WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand did, in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The New Zealand Government Insurance Association, Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), approve of the tables set forth in the Schedule to the said Order in Council as the tables to be used under the said Act, and the regulations made thereunder for determining the value of annuities, and for payment of sums of money at death or otherwise: And whereas it is expedient to modify the tables so made as aforesaid in the case of assurances on the lives of Ministers of Religion:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve and direct that in all contracts to be made under the said Act after this Order in Council takes effect, a deduction at the rate of five pounds per centum shall be made from the rates of premium contained in the tables made as aforesaid in the case of assurances effected under the said Act on the lives of Ministers of Religion whose names have been or shall hereafter be duly registered under the Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, the short title whereof is "The Marriage Act, 1880;" and in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers and authorities, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby order that this present Order in Council shall take effect from the first day of May next.

Alterations and Additions to the Scale of Fares and Charges in force on the New Zealand Railways.

IN accordance with section 144 of "The Public Works Act, 1882," I, Edward Richardson, the Minister for Public Works, do hereby make the following alterations and additions to the scale of charges, to come into force on and after the 7th day of June, 1886:—

PART IV.—LOCAL RATES.

WANGANUI SECTION.

New Plymouth Breakwater Line.

Goods of Classes A, B, C, and D will be charged according to ship's manifest, or by weight or measurement, at the option of the Railway Department, at the following rates:—

Between the Breakwater and Morley Street Goods Depot, 3s. per ton; between the Breakwater and New Plymouth Station, 4s. per ton; and for goods to be despatched inland by rail, 1s. per ton for redespaching.

Goods despatched inland will be charged at the classified rates from the Breakwater.

Goods for shipment requiring storage at the Goods Depot will be charged 1s. 6d. per ton for the first week or fraction of a week, and 2d. per ton per week for each additional week.

Goods consigned to the Breakwater for shipment, and not taken delivery of by the ship within six working hours, will be held thereafter at the risk of the consignor, and may be returned unloaded, and stored at the Goods Depot, at the risk and expense of the consignor.

Cattle, sheep, horses, and pigs, carried between the Moturoa Cattle-yards and the Breakwater, will be charged 7s. 6d. per truck.

AMENDED CONDITIONS.

1. The maximum sum offered as a reward for any proved discovery of a new goldfield in accordance with these conditions is £500; but, if the total sum claimed as rewards in any one year exceeds the parliamentary vote, the amount available only will be divided equally.

2. The newly-discovered goldfield, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.

IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next

seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

(1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ¼d. and ½d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

A SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University January Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand, who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

If any candidates offer themselves, the January examination for New Zealand will be held some time in the month of January, 1887, or as soon after as the examination papers arrive in the colony, and at such place or places as may be hereafter fixed, having regard to the candidates' places of abode.

Candidates will not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subject, according to the details specified under the several heads:—

6. Chemistry.

The scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1887, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1887, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first examination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

By-laws of the Borough of Winton.

BY-LAWS OF THE CORPORATION OF WINTON.

The following by-law has been adopted in terms of sections 38, 39, and 40 of "The Otago Municipal Corporations Empowering Act, 1865:"—

A by-law to provide for the better rule and government of the Town of Winton.

In pursuance of the powers contained in sections above named, the Council of the Town of Winton ordains as follows, that is to say, any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects, numbered 1 to 32 inclusive, within the Town of Winton shall, on being convicted of any such offence, neglect, or omission, be liable to pay any penalty not exceeding £5:—

1. Throwing any glass, dirt, filth, nightsoil, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature upon any street, footway, court, alley, or public place whatever.
2. Riding, driving, leading, or wheeling any barrow, cart, dray, or carriage upon or along any footpath without permission from the Town Council.
3. Placing any timber, bricks, stone, or other building-materials upon any footway, channel, surface-drain, or carriage-road without such permission as aforesaid.
4. Burning any shavings, straw, or other materials or matter upon any footway, carriage-road, or open or public place, or setting fire to any bush or scrub, without such permission as aforesaid.
5. Leaving any inflammable materials or matter upon any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without such permission as aforesaid.
6. Drawing or trailing any sledge, timber, or other material upon any footway or carriage-road, to the injury of such footway or carriage-road.
7. Placing any placard or other document on, or writing or painting on, or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, telegraph-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
8. Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage-road, without authority from the Council to do so.
9. Neglecting to clear any private yardway, passage, or avenue, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.
10. Breaking-in any horse, or playing any game, to the annoyance of any person, in any public place, or obstructing any footpath or carriage-road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage-road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.

11. Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the danger or damage of any person or property.

12. Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without permission of the Town Council.

13. Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place, street, or thoroughfare.

14. Making any cellar-door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent, or not in accordance with the directions, of the Town Council.

15. Discharging any fire-arms or letting off any fire-works within the Town of Winton without permission from the Town Council.

16. Any person laying out or opening any street or building therein, or omitting during the operations necessary for forming such street, or for building therein, to take all such precautions for guarding against injury to the passengers along such street as may be necessary, or as may be directed by the Town Council.

