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Districts constituted under "The Marriage Act, 1880."

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Norsewood, Porangahau, and Danevirk Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

NORSEWOOD DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay bounded towards the North by a line due east from the summit of the Ruahine Range to the source of the Manawatu River; thence towards the North-east by that river to its confluence with the Kahututae-Atua Stream; thence towards the South-west and towards the South-east generally by the Ormondville Road District, as described by a special order in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 128, 7th December, 1883; again towards the South-west by the Danevirk Road District, as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 42, 18th May, 1883; and towards the North-west by the summit of the Ruahine Range.

ORMONDVILLE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay bounded towards the North-east by the Manawatu River from its confluence with the Kahututae-Atua Stream to a point due west of the source of the Ngahape Stream; thence towards the North by a right line to that source; thence towards the South-east by the County of Patangata; towards the South and South-west by the Danevirk Road District, as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 42, 18th May, 1883; and towards the North-west by the Norsewood District hereinbefore described.

PORANGAHAU DISTRICT.

All that area in the County of Patangata bounded towards the North-east by the Hapuka line, from the Ngahape Stream to the sea at Blackhead; thence towards the South-east by the sea to the northern boundary-line of the Tautane Block; thence towards the South-west by the said Tautane Block to its northernmost corner; and thence towards the North-west and South-west generally by the County of Waipawa.

DANEVIRK DISTRICT.

All that area in the County of Waipawa bounded towards the North-west by the summit of the Ruahine Range to a point due west (magnetic) of the intersection of the south-

western boundary-line of Section No. 2, Whakaruatapu, Norsewood Survey District, with the Whakaruatapu Stream; thence towards the North-east generally by a right line to the said intersection; thence by the said Section No. 2 and Section No. 1 to the south-eastern corner of the latter; thence by a line due east (magnetic) to the Mangatawainui River, by that river and the Manawatu River to the Tare-reangarehu Stream; and thence by that stream and the Mangapuaka Stream to the Wangai Stream; thence by the County of Patangata; towards the South-east by the said County of Patangata to Oporae (Trig. Station No. 51); thence towards the South-west and West generally by the south-western and western boundary-lines of the Mangatoro Block; thence by the southern boundary-line of the Kaitoki Block to the Otope Stream; thence towards the South generally by that stream to the south-eastern boundary-line of the Otawhao Block; thence by that boundary-line to the Otawhao Stream; thence by that stream to the southern boundary-line of the Otawhao Block aforesaid; thence by that boundary-line to the Manawatu River; thence across and by that river to the southern boundary-line of the Oringi-Waiaruhe Block; thence again towards the West and South-west by the southern, western, and south-western boundary-lines of that block to the south-eastern corner of the Maharahara Block; thence by the south-western boundary-line of that block to the summit of the Ruahine Range aforesaid.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Registration of Births

and Deaths Act, 1875," I, William Francis Drummond Jeroois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Norsewood, Porangahau, and Danevirk Districts; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Norsewood, Ormondville, Porangahau, and Danevirk Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1880."

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

Defining the Middle Line of Further Portion of the Line of Railway from Waikato to the Thames (Te Aroha Station Section).

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the line of railway from Waikato to the Thames, being a line from a junction with the line from Kaukapakapa to Te Awamutu, at a point near Hamilton, to Grahamstown, passing by Hamilton, Te Aroha, and Ohinemuri (Te Aroha Station Section), is one of the railways specified in the First Schedule to "The Public Works Act, 1879," and which Act is, in the seventh section thereof, declared to be a special Act authorizing the construction of such railway; and such railway is unfinished, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of the same:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the aforesaid section seven of "The Public Works Act, 1879," and by sections one hundred and twenty-nine and one hundred and thirty of "The Public Works Act, 1882," and in exercise of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Abolishing the Christchurch District Court District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that there shall be within the colony Courts of Record possessing civil and criminal jurisdiction, to be called District Courts; and the Governor is empowered from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the colony, or in any part thereof, districts within which such Courts shall be respectively held, and such districts to abolish, and the boundaries thereof to define and alter: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the twentieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities for that purpose vested in him, did constitute and define the district in and by the said Proclamation described and referred to, and named therein the Christchurch District: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, the boundaries of the said Christchurch District were altered: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said district:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervis, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that

THE CHRISTCHURCH DISTRICT,

under "The District Courts Act, 1858," as the same is described or referred to in the said Proclamations of the eighteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, shall be and remain abolished from and after the first day of October next.

