Assistance rendered by the Colonies in storing Coal, &c., during the War Preparations in 1885.

SIR,—Be so good as to convey to their Lordships my desire to name to them the consideration with which my repre-

to name to them the consideration with which my representations were received by the several colonies during the preparations made in case of war in 1885.

2. Owing to circumstances which had special weight within these colonies, which were referred to in my letter dated 12th June, 1885, No. 314, I was obliged to lay in a certain amount of coal at different ports. The stock deposited was not very large, but it established a system, and the amount could easily have been increased.

3. At Adelaide the supervision and charge of coal was undertaken by the colony.

4. At Hobart a hulk was provided free of cost, and many

undertaken by the colony.

4. At Hobart a hulk was provided free of cost, and many incidental expenses were borne by the colony.

5. At Sydney hulks for 3,000 tons, with caretakers, free of cost, were placed at my disposal.

6. At Brisbane a pier and a good closed shed for the storage of coal were erected at a very considerable cost, free of all charge to the Admiralty, and a hulk was also purchased by the colony, and filled with Imperial coal.

7. New Zealand gave railway-carriage, storage, and incidental charges freely, for the national purpose of facilitating the action of our ships of war.

8. I do not doubt but what the other colonies would have done the same, but I had not to ask them; and in this matter, though I had some preliminary correspondence with Victoria, it was unnecessary to send coal to any port in that colony.

9. Should their Lordships think fit to express their acknowledgments of the service so freely rendered by the respective Governments and their employés, it cannot fail to be appreciated.

Coal kept in Stock at Out-ports.

"Nelson," at Sydney, 12th June, 1885.

Sir,—Be pleased to inform their Lordships, owing to the fact that no stock of coal is kept in Australian ports, save in quite the outlying ones, it became necessary for me to consider the question, and to make arrangements that my squadron should be able to rely on a supply at certain ports.

2. It is the practice to order coal by telegram as wanted from the coal-ports. This saves the cost of handling, insomuch as it is transferred direct from the steam-colliers to the vessel requiring it, instead of its being first transferred to a hulk or store, and then to the ship; and to such an extent is this, that even for the supply of the "Nelson," when at Melbourne, when it was uncertain how soon she might have to go to sea, I had to make special arrangements; and even at Sydney there is no stock of coal.

3. It is not so easy to introduce a new system, and it could not be put off till the last moment. must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required. will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which

such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

(2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of \(\frac{1}{2} \)d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;

(3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively \(\frac{1}{2} \)d. and \(\frac{1}{2} \)d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

The deaths of persons not residents of the boroughs, occurring at hospitals, have been excluded in all cases.

Statistics for the Borough of Blenheim are now published for the first time.

The total births in the above boroughs (excluding Blenheim) amounted to 480 against 514 in May, a decrease of 34.

The deaths in June (excluding Blenheim) were 158, an increase of 2 on the number for May. Of the total deaths (162), males contributed 89; females, 73. Fifty-four of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, being 33 33 per cent. of the whole number; 39 of these were under 1 year of age.

There were 16 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 2 males of 80 and 71, and 2 females of 76 and 73, died at Auckland; 2 males of 83 and 66, and 4 females of 74, 70, and 67 (two), at Wellington; 1 male of 66 at Christchurch; and 2 males of 74 and 71, and 3 females of 75, 72, and 65, at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The deaths from these causes were 9 in June against 10 in May. There was in June an entire absence of deaths from diarrhoad diseases, but diphtheria caused 3 deaths in Wellington, and measles caused 2 deaths in Christchurch and 1 in Wellington.

The extent to which the deaths in this class are affected by climatic influences is shown by the following comparison: In the three hottest months of this year, January, February, and March, the deaths from these diseases were respectively 44, 49, and 63; in June they were 9. Of these, the deaths attributable to diarrhoad diseases were respectively 37, 40, 46, and for June 0.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases caused 13 deaths in June against 17 in May. Phthisis heads the list with 9 of these deaths.

Constitutional Diseases.—These diseases caused 13 deaths in June against 17 in May. Fittings heads the list with 5 of these deaths.

Local Diseases.—There was a slight increase in the number of deaths from these causes. Diseases of the nervous system were considerably more fatal, having caused 17 deaths in June against 11 in May. Diseases of the heart caused 6 deaths, and diseases of the respiratory system 15 deaths, an increase of 1 on the number in the previous month. In the hotter months of January, February, and March the deaths from diseases of the respiratory system were 8, 6, and 7; in May and June, 14 and 15. The mortality from these diseases in 1885 was greatest in the months of August and September, when the deaths for the respective months were 20 and 22.

Violent Deaths, Of the 5 deaths in this class, 2 were caused by accidents from plasting, and 1 was suicidal.

Violent Deaths.—Of the 5 deaths in this class, 2 were caused by accidents from blasting, and 1 was suicidal.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs.
