WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Superintendent of Southland, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, certain land was declared to be a goldfield within the meaning of "The Goldfields Act, 1862," under the name of the Orepuki and Longwood Goldfield:

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, inter alia; enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the One-Tree Hill Domain Board, namely,—

The position is in lat. 20° 20′ S., long. 175° 25′ W., by good bearings, afterwards confirmed by the bearing from the anchorage, Nukualofa, from which it bears N.N.W. ½ N. forty-nine miles. On the 16th October it was about two miles long and from 100 to 200 feet high, but continually increasing in size from matter thrown up by a crater on the E.N.E. side of the island. of the island.

We first observed it on the morning of the 16th October, and ran within eight miles of it for the purpose of verifying its position. It was not safe to go nearer as the wind was falling light and the current setting towards it, but being a clear day we were able to get good bearings and note its exact position. Description: The land now offered for lease is excellent pastoral country. The carrying capacity of the land when cleared and grassed, judging from the results obtained by the settlers on the adjoining bush lands, is from three to four cross-bred sheep to an acre. Particulars relating to soil and timber are printed on the map. The formation is a limestone and marl (papa). The bush is mixed, generally of a light description. 
