ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings, at Wellington, this twenty-sixth day of November, 1885.

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called the "said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that, where the foreshore has been legally vested in any Harbour Board or other local governing body, it may from time to time, subject to the provisions of the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," license and permit any part of the foreshore to be used or occupied, inter alia, for the erection of baths and bath-houses, and any enclosure or fence necessary for the protection or privacy of the same: And whereas by the said Act it is also provided that every licensee shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have power to make and construct any necessary reclamation for the purpose of erecting on the foreshore comprised in his license, or upon any land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore which shall be specified in such license, any building, structure, erection, or other works to enable him to obtain the full benefit of such license: And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that every such license shall be in writing under the seal of the Board or body granting the same, and may be for any period per evereding fourteen years from the date thereof THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL. of the Board or body granting the same, and may be for any period not exceeding fourteen years from the date thereof, and may prescribe a sum of money to be payable either at stated periods or on or before the granting thereof for the use of the foreshore so granted, and may prescribe any other of the foreshore so granted, and may prescribe any other terms or conditions, general or particular, to be observed or performed by the person to whom the same is granted: And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted that, in any case where there is no Harbour Board, or no Harbour Board empowered to grant any such license as aforesaid, the Governor in Council may in his discretion grant and issue a license for all or any of the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, and all the provisions of the said Act in respect of such licenses shall,

mutatis mutandis, apply accordingly: And whereas the Tauranga Improvement Company (Limited), hereinafter called "the said company," has applied for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore. shore, in order to erect and maintain thereon baths in Tauranga Harbour; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1097), showing the place in the said harbour where it is intended to erect such baths, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the same, and the area of foreshore or land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purposes: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council, without modification or addition: And whereas there is no Harbour Board having jurisdiction in Tauranga Harbour, shore, in order to erect and maintain thereon baths in Tau-Harbour Board having jurisdiction in Tauranga Harbour, and it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the said company under the said Act, for the purposes aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth thereby license and permit the said company to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which are particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon baths in accordance with the said plan, such license to be held and enjoyed by the said company upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say,—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark required

foreshore and of the land below low-water mark required for the construction of the baths, and any enclosure or fence necessary for the protection or privacy of the same, as shown and delineated on the said plan as aforesaid.

2. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the said company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of five pounds, and thereafter an annual sum of one pound, the first of such annual payments to be made on the thirty-first day of December next.

3. The foreshore included in this license shall be used

3. The foreshore included in this license shall be used

solely for bathing purposes.
4. The said company shall, during the subsistence of this 4. The said company shall, during the subsistence of this Order in Council, provide and maintain proper and sufficient baths, with all necessary appliances and conveniences thereto, as will enable the public to use and enjoy the same, and all other advantages hereby conferred in respect of the use and occupation of the foreshore and land below high water, and with or without any charge for the same, and under such regulations for the decent and orderly use thereof as the said company may make.

5 A printed copy of the regulations affecting the use of

5. A printed copy of the regulations affecting the use of the said baths, and advantages as aforesaid, shall be put up

by the said company in such baths.

by the said company in such baths.

6. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the said company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

7. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the said company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the registered office of the said company.

8. In case the said company shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
(2.) Cease to provide or maintain the said baths for the

use of the public for bathing purposes;
(3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause two of these conditions; or

(4.) Be wound up or dissolved in any manner, or suffer or permit any steps or proceedings to be taken by any person for the purpose of winding up or dissolving the

said company, then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the said company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council

containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the said company and to all persons concerned or interested that this Order in Council and the rights and privileges

thereby conferred have been revoked and determined.

By-LAWS FOR REGULATING AND MANAGING LICEN SLAUGHTERHOUSES WITHIN THE MONGONUI COUNTY.

1. The license-fee shall be £2 per annum, payable in advance; such license to expire on the 31st day of December in each

year.

Description: The land now offered for lease is excellent pastoral country. The carrying capacity of the land when cleared and grassed, judging from the results obtained by the settlers on the adjoining bush lands, is from three to four cross-bred sheep to an acre. The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 467 against 583 in October, a decrease of 116. The deaths in November were 128, a decrease of 55 on the number for October. Of the above deaths, males contributed 74; females, 54. Thirty-nine of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 30.47 per cent. of the whole number; 28 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—

The births in November were 271 against 361 in October, a decrease of 90. The deaths in November were 74 against 116 in October, a decrease of 52.

There were 5 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: a male of 68 and a female of 68 died at Auckland; a male of 70 at Wellington; a male of 74 at Christchurch; and a female of 66 at Dunedin.

The mortality in the four boroughs was less in November last than during any other month in the past four years. The deaths during November in each of the years 1882, 1883, 1884, and 1885 were respectively 87, 83, 87, and 74, or a total for this month during four years of 331. This total was less than that for any other month during the same period, and exceeded that for the month of May, which had the next lowest number by 29. The mortality in the other boroughs specified in the report, as well as for the four principal boroughs, was also, on the average, lower in the month of November than in any other month.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths in the four principal boroughs from these diseases were only 9 in November against 17 in October. These included 3 deaths from diphtheria and 1 from typhoid fever, all of which occurred in Wellington.

Constitutional Diseases.—The deaths in this class amounted to 12 in November against 20 in October. Of these 12 deaths, 8 were caused by phthisis.

Local Diseases.—Of the diseases in this class those of the nervous system caused 12 deaths in November against 13 in the previous month; diseases of the circulatory system caused 6 deaths in November against 13 in October; and diseases of the respiratory system 10 deaths in November against 18 in October.

Violent Deaths.—Of the 4 deaths in this class, 2 were suicidal, by means of poison.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
