6. No greater area than fifty acres will be allotted to any one applicant.
7. Subject to such conditions as the Steward of Village Settlements may prescribe, and within the first five years of the date of the selection, an advance of a sum not exceeding £20 will be made to assist a selector in the erection of a house on his selection; and in bush lands a further sum not exceeding £2 10s. an acre up to but not exceeding an area of 20 acres will be advanced for bush-felling and for grassing from such sums as may be appropriated by Parliament for

these purposes.

8. The annual rent shall be 5 per cent. on the capital value of the land, together with 5 per cent. on such sums as may be advanced in terms of clause 7, payable half-yearly, on the 1st day of January or July next ensuing after the lapse of six months from the dates of the selection and

lapse of six months from the dates of the selection and advances respectively.

9. All applications for land under these regulations shall be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the district. THE following rules for the conduct of the business of Native Committees, framed under "The Native Committees Act, 1883," are published for general information. J. BALLANCE

RULES under "The Native Committees Act, 1883," for Conduct of the Business of Native Committees.

- 1. AFTER the first meeting of the Committee has been convened by the Native Minister, all subsequent meetings shall be convened by the Chairman, in such manner as he shall
- 2. The meetings shall begin at an hour to be fixed by the
- Chairman.
 3. The Chairman shall, in sufficient time beforehand, notify to each member of the Committee, in writing, when and where the meetings are to be held.

 4. The Committee may adjourn its sittings from day

4. The Committee may adjourn its sittings from day to day, or to such day and place as may be considered desirable.

5. All ordinary meetings shall be open to the public, but the Committee shall have power in its discretion to exclude any person or all persons therefrom.

6. No person who is not a member of the Committee shall be allowed to take part in its proceedings, excepting witnesses and persons who may be required by the Committee to attend. Parties may appear by agents appointed in to attend. Parties may appear by agents appointed in writing, with the permission of the Committee.

7. At all meetings the Committee shall confine their attention solely to the business under consideration.

8. Where a number of Natives may desire a special meeting of the Committee an application to that effect should be made to the Chairman, whose duty it will be, if he considers the request should be granted, to convene a special meeting accordingly.

9. Persons desirous of bringing cases before the Committee shall apply in writing to the Chairman, or member acting as such, in the form contained in the First Schedule hereto, setting forth the particulars of the matter, and names and

setting forth the particulars of the matter, and names and addresses of the persons concerned.

10. Parties who may desire persons as witnesses shall apply to the Chairman to summon them to attend as such.

11. The Chairman shall issue summonses to persons to attend before the Committee to give evidence, or for any purpose he may consider necessary for the proper conduct of the business of the meeting.

12. Due notice shall be given by the Chairman of the time and place appointed for the hearing of all cases to the persons interested therein.

13. If the Chairman or any member of the Committee has 13. If the Chairman or any member of the Committee has any interest in any case before the Committee which is to be investigated by the Native Land Court, it will not be competent for him or them to take part in the proceedings. The Chairman shall then call upon other members of the Committee to consider the matter. If there is not a quorum the case cannot be heard, and it will be the duty of the Chairman to inform the Chief Judge of the Native Land Court, in writing, of the reason.

man to inform the Chief Judge of the Native Land Court, in writing, of the reason.

14. If the Chairman or any member of the Committee has any interest in any case coming before the Committee which would not be a subject for inquiry by the Native Land Court, it will not be competent for him or them to take part in the proceedings of the case. The Chairman shall then call upon other members to consider the matter. If there should not be a quorum the case must be dismissed.

15. When the Native Land Court is engaged in hearing a case an application in respect of which may have been sent to the Committee but not yet considered by it, the Chairman may call a meeting of the Committee to hear the case. Upon the matter being investigated by the Committee, the

Upon the matter being investigated by the Committee, the result shall be forwarded by the Chairman direct to the pre-

siding Judge who is hearing the case.

16. Whenever time will admit, notices of meetings shall be sent by the Chairman to the Native Minister for publication in the Kahiti. But it will be in the discretion of the Native Minister to insert such notices or not as he may think at

think fit.

The Committee shall allow both parties concerned in

cases to bring their witnesses before it.

18. No Europeans are to be allowed to act on behalf of

Natives before the Committee.

19. Fees in accordance with the scale in the Second Schedule hereto may be charged by the Committee by consent of the party or parties.

20. All fees shall be used for Committee purposes in such

20. All fees shall be used for committee purposes in such manner as the Committee may deem desirable.

21. The Chairman shall keep an account of all fees received and disbursed, and at the end of every six months he shall submit a statement of the same to the Committee, after shall be appointed annually for that purpose by the Committee, after being examined and reported on by two of its members, who shall be appointed annually for that purpose by the Committee. Certified copies of such accounts shall be forwarded to the Native Minister as soon as convenient after they have been reported on.

22. No expenditure is to be incurred by the Committee on behalf of the Government without authority, in writing, being first obtained from the Native Minister.

1. The maximum sum offered as a reward for any proved discovery of a new goldfield in accordance with these conditions is 2500; but, if the total sum claimed as rewards in any one year exceeds the parliamentary vote, the amount available only will be divided equally.

2. The newly-discovered goldfield, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required. will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which

such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

Failure to give Notice or to deliver up Certificate of Registry when a Ship is actually or constructively lost or ceases to

THE attention of masters and owners is called to the provisions of section 53 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," which are as follows :-

If any registered ship is either actually or constructively lost, taken by the enemy, burnt, or broken up, or if by reason of a transfer to any persons not qualified to be owners of British ships, or of any other matter or thing, any such ship as aforesaid ceases to be a British ship, every person who at the time of the occurrence of any of the aforesaid events owns such ship or any share therein shall, immediately upon obtaining knowledge of any such occurrence, if no notice thereof has already been given to the Registrar at the port of registry of such ship, give such notice to him, and he shall make an entry thereof in his register-book; and, except in cases where the certificate of registry is lost or destroyed, the master of every such ship so circumstanced as aforesaid shall immediately, if such event occurs in port, but if the same occurs elsewhere then within ten days after his arrival in port, deliver the certificate of registry of such ship to the If any registered ship is either actually or constructively same occurs elsewhere then within ten days after his arrival in port, deliver the certificate of registry of such ship to the Registrar or, if there be no Registrar, to the British Consular Officer at such port; and such Registrar, if he is not himself the Registrar of her port of registry, or such British Consular Officer, shall forthwith forward the certificate so delivered to him to the Registrar of the port of registry of the ship; and every owner and master who, without reasonable case, makes default in obeying the provisions of this section shall for each offence incur a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.
