WHEREAS by the twenty-first section of "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may fix the terms and conditions upon which the lands comprised in any village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same : And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zeelend has by Breakmetica, est a part the lands

of New Zealand has, by Proclamation, set apart the lands enumerated in the Schedules hereto for sale as a village settlement :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony Now, therefore, his Excemency we covernor of the county of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth hereby fix the following terms and conditions upon which the said village settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same that is to say. the same, that is to say,-

disposed of as village allotments for cash, and small-farm allotments for cash and upon deferred payments. 2. The day upon which the lands shall be open for appli-cation shall be Wednesday, the ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, at the Land Office, Dunedin. 3. The lands enumerated

The lands enumerated in the First and Second Schedules hereto shall be sold for cash immediately on purchase, and the lands enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto shall be sold on deferred payments. 4. The lands which are disposed of by sale upon deferred payments shall be subject to the provisions relating to suburban lands of Part III. of "The Land Act, 1877." 5. No person shall be allowed to acquire more than one allotment upon either immediate or deferred payments

allotment upon either immediate or deferred payments.
The prices stated in the Schedules hereto shall be the prices at which the lands shall be open for application.
If there should be more than one application for any allotment in the First Schedule, offered for cash, the right to purples the approach be determined by exception. another in the First Schedule, onered for cash, the right to purchase the same shall be determined by auction amongst the applicants only; and if there should be more than one application for any allotment in the Second or Third Schedules, offered for cash or deferred payments, the right to occupy the same shall be determined by lot amongst the applicate

applicants. 8. Each applicant for a deferred-payment section in the Third Schedule will be required to make the declaration pre-scribed by section sixty-two of "The Land Act, 1877," and scalar by section sky-two of "The Land Act, 1877," and shall at the time of application deposit with the Receiver of Land Revenue for the Otago Land District one-tenth of the price of the allotment. Such payment shall be deemed to be a discharge of the license-fee for the six months due on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and

the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six. 9. HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be speci-fied in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said 'Public Domains Act, 1881:" Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the Wainui District Road Board, which shall be known as the Waivera Domain Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the transaction of business on the second Monday in each month, at three o'clock p.m., at the Wainui District Road Board Offices, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Monday, the twenty-third day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five. 2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days'

The members of the Board shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter at an annual meeting to be held on the second Monday in January in every succeeding year thereafter, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.
