SIR,—I have the honour to enclose, for your information, copies of the Queensland Government Gazette, which publishes a commission appointing me to be a Special Commissioner for the Protected Territory in New Guinea.

And We do hereby appoint that in the event of your death, incapacity, or absence the powers and authorities hereby conferred shall, until our further pleasure be signified, become vested in our trusty and well-beloved Hugh Hastings Romilly, Esquire, or if he be absent or for any other reason be unable duly to exercise such powers and authorities, then in such person as our High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, or the person for the time discharging the function of such High Commissioner, shall appoint, by an instrument under his hand and seal.