17. Any person placing any obstruction upon any street-line whereby life or limb is likely to be endangered.

18. Any person leaving any hole, excavation, or dangerous formation in or near any public place, street, or thoroughfare without fencing or enclosing same, or without keeping a light burning upon such formation from sunset to sunrise.

19. Any carter riding any cart, dray, or wagon without having and holding proper and sufficient reins, and no competent person or persons having charge of the animal or animals driving the same.

20. Any person slaughtering or skinning any beast within the boundaries of the town, or permitting any slaughtered beast or skin to remain there, or leaving any dead beast exposed within the boundaries of the municipality.

21. Any person turning loose any horse or cattle upon any public street, or allowing any animal or animals to wander on any public street or thoroughfare within the Town of Winton.

22. Neglecting to keep in good repair any rail, fence, or gate over and above any area or entrance to any cellar or other place, or keeping open for more than a reasonable time for taking out or in any articles any entrance to any area, cellar, or other place, such area or entrance opening into or upon any public street or place.

23. Leaving any horses or cattle in any streets without providing for their control.

24. Turning loose any horses, cattle, pigs, or other animal or animals on any street or thoroughfare, or allowing any animal or animals to wander on any public street or on any land not divided from streets by a sufficient fence within the Borough of Winton; and if any animals found so wandering shall be impounded by the Council or their officer, and if any penalty as aforesaid, together with all costs, fees, and other expenses, be not paid within seven days after same has been inflicted, the Council may cause the said animals to be sold, and the money accruing from the sale, after deducting the said penalty, and costs, fees and expenses of seizure, keeping and selling the said animals, shall be paid, if demanded, to the owner of such animals, and until so demanded the said moneys shall be paid into the borough fund; and if the moneys so recovered are not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, then the amount whereby the same fall short, or if no such sale shall be ordered the whole of such penalty, costs, and expenses, may be recovered in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by Justices are by law to be recovered.

25. Placing any water-closet, privy, or cesspool in a position that shall be deemed a nuisance or offence to the neighbourhood.

26. Having on any premises or under the control of the owner of any premises an excavation for the reception of excrementitious matter.

27. Having any closet unprovided with a well-constructed iron pan or other approved moving receptacle for excrementitious matter, or having the same sunk below the surface of the ground.

28. Neglecting to clean out or provide for the cleaning-out of any closet.

29. Allowing any manure-heap to accumulate until it becomes a nuisance.

30. Throwing any filth, dust, rubbish or other offensive matter of whatever kind, or any dead animal, into any creek, drain, dam, or watercourse in the said borough.

31. Erecting or causing to be erected any portico or verandah over any public footpath without the consent and approval of the Council.

32. Emptying any privy, or loading, carrying, removing, or depositing any nightsoil, offal, filth, rubbish, or offensive matter within the borough, except between the hours of 11 o'clock p.m. and 6 a.m.

Carts and Carters.

33. No cart, dray, express, or other wagon shall be kept for use in the said borough to ply for hire unless the same shall have been duly licensed as hereinafter mentioned, and

any person using in the said borough, to ply for hire, any unlicensed cart, dray, or wagon shall, on conviction, forfeit, for every day he shall so use such cart, dray, or wagon as aforesaid, a sum not exceeding £2.

34. Licenses for drays, carts, or wagons may be granted by the Town Clerk or such other officer as the Council may appoint in that behalf.

35. For every such license there shall be paid to the Council granting the same, for a two-wheeled cart, the sum of £1, and for a four-wheeled wagon the sum of £1 10s. All licenses shall terminate on the 31st day of March in each year.

36. The owner of any licensed cart or wagon shall paint upon a conspicuous part of the off side thereof his name and the word "Licensed" and the number of the license in white letters at least one inch in length on a black ground.

37. The rates or fares to be paid for licensed carts plying for hire or night-carts shall be as per scale made from time to time by the Council.

Public Hall and Places of Entertainment: Licenses.

38. Any person or persons who shall use, or suffer or permit to be used, any building or part of a building for a theatre or music-hall, or for any other public performance or amusement, without being duly licensed, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay the sum of £2.

39. The following fees shall be paid for each license to use any building or part of a building for a theatre, a music-hall, or for any other public performance or amusement, save and except for such circus as hereinafter mentioned: License for one year shall be £1, and the fees for a license to hold any circus for the exhibition of horsemanship, wild or other animals, or for acrobatic performances shall be as follows, for one day 5s., and for one week the sum of £1.

Chimney Fires.

If any chimney catch fire, or be on fire, the person occupying or using the premises on which such chimney is situated shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding £2.

Wandering Goats, Dogs, &c.

41. Any goat, swine, or unregistered dog found in any street, or on any land having no dividing fence from the street, without any person having charge of such goat, swine, or unregistered dog, may, by warrant under the hand of the Mayor or Town Clerk, addressed to the Inspector of Nuisances, be sold or destroyed, and such goat, swine, or unregistered dog shall be sold or destroyed accordingly. The proceeds of such sale to be paid into the borough fund account.

42. The owner of any pigeons allowing such pigeons to settle on roofs of houses other than the property of the owner of such pigeons shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £2.