WHEREAS by "The Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883" (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that, where the foreshore has been legally vested in any Harbour Board or other local governing body, it may from time to time, subject to the provisions of the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," license and permit any part of the foreshore to be used or occupied, *inter alia*, for the erection and use of any landing-place or wharf: And whereas by the said Act it is also provided that every licensee shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have power to make and construct any necessary reclamation for the purpose of erecting on the foreshore comprised in his license, or upon any land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore which shall be specified in such license, any building, structure, erection, or other works to enable him to obtain the full benefit of such license: And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that every such license shall be in writing under the seal of the Board or body granting the same, and may be for any period not exceeding fourteen years from the date thereof, and may prescribe a sum of money to be payable either at stated periods or on or before the granting thereof for the use of the foreshore so granted, and may prescribe any other terms or conditions, general or particular, to be observed or performed by the person to whom the same is granted: And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted that, in any case where there is no Harbour Board, or no Harbour Board empowered to grant any such license as aforesaid, the Governor in Council may in his discretion grant and issue a license for all or any of the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, and all the provisions of the said Act in respect of such licenses shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply accordingly: And whereas the Waimea County Council (hereinafter called "the Council") has applied for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore in Motueka Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf; and, in accordance with the one hundred and fifty-sixth section of "The Harbours Act, 1878," has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department, at Wellington (marked M.D. 1215, 1216, 1217, 1218, 1219, and 1220), showing the manner in which it is proposed to construct

such wharf, the place in the said harbour where it is intended to erect the same, and the area of foreshore or land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas there is no Harbour Board having jurisdiction in the said harbour, and it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the Council under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the Council as aforesaid; and in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say,—

1. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of such wharf, which are shown on the plan marked M.D. 1219.

2. That all Her Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the wharf, and of ingress and egress thereon.

3. That Her Majesty, or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service, acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

4. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

5. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repairs thereof; and that, upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

6. That nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or with any provisions of "The Harbours Act, 1878," or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. That the ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by a person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

8. That the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. That the said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council.

10. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

11. In case the Council shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf;

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication

in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Conservation Act, 1884" (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, which said regulations shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, certain regulations were made in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, prescribing a close season for rock-oysters:

And whereas it is now expedient to extend such close season in respect of the part of the colony hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth:—

REGULATIONS.

The close season for rock-oysters prescribed by the regulations made under the said Act by Order in Council bearing date the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, is hereby declared to commence from the date hereof, and is also extended, as also the operation of the said recited regulations, until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, in respect of the foreshore of the coast and adjacent reefs from the north side of the mouth of the Turanganui River, Poverty Bay, to Wainui North, including Tūa Motu Island.

Any person committing a breach of the above regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one pound and not exceeding fifty pounds.

By His Excellency Sir Frederick Napier Broome, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c.

WHEREAS under the provisions of an Act of the Legislative Council, passed in the forty-third year of the reign of Her present Majesty, numbered twenty-three, intituled "An Act for the Prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock," the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is empowered, by Proclamation, to prohibit the introduction into the colony, either by land or sea, of any cattle within the meaning of the said Act and of "The Cattle Diseases Ordinance, 1865," and "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," or either of them:

Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, in exercise of such power and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do, by this Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, prohibit the importation into and landing in Western Australia, either by land or sea, from Great Britain or Ireland, or from any other place beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies, of all horned cattle, sheep, and swine.

AMENDED CONDITIONS.

1. THE maximum sum offered as a reward for any proved discovery of a new goldfield in accordance with these conditions is £500; but, if the total sum claimed as rewards in any one year exceeds the parliamentary vote, the amount available only will be divided equally.

2. The newly-discovered goldfield, if in alluvial ground, must be situated not less than ten miles from the nearest alluvial gold-workings, or, if in quartz, not less than five miles from the nearest existing quartz-mines.

3. No grant will be paid upon any application until it shall have been proved that not less than 20,000 ounces of gold have been extracted from the new goldfield within two years from the registration of the discovery, if in alluvial workings, and, if in quartz-workings, proof of a similar yield from this source within three years from such registration will be required.

4. Any person discovering new gold-workings, and being desirous of obtaining a reward, shall immediately forward a written report of such discovery, with full particulars, to the

Warden or Resident Magistrate of the district within which such discovery shall be situated, and the Warden or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith register the report as an application for reward.

5. No prospecting is allowed upon Native land without the approval in writing of the Native Minister, or of some one appointed by him in that behalf.

Prospectors going upon Native land without the consent of the owners are liable to the penalties imposed by the Acts relating to goldfields, and will forfeit all claim to reward.

Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.

Treasury Department,
Wellington, 10th November, 1885.

IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

- (1) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (2) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ¾d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (3) In respect of cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ¼d. and ¾d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exportation, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £4,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 8th February, 1887, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 31st January, 1887.

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club, whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

A nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of each library's receipts, and the vote of £4,000 will be divided in proportion to the amounts as thus augmented, but so as that no institution shall receive more than £50.

Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1886; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

ASCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and tenable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University January Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand, who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

The scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1887, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1887, at which time he will be expected to present himself to

the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust in London.
