messrs. Lane and Brown to construct a Boom in Whangaroa Harbour.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of July, 1885.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence, the Governor in Council may authorize any person to construct harbour works (other than the reclamation of land from the sea, or any harbour, or the construction of any graving-dock, dock, or breakwater in any harbour or in the sea), and to use and occupy such part of the foreshore, or of any tidal land or tidal waters, as may be necessary for the

construction or use of such harbour works in any harbour where no Harbour Board is in existence: And whereas by section thirteen of "The Timber-floating Act, 1884," it is enacted that the laying-down of booms in navigable waters for the security of timber or other substances or materials shall be deemed to be a harbour work within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas Messrs. Lane and Brown are the owners and occupiers of the land adjacent to the place where it is proposed to lay down the boom hereinafter referred to: And whereas by the seventeenth section of the said Act it is also enacted that every such Order in Council shall be made upon such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council thinks fit, and the rights thereby conferred shall only be granted for a limited period not exceeding in any case fourteen years, and may at any time be altered, modified, or revoked:

And whereas Messrs. Lane and Brown, shipbuilders, of Totara North, Whangaroa, desire to construct a boom in Whangaroa Harbour, a place where no Harbour Board is in existence, and they have applied to the Governor in Council

for the issue of an order to authorize the construction of such boom, and have deposited a plan thereof, marked M.D. 1029, at the office of the Marine Department, Wellington, in the manner prescribed by the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of the said Act; and, it having been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, the Governor in Council hath this day approved of the said deposited plan without any modification or addition, and subject to the conditions set forth in this Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby authorize Messrs. Lane and Brown to construct a boom on the east side of Whangaroa Harbour, in accordance with the said plan marked M.D. 1029, the site of such boom being immediately adjoining the wharf shown on plan marked on M.D. 674, and on sketch plan recorded as Marine 82/742, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department, Wellington, and to use and occupy such portion of the foreshore or of any tidal land or tidal water as may be necessary for the construction and use of such boom, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

1. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the said Messrs. Lane and Brown shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege, without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

2. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, Messrs. Lane and Brown shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of five pounds, and thereafter a sum of one pound, payable annually on the first day of July; the first of such payments to be made on Messrs. Lane and Brown being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

3. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, and Messrs. Lane and Brown may be required to remove the boom from Whangaroa Harbour, at their own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to them six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to their last known address.

4. Nothing contained in this Order in Council shall be deemed to prevent its revocation at any time and without any notice in case Messrs. Lane and Brown shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boom;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause two of these conditions; or,
- (4.) Become bankrupt or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy.

And publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to Messrs. Lane and Brown, and to all persons concerned or interested in the said boom, that this Order in Council and the rights and privileges thereby conferred have been revoked and determined.

5. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto for sale as a village settlement:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same, that is to say,—

1. The lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto shall be disposed of as village allotments for cash, and small-farm allotments upon deferred payments.

2. The day upon which the lands shall be open for application shall be Wednesday, the second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, at the Land Office, Auckland.

3. The lands enumerated in the First Schedule hereto shall be sold for cash immediately on purchase, and the lands enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto shall be sold on deferred payments.

4. The lands which are disposed of by sale upon deferred payments shall be subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1877,"

5. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one section upon either immediate or deferred payments.

6. The prices stated in the Schedules hereto shall be the prices at which the lands shall be open for application.

7. If there should be more than one application for any allotment in the First Schedule, offered for cash, the right to purchase the same shall be determined by auction amongst the applicants only; and if there should be more than one application for any allotment in the Second Schedule, offered for deferred payments, the right to occupy the same shall be determined by lot amongst the applicants.

8. Each applicant for a deferred-payment section in the Second Schedule will be required to make the declaration prescribed by section sixty-two of "The Land Act, 1877," and shall at the time of application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the Auckland Land District one-tenth of the price of the allotment. Such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the license-fee for the six months due on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

9. The purchaser of any lands described in the First Schedule, upon the full payment of the purchase-money, and the purchaser of any lands described in the Second Schedule, upon the like payment, and also the fulfilment of the terms and conditions prescribed by "The Land Act, 1877," "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," and "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1882," relating to land on deferred payments, will be entitled to his Crown grant, to be issued in the usual way upon payment of the fees prescribed by law.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-first day of July, 1885.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the

operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the South Invercargill Domain Board, namely,—

The CORPORATION of the BOROUGH of SOUTH INVERCARGILL (herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Monday in each month, at three o'clock p.m., at the Borough Council Office, South Invercargill, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the tenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand has, by Proclamation, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedule hereto for sale as a village settlement:

