**A PROCLAMATION.**

**WHEREAS** by section seventeen of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any district in New Zealand to be a borough under the said Act from and after a date to be named in such Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the district described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby constituted, as from the date hereof, a borough under the said Act and the Acts amending the same, and that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Devonport, and that the boundaries of such borough shall be those described in the Schedule hereto.

**SCHEDULE.**

**BOUNDED** towards the North by Sections Nos. 8 and 7, Parish of Takapuna, the road forming the southern boundary of Section No. 5, and the southern side of that road produced to the sea; thence towards the East by the sea to the North Head of Waitemata Harbour; thence towards the South by that harbour to O'Neill's Point; and thence towards the West generally by Shoal Bay.

THE HONOURABLE THE PREMIER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act, 1867" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that, if any title to or interest in any hereditaments shall accrue to any Maoris, who or any of whom shall be infants, lunatics, or under legal disability, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he think fit, to order that such hereditaments, or any part thereof or interest therein, as shall to the Governor in Council be shown to belong to such infant or lunatic or other person under legal disability shall be vested in Trustees, as the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas by "The Maori Real Estate Management Act Amendment Act, 1877," it is provided that, in all cases in which no Trustee of such estate of any infant Maori prior to the passing of the said last recited Act has been appointed, the Governor may appoint such Trustee only on the recommendation of a Judge of the Native Land Court:

And whereas, in pursuance of orders bearing dates as contained in the first column of the Schedule hereto, made by the Judge named in the second column thereof, the persons named in the third column were recommended to the Governor as Trustees under the said Acts on behalf of the persons named and under the disability described in the fourth column, in respect of the lands described or referred to in the fifth column:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Acts, doth hereby order that the interests and shares of the persons under disability named in the Schedule hereto in the several blocks of land referred to therein shall be and remain vested in the several persons named in the third column thereof as Trustees within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Acts for the said persons respectively during the term or terms of their minority or other disability; the said parcels of land having the areas and boundaries set forth in the Crown grants, certificates of title, and memorials of ownership affecting the same, and in the record maps in the office of the Surveyor-General.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear that certain things required to be done by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," in connection with the making and revision of the burgess lists or rolls of the Borough of Tauranga, cannot be done by or within the time required by the said Act:

*Extending Close Season for Rock-oysters in Hauraki Gulf, &c.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fifth day of May, 1886.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among

other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, which said regulations shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of March, the seventeenth day of September, and the second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, certain regulations were made in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, prescribing a close season for rock-oysters:

And whereas certain doubts having arisen as to the situation of the River Waikawau, referred to in the last-recited Order in Council, it is advisable to repeal the same, and to make fresh regulations in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby repeal the above-recited Order in Council dated the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth: Provided however that the revocation herein contained shall not invalidate or in any way prejudice any proceedings that may have been heretofore commenced under the authority of the said recited Order in Council, but such proceedings may be carried on and concluded as if this order had not been made.

REGULATIONS.

The close season for rock-oysters prescribed by the regulations made under the said Act by Order in Council bearing date the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, is hereby declared to commence from the date hereof, and is also extended, as also the operation of the said recited regulations, until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, in respect of the foreshore of the coast in Hauraki Gulf and Frith of Thames within a line drawn from Point Rodney to the mouth of the Waikawau River, situated on the west coast of the Coromandel Peninsula, and which river forms one of the boundaries of the County of Coromandel, and also in respect of the foreshores of all islands in that portion of the Hauraki Gulf and the Frith of Thames lying to the southward and westward of a line drawn from Point Rodney to Cape Colville, and also in respect of the foreshores of the coast and all islands adjacent thereto between Ngatoka Rarangui Point on the north, and Bream Head on the south.

Any person committing a breach of the above regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one pound and not exceeding fifty pounds.

*Regulations for the Formation of Village Special Settlements on Perpetual Leasing.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of May, 1886.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the one hundred and sixty-third section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for fixing the terms and conditions upon which the lands in any special settlement shall be disposed of, and the mode of payment for the same:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby fix the following terms and conditions as those upon which village special-settlement blocks shall be disposed of on perpetual leasing, and the mode of payment for the same.

REGULATIONS.

1. The land to be selected under these regulations shall be held on perpetual lease for the first term of thirty years, and for subsequent terms of twenty-one years, without any right of acquiring the freehold.

2. The rental shall be based on the capital value of the land, which shall in no case be less than 20s. an acre.

3. No charge will be made for the lease, which shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto, beyond the sum of 10s. for registering the same in the Land Transfer Department.

4. Renewals of leases shall be subject in all respects to the provisions of sections 151 to 155 of Part IV. of "The Land Act, 1885."

