WHEREAS by the fifty-third section of "The Land Act, 1877," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas the Land Board of Otago has passed a resolution recommending that the land described in the Schedule hereto annexed should be set apart for sale on deferred payments:

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the aforesaid recommendation, and to set apart the said land accordingly:

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant or lunatic or other person under legal disability shall be vested in trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judges named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

3. If the application is refused by the Board, the amount of deposit paid in respect of such application shall be repaid to the applicant.

4. Before any application for a lease shall be granted by the Board, the Commissioner shall publish in some news-paper circulating in the district, once in each week for two consecutive weeks, a notice setting forth particulars of the application in such form as the Commissioner shall consider

All sections of land to be leased shall, as far as the features of the country will admit, and, except in the case of natural boundaries, be of a rectangular form; and no section shall be laid off in such manner as, in the opinion of the Board, to render less available for sale or lease, or injuriously to affect in value, any other Crown lands.

6. As soon as conveniently may be after the survey and determination of the rent, a lease executed by the Commissioner may be issued by the Board to the applicant, but no lease shall be executed by the Commissioner until the Board has approved thereof. The lessee shall then execute a counterpart thereof, and pay for such lease the sum of £1 1s. Every lease shall be in the form or to the effect in the Second Schedule hereto, and contain the covenants and provisions therein set forth.

7. If any applicant shall withdraw his application, or shall fail to sign and execute the counterpart of his lease for the fail to sign and execute the counterpart of his lease for the space of three calendar months after notice shall have been given that the same is ready for signature, he shall forfeit his right to such lease, as well as any deposit he shall have paid at the time of making his application. REGULATIONS FOR AID TO PROSPECTING.

1. Upon the Council of any county, or, where the Counties Act is not in force, upon any Road Board, adopting the following regulations for prospecting for diamonds, gold, silver, or tin, the Government shall, subject to the following conditions, subsidize by pound for pound the amounts expended by each County Council or Road Board, as the case may be the conditions.

may be:—
2. Previous to the Government binding itself to subsidize any local body as aforesaid, each local body shall submit its proposals to the Minister of Mines for approval.

3. On the application and proposals having been approved of, each payment shall be made on the certificate of the County Chairman in the case of a County Council, and in the case of a Road Board on the certificate of the Chairman of the said Board, or such other person as may be appointed by the Minister.

4. The amounts payable by way of subsidy to any County Council in any one year shall not exceed £500.

5. The amounts payable to any Road Board in any one

9. The amounts payable to any total Board in tary one year shall not exceed £200.
6. The Government shall subsidize by pound for pound any amounts expended by County Councils or Road Boards in the purchase of boring appliances to be used for prospecting purposes.

CLASS I.—One party of two or three men in each riding of any county will be subsidized at the rate of 15s. per week per man for prospecting new and unprospected country three miles from any main or district road and from any known

CLASS II.—One party of two or three men in each riding of any county will be subsidized as under while prospecting partially-worked and prospected country within tolerably easy access of road communication:—

Sinking.—Dry Ground: 1s. per foot from surface to 15 feet, 2s. per foot from 15 to 60 feet, 3s. per foot from 60 feet to any greater depth. Wet Ground, requiring slabbing: Double
