Altering Boundaries of Resident Magistrates' Districts of Auckland and Kaipara.

WM. F. DRUMMOND JERVOIS, (L.s.) Governor.

#### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, by Proclamation in the New Zealand Gazette, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts to be called Resident Magistrates' districts, and such districts from time to time to abolish, and the boundaries to define and alter, and in any such Proclamation to fix a time on and from which any such district shall be constituted or abolished, as the case may be:

And whereas by Proclamation boories detailed.

And whereas by Proclamations bearing date the eleventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and the twentieth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in him, did define the boundaries of the Resident Magistrates' Districts of Kaipara and Auckland, as described in the said Proclamations respectively:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said districts so defined as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so vested in me as aforesaid, do hereby alter the boundaries of the said Districts of Kaipara and Auckland respectively, and define them as

of Kaipara and Auckland respectively, and define them as described in the Schedule hereto, as and from the first day of July next.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### AUCKLAND.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Auckland bounded towards the North-west generally by the Taupaki Block from the ocean to the north-western corner of Section No. 1, Parish of Waipareira, Waitemata Survey District; thence towards the North by the northern boundary-line of that section to Brigham's Creek; thence towards the West by the left bank of that creek to its confluence with the Waitemath River; thence towards the South-west generally by the right banks of that river and the Rangitopuni River to the Waitate Stream; thence by that stream to the easternmost corner of Section No. 55, Parish of Paremoremo; thence by a right

line to the easternmost corner of Section No. 53 of the said line to the easternmost corner of Section No. 53 of the said parish; thence by that section to the Ararimu River; thence by that river to the south-western boundary-line of Section No. 41 of the last-mentioned parish; thence by that boundary-line to the westernmost corner of Section No. 41 aforesaid; thence by a right line to the south-western corner of Section No. 60, Parish of Ararimu, Waitemata Survey District; thence by the western boundary-line of that section to the southern boundary-line of Section No. 59 of the last-mentioned parish; thence again towards the North by that Section to its easternmost corner; thence again towards the tioned parish; thence again towards the North by that Section to its easternmost corner; thence again towards the West by a road forming the eastern boundary of Section No. 59 to the southernmost corner of Section No. 57; thence again towards the North-west by Sections Nos. 57 and 56 to the easternmost corner of the said Section No. 56; thence by a right line to the south-western corner of Section No. 35, Parish of Pukeatua; thence again towards the North by Sections No. 35 aforesaid and 36 of the same parish; thence again towards the West by Sections Nos. 36 and 38; thence towards the South-west by Sections Nos. 38 aforesaid and 30, 31, 32, 33, and 34 of the Parish of Pukeatua aforesaid to the Waipuakakahu Stream; thence again towards the Northwest generally by that stream to the southern boundary-line of Section No. 306; thence again towards the North and West by that section to its north-eastern corner; thence west generally by that stream to the southern boundary-line of Section No. 306; thence again towards the North and West by that section to its north-eastern corner; thence towards the South-west by the Waipapakauri Stream and the Kaukapakapa River to the eastern boundary-line of Section No. 64, Parish of Kaukapakapa; thence towards the West generally by the said Section No. 64 and Sections Nos. 62, 59, 56, and 51 of the said Parish of Kaukapakapa, across a road, and by Section No. 26 to its north-eastern corner; thence again towards the North by the road forming the northern boundary of Section No. 27; thence again towards the West by the said Section No. 27; thence again towards the North by Section No. 28; thence again towards the North-west and West by the Parishes of Kaukapakapa and Makarau respectively; again towards the North by the latter parish and the County of Rodney to the ocean; thence towards the East by the Hauraki Gulf, the Waitemata Harbour, the Tamaki River, and Tamaki Strait to the mouth of the Wairoa River; thence towards the South generally by the Road Districts of Wairoa, Papakura, and Manurewa respectively, as the same are described in the New Zealand Gazette No. 42, of the 18th May, 1883, to Manukau Harbour, and thence by that harbour; and again towards the Southwest by the ocean to the place of commencement: including the islands of Motutapu, Rangitoto, Waiheke, Ponui, Great Barrier, Little Barrier, and other adjacent islands.

In exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by "The Public Domains Act, 1881," His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke a certain Order in Council, dated the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, making delegation of certain powers in manner as therein appears; and doth, with the like advice and consent, by this present order, delegate, but only with respect to the pieces or parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto, all the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, except the powers under or conferred by sections five and twelve thereof, to the under-mentioned persons, who shall be known as the Kaiapoi Public Domain Board, namely,—

(herein referred to as "the Board"), subject to the stipula-tions hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on

the first Monday in each month, at seven o'clock p.m., at the office of the Chairman, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first

meeting shall be held on Monday, the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or by any two members of the Board, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting. at such meeting.

3. Any three of the said Board shall form a quorum. Any

meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

6. If, by resignation, death, or incapacity, or otherwise, the office of Chairman shall be or become vacant, the members may at any monthly or special meeting appoint a Chairman.

7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

(1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of \(\frac{1}{2}\)d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively \(\frac{1}{2}\)d. and \(\frac{1}{2}\)d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.