5. Married men will have preference as selectors under these regulations.

6. No greater area than twenty acres will be allotted to any one applicant.

7. Subject to such conditions as the Steward of Village Settlements may prescribe, and within the first five years of the date of the selection, an advance of a sum not exceeding £20 will be made to assist a selector in the erection of a house on his selection; and in bush lands a further sum not exceeding £2 10s. an acre will be advanced for bush-felling and for grassing from such sums as may be appropriated by Parliament for these purposes.

8. The annual rent shall be 5 per cent. on the capital value of the land, together with 5 per cent. on such sums as may be advanced in terms of clause 7, payable half-yearly, on the 1st day of January or July next ensuing after the lapse of six months from the dates of the selection and advances respectively.

9. All applications for land under these regulations shall be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the district. Where more applications than one are made on the same day for the same land, the right to occupy the land applied for shall, subject to clause 5, be determined by lot amongst the applicants.

10. Each selector or transferee will be required to occupy his selection as his home, and to make permanent improvements as required by clauses 11 and 12.

11. Each selector shall within two years cultivate one acre, and within four years the half of the remainder, of his selection.

12. Permanent improvement shall mean—

- (a.) Fencing the land with timber or other durable materials, not being a brush fence; or
- (b.) Breaking up and laying down the same in English or other cultivated grass; or
- (c.) Breaking up and planting or sowing root or other crops therein; and, in case of bush lands, the felling and clearing of timber and sowing of grass.

13. Selectors will not be allowed to subdivide or sublet their holdings; but, with the consent of the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the district, they may transfer them, provided that all the conditions of these regulations have been fulfilled to date of application to transfer. No person who has an interest in any land in the colony shall be eligible as a selector under these regulations.

14. Each selector will only be allowed to take up one section under these regulations, which must be held for his sole use and benefit, and not for any other person whomsoever.

15. Any selector who shall fail to comply with these regulations in any respect shall, upon sufficient proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, forfeit his interest in the land selected.

16. In case any doubt shall arise as to the construction of these terms and conditions with reference to the selection and occupation or clearing of any land, or otherwise arising thereunder, the same shall be settled by the Commissioner.

The first payment of such rent having been made, the next

And it is hereby declared and agreed that these presents are intended to take effect as a lease under the regulations made by Order in Council issued on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 188\_\_\_\_, and the provisions of those regulations shall be binding in all respects upon the parties hereto in the same manner as if such provisions had been fully set out herein; and that if any dispute or disagreement shall arise between the parties hereto touching the construction of these presents, or in anywise relating hereto, such dispute or disagreement shall be referred to arbitration in the manner set forth in section 62 of the said Act; and neither of the said parties shall take or cause to be taken any steps or proceedings to set aside or call in question any award or decision which may have been given upon any such reference as final.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," and "The Animals Protection Act Amendment Act, 1881," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby notify that deer (bucks or stags only) may be taken or killed within the boundaries of the Wellington and Wairarapa District Acclimatisation Society's District, from the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, till the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, both days inclusive (subject, however, to the restrictions in the said Acts mentioned). And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such game may be obtained from the Chief Postmaster at Wellington on payment of the sum of two pounds each, and that the said Postmaster is hereby appointed to issue the said licenses: Provided nevertheless that nothing herein contained shall extend to authorize any person to sell any deer or portion thereof under any license so obtained as aforesaid.

- (1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
  - (2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
  - (3.) In respect of cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ½d. and ¼d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.
9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.
10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus,

and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

**A**SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University January Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand, who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

If any candidates offer themselves, the January examination for New Zealand will be held some time in the month of January, 1887, or as soon after as the examination papers arrive in the colony, and at such place or places as may be hereafter fixed, having regard to the candidates' places of abode.

Candidates will not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subject, according to the details specified under the several heads:—

1. Latin;
2. Any two of the following languages: (a) Greek, (b) French, and (c) German;
3. The English language, English history, and modern geography;
4. Mathematics;
5. Natural philosophy;
6. Chemistry.

Particulars of the foregoing subjects of examination will be found in the Calendar of the University of London, under the head of "Regulations—Matriculation." The special Latin and Greek subjects for January, 1887, are *Cicero, De Senectute and Pro Lege Manilia*; and *Homer, Iliad, Book XVI*.

The scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1887, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1887, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first examination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

Every candidate will be required to give satisfactory evidence that he is between the ages of sixteen and twenty-two years, and either that he is a native of New Zealand, or that he has resided in New Zealand for the last five years.

Description: These sections comprise excellent scrub and bush-clad pastoral country. The formation is a limestone and calcareous marl or papa. The bush contains mixed timbers, generally of a light description on the hills.

jointly with any other person or persons, including the lands comprised in the lease, of a greater area than 640 acres anywhere in the colony.