Delegating certain Powers under "The Mines Act, 1877."

the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections six, seven, eight, nine, ten, forty-five, forty-six, forty-nine, fifty-one, fifty-four, fifty-five, fifty-nine, sixty-one, sixty-eight, seventy, eighty-two, eighty-three, ninety-nine, one hundred and one, one hundred and seven, and one hundred and twelve, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such delegation: And whereas it is expedient to make the delegation hereinafter contained:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervis, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby delegate unto Gerhard Mueller, Esquire, of Hokitika, and Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Provincial District of Westland, all the powers vested in the Governor under the thirty-seventh, thirty-eighth, thirty-ninth, fortieth, forty-first, forty-third, forty-fourth, fifty-sixth, sixtieth, and sixty-fifth sections of the said Act, and as the same sections, or any of them, may from time to time be amended; and I do hereby order and declare that the powers hereby delegated shall be exercised and performed by the said Gerhard Mueller within the Provincial District of Westland, and so long only as he shall hold the office of Commissioner of Crown Lands as aforesaid, and that all such powers shall be exercised in accordance with any regulations now in force under the said Act or that may hereafter be in force, so far as the same relates to the said powers hereby delegated, and subject also to the consent and approval of the Land Board of the Westland Land District.

Amended Regulations for Civil Service Travelling Allowances.

IN pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities vested in me in that behalf, I, William Francis Drummond Jervis, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations respecting the travelling allowances of officers in the Civil Service of New Zealand, and doth direct that the same shall come into force on the first day of August next ensuing.

REGULATIONS.

1. ALL salaried officers, except as hereinafter provided, shall receive travelling allowance for personal expenses at the daily rate of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) for every one hundred pounds (£100) of the salary received by them respectively: Provided, however, that the minimum allowance to be so paid shall be ten shillings (10s.) per diem, and the maximum allowance, except as hereinafter specified, shall be twenty-five shillings (25s.) per diem.

2. These allowances shall be paid only where an officer is necessarily absent from his head-quarters at night; but, for all journeys where an officer is not obliged to be absent at night, actual expenses will be paid to an amount in no case exceeding the full daily rate above authorised for personal expenses, on production of a statement giving details of the nature of the charges, with dates, places, and to whom paid, but without being obliged to produce receipts.

3. The above regulations as to a maximum allowance shall not apply to the existing holders of offices entitled under the present system to higher rates, or to cases in which a temporarily higher rate shall be specially sanctioned by the Minister; nor shall anything in these regulations preclude the Minister from specially authorising temporary special rates or amounts for travelling, to meet special cases, as hitherto.

4. Cost of transport by land or sea will be paid for by the Government, or, when paid for by the officer travelling, the same will be recouped to him on production of vouchers; but no vouchers for such expenses will be required for sums of less than 10s., and vouchers for railway fares will not be required if the railway travelled upon and the extent of journey is stated,

5. For all days at sea, after the first day, an allowance of only two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per diem to be given. For the first day at sea, the ordinary allowance may be drawn.

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," aforesaid, declare my intention to change the specific purpose of a portion of the reserve described in the first column of the Schedule hereto, the area of which is described in the second column of the said Schedule, to the specific purpose set opposite such description in the third column of the said Schedule.

2. The newly-discovered gold field, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new gold field within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to gold fields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

Inquiry into Collision between Steamers "Herald" and "Gairloch" confirmed.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased, in pursuance of the provisions of section 244 of "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," to confirm the report of the Court of Inquiry into the collision between the steamers "Herald" and "Gairloch," by which the New Zealand Certificate of Service, as master, No. 2428, held by Samuel Richard Savory, the master of the "Herald," is suspended for three months from the 29th May, 1885.

THAT the collision was caused solely by the default of the master of the "Herald," for the following reasons, namely:—

After considering the evidence in this case, the result at which I have arrived is to exonerate the master and crew of the "Gairloch," and to attribute the collision to the default of the master of the "Herald." I have come to the conclusion that the "Gairloch's" lights were burning, and ought to have been visible to the "Herald," if they were not, in fact, seen by them. I think also that the foresail was not set so as to affect the navigation of the "Gairloch," or to bring the master within the terms of the harbour regulations.

We have, therefore, to consider the case of two steamers meeting in a narrow channel, and to determine which of them is responsible for the collision.

