2. The newly-discovered goldfield, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold workings are if in a restance to the condition.

must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required. will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reported.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the
approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively \(\frac{1}{2}\)d. and \(\frac{1}{2}\)d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons

tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

The total births in the above boroughs amounted to 514 against 435 in April, an increase of 79. The deaths in May were 156, a decrease of 4 on the number for April. Of the above deaths, males contributed 87; females, 69. Fifty-three of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 33.97 per cent. of the whole number; 37 of these were of children under 1 year of age.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—
The births in May were 291 against 255 in April, an increase of 36. The deaths in May were 106 against 110 in April, a decrease of 4.

There were 7 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards. Two males of 75 and 69, and a female of 77, died at Auck-

There were 7 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards. Two males of 75 and 69, and a female of 77, died at Auckland; 2 males of 67, and 1 female of 70, at Wellington; and 1 male of 80 at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The mortality from these diseases was the same as in the previous month of April. Typhoid fever was more fatal in May, the deaths having numbered 6 against 4 in the previous month, but there was, in accordance with expectation, a large decrease in deaths from diarrheal diseases, the number having fallen from 15 in April to 7 in May.

Constitutional Diseases.—There was a decrease in the mortality from these diseases on that of April, owing to the much smaller number of deaths from phthisis, which only amounted to 4 in May against 13 in April. Cancer, however, caused the comparatively large number of 7 deaths for the month against 3 in April.

Local Diseases.—These diseases caused slightly more deaths in May than in April. Of these, although the numbers of deaths from diseases of the nervous and circulatory systems were nearly the same in the two months, there was in May a marked increase in the deaths from diseases of the respiratory system, these having amounted to 14 in May against 9 in April.

*Violent Deaths.*—The deaths attributed to accident or violence numbered 7, of which 3 were from drowning, and 1 was

violent Deaths.—The deaths attributed to accruent of violence humbered 7, of which 5 were from drowning, and 1 was suicidal. The deaths in this class numbered 4 in April.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with contents and climatic influence of the season on health. connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.
