WHEREAS by "The Census Act, 1877," it is provided that an account shall be taken in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six of the number and condition of persons, and of the live stock and of the land in cultivation, within New Zealand, and of other particulars relating thereto; and that such account shall be taken in such month and on such day or days, not being later than the first day of April, as the Governor shall, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, appoint:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said account shall be taken in the month of March, of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, on Monday, the twenty-ninth day of the said month, and for the night of Sunday, the twenty-eighth day of the aforesaid month.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and fourth section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allot-

*Further Extending the Boundaries of the Orepuki and Longwood Mining District.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Superintendent of Southland, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, certain land was declared to be a goldfield within the meaning of "The Goldfields Act, 1862," under the name of the Orepuki and Longwood Goldfield:

And whereas by a further Proclamation, bearing date the nineteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and issued under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, the boundaries of the aforesaid Orepuki and Longwood Goldfield were enlarged:

And whereas by the sixth section of "The Mines Act, 1877," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation, to constitute and appoint any portion of the colony to be a mining district under that Act, to assign boundaries to such district, to enlarge, contract, or otherwise alter such boundaries, and to declare by what local name every such district shall be designated; and that, until the Governor should otherwise order, every goldfield duly proclaimed or constituted at the time of the commencement of the now-recited Act shall be deemed a mining district under the said Act: And whereas it is desirable and expedient to enlarge the boundaries of the said goldfield:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The Mines Act, 1877," aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and order that the Orepuki and Longwood Goldfield Mining District aforesaid shall be and the same is hereby further enlarged, so that the boundaries of the said mining district shall henceforth be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this seventeenth day of November, 1885.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the twelfth section of "The Public Domains Act, 1881," it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act conferred, save as is therein mentioned, to any person or persons for any period, and subject to such stipulations as may be specified in such order, and that every such delegation may from time to time in like manner be altered or revoked: And whereas, pursuant to "The Public Reserves Act, 1881," by an Order in Council of even date herewith, the land described in the Schedule thereto is declared to be brought under the operation of and to be subject to the provisions of the said "Public Domains Act, 1881:"

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, doth, by this present order, delegate all the powers conferred by the Act first above mentioned, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the One-Tree Hill Domain Board, namely,—

The MEMBER for the ELECTORAL DISTRICT of MANUKAU,  
The MAYOR of the TOWN of ONEHUNGA,  
The CHAIRMAN of the ONE-TREE HILL HIGHWAY BOARD,  
The CHAIRMAN of the EPSOM HIGHWAY BOARD, and  
The CHAIRMAN of the MOUNT ROSKILL HIGHWAY BOARD

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipulations hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Wednesday in each month, at three o'clock p.m., at the Borough Council Chambers, Onehunga, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Wednesday, the ninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

2. IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,-

(1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ½d. and ¼d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade marks, such trade mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

DEAR SIR,—I beg to report the existence of a new island (volcano). The position is in lat. 20° 20' S., long. 175° 25' W., by good bearings, afterwards confirmed by the bearing from the anchorage, Nukualofa, from which it bears N.N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. forty-nine miles. On the 16th October it was about two miles long and from 100 to 200 feet high, but continually increasing in size from matter thrown up by a crater on the E.N.E. side of the island.

We first observed it on the morning of the 16th October, and ran within eight miles of it for the purpose of verifying its position. It was not safe to go nearer as the wind was falling light and the current setting towards it, but being a clear day we were able to get good bearings and note its exact position. It was still active when we left Tonga on the 21st October, and by last reports was 300 feet high and four miles long.

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club, whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

The income of each library may be stated either for the year ending the 31st December, 1885, or for the year ending with that day in the year 1885 on which the annual accounts of the library were made up.

A nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of each library's receipts, and the vote of £4,000 will be divided in proportion to the amounts as thus augmented, but so as that no institution shall receive more than £50.

Description: The land now offered for lease is excellent pastoral country. The carrying capacity of the land when cleared and grassed, judging from the results obtained by the settlers on the adjoining bush lands, is from three to four cross-bred sheep to an acre. Particulars relating to soil and timber are printed on the map. The formation is a limestone and marl (papa). The bush is mixed, generally of a light description. The main line of road, now in course of formation from the sea-coast at Wainui, connecting with the Napier-Wellington Railway at Tahoraiti, runs through the centre of Block V. 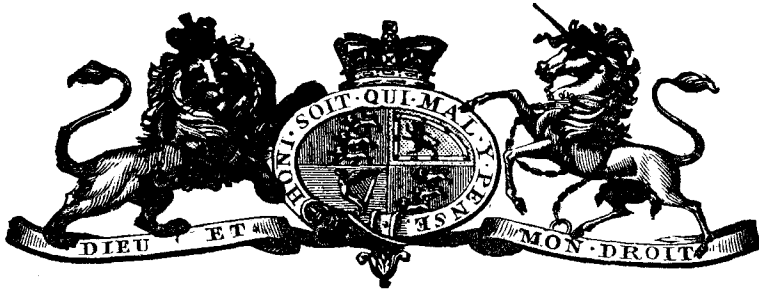