In the first place, it seems clear, both from the general tenor of the evidence, and from the nature of the damage sustained by the "Gairloch," that the "Herald" ran into the "Gairloch," and not the "Gairloch" into the "Herald." It seems equally clear that the collision took place on the southern or Waiuku side of the channel. Had it been in or near mid-channel, as the master of the "Herald" alleges, the starboard light must have been visible to the "Herald" some considerable time before the collision. That it was not seen cannot be attributed to its being obscured by the foresail, for the "Herald's" witnesses themselves admit that the starboard clew was hauled up. The master of the "Gairloch" gives a consistent account of the transaction from first to last. He passed the corner buoy at a distance of some 60 feet; he sighted the middle buoy when half-way between it and the corner buoy; he then saw the "Herald," as he described it at the time, coming down upon him "ported, then hard-a-port;" and ran his ship ashore. Her head then canted out and showed her green light to the "Herald," and soon after the collision took place.

The evidence all concurs in determining that the "Gairloch" did take ground. The mate noticed that she lost way, and her head began to pay-off. The man at the wheel found that she lost steerage-way, and the engineer found that the engines were brought up. It is impossible for her to have gone ashore on the northern bank. It therefore follows, as a necessary consequence, that she must have touched on the southern. When we turn to the evidence of the "Herald" we find that those elements which make the evidence of the "Gairloch" trustworthy are almost entirely wanting. The master admits that, had the "Gairloch" been where he believed her to be, she could not have shown her red light alone. He was going at a higher rate of speed than he thought, believing that his engines were at half speed, when, in fact, they were at full speed; thus giving the ship at least a rate of eight knots instead of five or six. He cannot have been aware of his position when rounding the black buoy, or he would not have been so imprudent as to pass within 8 or 10 feet of it. If he had then ported and hard-a-port, as he said he did, he must inevitably have gone ashore on the northern bank. It seems, therefore, clear that the mate is correct in his statement that the helm was steadied before the order Hard-a-port was given.

This, then, seems to be the way in which the collision came about: The master of the "Herald" did not know his proper course. After rounding the black buoy, seeing the "Gairloch's" lights, and believing, in common with his mate, that she was on the lee bank, he thought he was steering down channel, when, in fact, he was steering across it towards the southern side. (This is corroborated by the mate's having called out to him to starboard.) Then, having probably discovered his mistake, he reversed his engines and put his helm hard-a-port, but too late to avoid a collision. The "Gairloch," although aground, cannot have been fast on the ground, and the result of the blow was to float her. The two ships then ranged side by side, and the "Herald," still having headway on her, forged ahead, and at last drew clear. I am not at all satisfied that the master gave any order to heave the lead at the time of the collision. Had he done so, it is scarcely credible that he would not have attended to any report; nor am I inclined to accept the statement of the man Mathews, who alleges that he heve the lead without any order to do so, and that between the two

vessels—a position which he, as a experienced seaman, must have known to be one of extreme danger. In any case soundings obtained under such circumstances would be of very little value. I am of opinion, therefore, that the evidence discloses great want of care on the part of the master of the "Herald."

I have suspended his certificate for three months, and ordered him to pay £32 5s. 6d. for costs, being the costs of all witnesses subpoenaed at his request, and half the balance of the costs of the inquiry.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases. The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 501, against 485 in May, an increase of 16. The deaths in June were 154, a decrease of 13 on the number for May. Of the above deaths, males contributed 88; females, 66. Fifty-five of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 35.71 per cent. of the whole number; 34 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—

The births in June were 306, against 283 in May, an increase of 23. The deaths in June were 96, against 93 in May, an increase of 3.

There were 8 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: five males of 80, 76, 74 (two), and 65 died at Auckland; a male of 74 at Christchurch; and two females of 68 (both) at Dunedin.

Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases fell to the unprecedentedly low number of 5, or 5·21 per cent. of the total deaths; the previously lowest number for the last three years having been 13, or 13·83 per cent. The adoption of a new system of classification prevents a strict comparison being made between the numbers in this class in this and former years; but no such alteration will account for the above small number of deaths in June. There was an entire absence of deaths from diarrhoeal diseases. Of these 5 deaths, 2 were from typhoid fever, both in Wellington; and 1 from diphtheria, in Auckland.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases caused 25 deaths in June, against 13 in May: of these, cancer caused 5 deaths in June, against 3 in May; and phthisis 11 in June, against 7 in May.

Local Diseases.—The deaths from these causes were slightly less numerous in June than in the preceding month. Of these, the diseases of the respiratory system were more fatal in June, the deaths having been 15 in that month, against 10 in May; but diseases of the digestive system caused only 6 deaths in June, against 14 in May.

Violence.—There were 9 deaths in this class in June, against 3 in May.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
