WHEREAS by a warrant under Our hand dated the thirteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, certain Commissioners were appointed to devise and carry out the details necessary for the transmission to London of any articles the produce or manufacture of Our Colony of New Zealand, intended for exposition at an Exhibition of the products, manufactures, and arts of Our Colonial and Indian dominions, to be held in London during the present year, for the due display of the said articles at the said Exhibition, and for their subsequent sale or careful return to their owners: And whereas it has been or careful return to their owners: And whereas it has been represented to Us that it is desirable that additional Commissioners should be appointed for the before-mentioned

presents authorize and appoint you to be such additional Commissioners accordingly, with the powers and duties set forth in the aforesaid warrant of the thirteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
