WHEREAS by the one hundred and fourth section of "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, may from time to time set apart out of any suburban or rural lands such blocks or allotments of land as he shall think fit, and set the same aside for sale on deferred payments, and in such Proclamation may fix a day on which the land shall be open for application; and that he may also in like manner set apart for sale on deferred payments such blocks or allotments as may be recommended by any Land Board, and may also from time to time alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation:

Town District of Arowhenua, County of Geraldine, constituted.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Town Districts Act, 1881" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the inhabitants of any locality not constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1876," wherein there are not less than fifty householders, may apply by petition to the Governor praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act; and that no such locality shall exceed two square miles in area, and no one point in such area shall be distant more than four miles from any other point therein, except in the case of military townships; and that in every such locality not less than two-thirds of the number of the resident householders shall concur in any such petition, and each signature to such petition shall be verified by the attestation of some respectable witness; and that such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the locality to which such petition may refer; and also that, on the receipt of any such petition, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within such locality, and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, further, that such Proclamation shall accurately define the boundaries of the district in accordance with the description contained in the petition, and shall declare the name by which such district shall thereafter be known:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor, by the inhabitants of the locality mentioned and described therein, praying that such locality may be constituted a town district under the said Act:

And whereas not less than two-thirds of the number of resident householders in the said locality have concurred in the said petition, and it is expedient that a Proclamation should be issued under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the hereinbefore in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Act shall come into force within the locality or district mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto (the same being the locality mentioned and set forth in the said petition so presented as aforesaid), and that the same shall be a town district under the said Act; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that the said district shall hereafter be known by the name of the Arowhenua Town District, and I do appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five in number.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is required to be taken, under "The Public Works Act, 1882," for a certain work, to wit, the construction of harbour works in the Turanganui Survey District, Gisborne:

And whereas the Gisborne Harbour Board has laid before the Governor the memorial, accompanied by a map, and also the statutory declaration, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jerovis, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities in me vested by section eleven of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purpose of constructing harbour works; and that, from and after the day of the date hereof, the land so mentioned shall become absolutely vested in fee-simple in the Gisborne Harbour Board, discharged from all mortgages, charges, claims, estates, or interests of what kind soever.

THE ROYAL HUMANE SOCIETY OF AUSTRALASIA.—LIST OF AWARDS GRANTED TO RESIDENTS IN THE COLONY OF NEW ZEALAND, 1885 AND 1886.

JOHN JACKSON, aged nineteen years, saved the life of John Calderwood, aged thirty-five years, on the 18th July, 1885, at George Street Pier, Port Chalmers, by jumping into the water, 18ft. deep, swimming out to Calderwood, who was struggling in the water unable to swim, supported him in the water until assistance arrived. Weather and water icy cold. Awarded a bronze medal.

ALFRED GEORGE MABIN, aged nineteen years, saved the life of William Ford, on the 17th April, 1885, at the Queen Street Wharf, Auckland, by jumping into the water, 18ft. to 20ft. deep, finding Ford, and placing a rope around him, by which he was hauled alongside a schooner and rescued. Awarded a bronze medal.

GEORGE BERTRAM BOWSER, aged eight years, saved the life of Charles Shaw, aged three years, at the Waipoua River, Masterton, on the 8th July, 1885. Shaw fell into the river, which was in flood, and was rapidly being carried down by the current. Bowser, who can swim well, went into the river a little ahead of the child and brought it ashore. Other bigger boys saw the accident and were afraid to attempt the rescue. Awarded a bronze medal.

WILLIAM HENRY RYAN, aged thirty-three years, a police constable, saved the life of William S. Pardy, at the ford crossing the River Waitoteroa, between Parihaka and Pungarehu, on the 19th June, 1885. The river was in a state of flood. Pardy was clinging to a rock in the river, having been thrown from his horse. Ryan plunged in to his assistance and was carried away by the force of the current, and was only saved himself by catching hold of a bough of a tree to which he clung, and by the assistance of which he rescued Pardy as he floated past with the flood. Awarded a silver medal.

JAMES GILBERT CHRISTIE, aged thirty-six years, a police constable, saved the life of James Connell, at Auckland, on the 18th October, 1885, by jumping overboard at midnight from the breakwater, diving and bringing Connell to the surface and back to the breakwater, where he supported him until both were rescued. Awarded a bronze medal.

WILLIAM BRUCE, aged twenty-seven years, saved the life of Sarah Hall, aged fourteen years, at the breakwater at the North Head, Wanganui River, by going into the water and rescuing Sarah Hall from drowning. Awarded a certificate of merit.

KENNETH VINCENT HUME, aged seventeen years, saved the life of Frederick Sibun, aged twenty years, by jumping off the Customhouse Quay, at Wellington, on the 29th November, 1885, with his clothes on, and after a severe struggle with Sibun, who, it was said, was attempting to commit suicide, held him and brought him to the steps and supported him until he was pulled out of the water. Awarded a bronze medal.

FRANCIS WILLIAM TRIGGS, aged twenty-five years, rescued E. F. Campbell, aged twenty-four years, from drowning in Wellington Harbour, on the 20th December, 1885. A boat belonging to the Wellington Rowing Club was upset and sank. All the crew except Campbell, who could not swim, reached a place of safety. Campbell sank. Triggs saw the situation, jumped in, dived, and succeeded in rescuing and supporting him until assistance arrived. Awarded a certificate of merit.

JAMES RUSSELL FORREST, aged thirteen years, attempted to rescue Henry Kerr, aged twelve years, from drowning in the River Waimakariri, near Kaiapoi, on the 17th February, 1886. Some boys were bathing. Forrest observed Kerr in distress, and swam back and requested him to put his hand on his back, and he began to swim to the bank. Kerr became nervous, grasped Forrest round the neck, and both sank. Kerr was drowned. Awarded a certificate of merit.

ALFRED BEVINS, aged twenty-seven years, now second officer of the s.s. "Iona," rescued Mrs. Boyd and infant from

drowning in the Whangarei River, off Limestone Island, on the 21st February, 1885. Mrs. Boyd and infant had been knocked overboard. Bevins and another got into a boat, and when 60yds. away, owing to the boat leaking, jumped overboard, and got a life-buoy, which he placed under Mrs. Boyd's arm, and supported her until rescued. Awarded a certificate of merit.

Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.

Treasury Department,

IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

- (1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (3.) In respect of cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ½d. and ¼d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

The Gilchrist Scholarship.

A SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University January Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand,

who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

If any candidates offer themselves, the January examination for New Zealand will be held some time in the month of January, 1887, or as soon after as the examination papers arrive in the colony, and at such place or places as may be hereafter fixed, having regard to the candidates' places of abode.

Candidates will not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subject, according to the details specified under the several heads:—

1. Latin:
2. Any two of the following languages: (a) Greek, (b) French, and (c) German:
3. The English language, English history, and modern geography:
4. Mathematics:
5. Natural philosophy:
6. Chemistry.

Particulars of the foregoing subjects of examination will be found in the Calendar of the University of London, under the head of "Regulations—Matriculation." The special Latin and Greek subjects for January, 1887, are *Cicero, De Senectute* and *Pro Lege Manilia*; and *Homer, Iliad, Book XVI.*

The scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1887, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1887, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first examination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

Every candidate will be required to give satisfactory evidence that he is between the ages of sixteen and twenty-two years, and either that he is a native of New Zealand, or that he has resided in New Zealand for the last five years.
