"THE FEDERAL COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIA ACT, 1885."

By His Excellency Sir George Cumine Strahan, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Go-vernor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

A PROCLAMATION.

Whereas by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48th and 49th Vict., c. 60, intituled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is declared to be expedient to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia, for the purpose of dealing with such matters of common Australasian interest in respect to which united action is desirable as can be dealt with without unduly interfering with the management of the internal affairs of the several colonies by their respective Legislatures: And whereas it is by the said Act enacted that a Federal Council shall be thereby constituted, and called the Federal Council of Australasia, but that the said Act should not come into operation in respect of any colony until the Legislature of such colony should have passed an Act or Ordinance declaring that the same shall be in force therein, and appointing a day on and from which such operation shall take effect, nor until four colonies at the least should have passed such Act or Ordinance: And whereas the said Act has come into operation in respect of WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48th at the least should have passed such Act or Ordinance: And whereas the said Act has come into operation in respect of the Colonies of Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania, Western Australia, and Fiji: And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted that the first session of the Federal Council shall be held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, and that the Council shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the colony in which the session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette of each of the colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation, and shall meet at such time and at such place as shall be named in the Proclamation; shall be named in the Proclamation;

Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.

T is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries
Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following
sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject
to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations
contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the hext seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a benus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter men-tioned that is to say.

(1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the

the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of \(\frac{1}{2}\)d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively \(\frac{1}{2}\)d. and \(\frac{1}{2}\)d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked. DESCRIPTION.

Description.

Tiger Hill District: Situated on the eastern boundary of the Manuherikia River, and south-east of Township of Black's (Ophir). Good grazing country lying between the settled Blocks V. and IX., Tiger Hill, X. and XI., Poolburn, and I. and II., Tiger Hill District.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 420 against 467 in November, a decrease of 47. The deaths in December were 188, an increase of 60 on the number for November. Of the above deaths, males contributed 120; females, 68. Seventy-six of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 40.42 per cent. of the whole number; 62 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The births in December were 254 against 271 in November, a decrease of 17. The deaths in December were 131 against

74 in November, an increase of 57.

There were 11 deaths in December were 204 against 271 in November, a decrease of 17. The deaths in December were 101 against 74 in November, an increase of 57.

There were 11 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: four males of 70 (2) and 65 (2), and two females of 67 and 65, died at Auckland; a male of 81, and two females of 74 and 67, at Wellington; a male of 72 at Christchurch; and a male of 66 at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these diseases increased in number from 9 in November to 24 in December, attributable chiefly to the larger number of deaths from diarrhosal diseases, which were 14 in December against 2 in November. These deaths in December were chiefly those of infants. Of these deaths, 10 occurred in Auckland, 3 in Wellington, and 1 in Christchurch.

The mean temperature in Auckland was 4.6 degrees hotter, in Wellington 2.6 degrees hotter, and in Dunedin 0.7 of a degree better in December these in November.

Two deaths occurred from typhoid fever: one in Wellington, the other in Dunedin.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases also caused a largely-increased mortality in December, the number of deaths having been 31 against 12 in the previous month. Phthisis caused 18 deaths in December against 8 in November. Three deaths in December were attributed to cancer.

Local Diseases.—The deaths in this class amounted to 52 in December against 41 in November. Among the diseases of the nervous system apoplexy and infantile convulsions were more fatal. Diseases of the heart caused 10 deaths against 6 in November; and diseases of the respiratory system, 12 deaths in December against 6 in November.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health. connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
