At the Government House, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of March, 1886.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL,

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-third section
of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the
Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter,
and repeal regulations for fixing the terms and conditions
upon which the lands in any special settlement shall be
disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

And whereas it is desirable to make regulations for the
occupation of the block of land set apart by Proclamation
dated the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred
and eighty-six, in terms of the one hundred and sixty-second
section of the said Act, as a special settlement for noncommissioned officers and members of the Police and Armed
Constabulary Force who may retire for the purpose of Constabulary Force who may retire for the purpose of settling thereon, or who may have been discharged on reduction of that force since the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, or who, with per-

mission of the Defence Minister, are permitted to continue to serve, with the intention of settling thereon:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the regulations which were made by Order in Council issued on the twenty-ninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by the exercise of the power and atthorney conferred upon me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby revoke the Order in Council of the said twenty-ninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and do hereby fix the following terms and conditions as those upon which the special-settlement block shall be disposed of to members of the said force, and the mode of payment for the same.

Should any settler be compelled to leave the district previous to his completing the requisite term of occupation, it shall be competent for the Commissioner to permit such settler to transfer his rights, title, and interest in the land selected to another bonâ fide settler, who shall be deemed to occupy the position of the original occupant: Provided always that no settler shall be allowed to hold more than 200 acres under these regulations.

14. No person shall be entitled to hold land under these regulations unless he shall have served at least five years in the Police and Armed Constabulary Force, and shall have

WHEREAS, in the opinion of His Excellency the Governor, no sufficient provision has been made by "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1885" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), with respect to the functions of united Boards constituted under the provisions of section thirty-four of the said Act, and with respect to other matters, and it appears expedient to make the regulations hereinafter contained:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby make and prescribe the regulations hereinafter set forth for the purpose of facilitating or more effectively carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act, and doth declare that such regulations shall come into force on and after the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six. sand eight hundred and eighty-six.

REGULATIONS.

1. Each of the Boards of the united districts specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto (hereinafter termed "the said Boards") shall be known by the corporate name respectively set epposite the name of each such united district in the second column of the said Schedule.

2. Each of the said Boards shall set apart and keep a separate fund, to be called "The Charitable-aid Fund," into which shall be paid all moneys that may come to the hands of the Board for the purposes of "The Hospitals and Chari-table Institutions Act, 1885" (hereinafter termed "the said Act'). The account in connection with such fund shall be operated upon in the manner provided by section 20 of the

3. Subject to the provisions of the said Act and for the purposes of charitable aid, each of the said Boards may, within the district assigned to it, from time to time declare what local authorities shall be liable to contribute to a refer local side in such district assigned. time declare what local authorities shall be liable to contribute to or afford charitable aid in such district, and may appoint the proportion of contribution to be made by each such local authority respectively and the time for the payment thereof; and in the event of non-payment may sue for and recover the amount of any such contribution in the manner by the said Act provided with respect to contributions in arrear by local bodies. Any such declaration and appointment as aforesaid may be made either separately by the said Boards or conjointly with any similar declaration and appointment made by a District Board or other body with respect to the maintenance of any hospital or other institution within the district.

4. Such examination will commence with the colour test; and if the candidate does not, at the time of making application, hold a certificate of competency of any grade, and should fail to distinguish correctly any one of the colours used in the test, he will not be allowed to proceed with the examination in navigation and seamanto proceed with the examination in navigation and seaman-

6. The fee he has paid for examination for a certificate of competency will include the fee for the colour test, and, with

him.

7. A candidate for examination for a certificate of competency who, at the time of making application, does not possess a certificate, and who fails to pass the colour test, may not be re-examined until after the lapse of three months from the date of his first failure. If he fails a second time, he will be allowed a third trial at the expiration of another three months from the date of his second failure. A fresh fee must be paid at each succeeding examination.

8. It is therefore obviously to the advantage of candidates for certificates of competency to apply in the first instance to be examined in colours only.

9. A candidate who holds a certificate of competency, and who, on presenting himself for examination for a certificate of a higher grade, is unable to pass the colour test, will, notwithstanding, be permitted to proceed with the examination in navigation and seamanship for the certificate of the higher grade.

Description.
