A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Marriage Act, 1880," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Hyde, Hamilton's, Palmerston, Waikouaiti, and West Taieri Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into six marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow:—

HYDE DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North generally by the Taieri River, from the confluence of the Kyeburn with that river to the confluence of the Horseburn with the said Taieri River; thence towards the North-west by the County of Maniototo; towards the North-east by the summit of the Kakanui Mountains to a point opposite to the source of Happy Valley Creek; thence towards the South-east generally by that creek to the Waihemo or Shag River; thence towards the South by that river to its confluence with Deepdell Creek, and by that creek to the north-west corner of Block VI., Waihemo Survey District; thence again towards the North-east by the said Block VI. and Blocks III. and IV., Dunback Survey District; again towards the South-east by the last-mentioned block and Blocks VII. and VIII., Dunback Survey District; towards the East by Block IX., Dunback Survey District, as far as the north branch of the Waikouaiti River; towards the South generally by the Counties of Waikouaiti and Taieri respectively; and towards the West by the Puketoi Riding of the County of Maniototo to the Taieri River; and thence to the place of commencement.

HAMILTON'S DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the South-east by the Hyde District, hereinbefore described, and the Taieri County, from the Taieri River to Lammerlaw Stream; towards the West generally by the Counties of Tuapeka and Vincent to the source of the Gimmerburn; thence towards the North by the Gimmerburn and the Taieri River to the confluence of the Kyeburn therewith.

NASEBY DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North and North-east by the County of Waitaki; towards the South-east by the County of Waihemo; towards the South by the Hyde and Hamilton's Registration Districts, hereinbefore described; and towards the North-west by the County of Vincent and the Idaburn Riding of the County of Maniototo.

PALMERSTON DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North-east by the Otepopo and Hampden Registration Districts; towards the South-east by the ocean; towards the South-west by Pleasant River from its outlet to a point due east of Mount Pleasant; thence towards the South by a straight line running due west to the north branch of the Waikouaiti River; and thence towards the West generally by the Waikouaiti River and the Hyde Registration District, hereinbefore described.

WAIKOUAITI DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North generally by the Registration Districts of Hyde and Palmerston, hereinbefore described; towards the East by the ocean to Brinn's Point; thence towards the South by the Blueskin Registration District; and towards the South-west by the Taieri County.

WEST TAIERI DISTRICT.

Comprises all that area bounded towards the North-west and North-east generally by the Hamilton's, Hyde, and Waikouaiti Registration Districts, hereinbefore described, from Lammerlaw to the Silverpeak Hills; thence by the said hills to a point due east of the source of Allen Creek; thence towards the South by a line to, and thence by, the said Allen Creek to the Taieri River; thence towards the South-east by that river and the south-eastern shore of Waihola Lake; thence generally towards the North-west by the western shores of Lakes Waihola and Waipori to the Waipori River; thence towards the South-west by that river to the north-western boundary-line of the West Taieri Hundred; thence again towards the South-east by that boundary-line to a point south-east (true) of Waitahuna Hill; thence again towards the South-west by a straight line to the said hill; thence towards the North-west and South-west generally by a right line to Trig. G, Block VIII., Waipori Survey District; thence by Section No. 5 of the said block to the Waipori River; thence by that river to the Verterburn; thence by the Verterburn to Block VI. of the said survey district; thence by that block and a road forming the northern boundary of Section No. 4 of the said Block VI., and forming the northern boundaries of Sections Nos. 8 and 4, Block V., and forming the north-eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 5, 4, and 3, Block II., of the said survey district, and following up the leading ridge to the summit of the watershed between the Waipori River and Lee's Stream; and thence by the summit of the leading ridge to Lammerlaw.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by "The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1875," I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Hyde, Hamilton's, Palmerston, Waikouaiti, and West Taieri Districts; and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into six registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Hyde, Hamilton's, Naseby, Palmerston, Waikouaiti, and West Taieri Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of "The Marriage Act, 1880."

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by "The New Zealand State Forests Act, 1885," and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, William Francis Drummond Jervois, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby set apart the forest lands described in the Schedule hereto, forming part of the Crown lands in New Zealand, as and for State forests within the provisions of the said Act.

WHEREAS by "The Land Act, 1885," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under regulations to be made in that behalf, notwithstanding anything contained in any Act relating to mining, from time to time to grant to any occupant of land under business license or miner's right in the Townships of Ross, Dillmanstown, Kanieri, and Bluespur, in the County of Westland, who has improved such land to the satisfaction of the Warden of the district, a lease, for any term not exceeding twenty-one years, of the surface of such land, at such rates of payment for rent, and under such restrictions as to the use thereof, as he may think necessary; and such lease shall entitle the holder thereof to all the rights and privileges now enjoyed by holders of business licenses issued under any Act relating to mining:

And whereas it is expedient for the purposes aforesaid that the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto should be made in substitution of regulations made under "The Land Act, 1877," and "The Land Act 1877 Amendment Act, 1879," upon the conditions therein set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, and in exercise and pursuance of all power and authority in that behalf enabling him, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

1. Any holder of a miner's right or business license who lawfully occupies for purposes of residence, business, cultivation, or any use or purpose other than mining, any land in the localities hereinbefore referred to, and who has substantially improved the same, may apply for a lease of the land so occupied by him.

2. Every application for a lease shall be made in writing to the Warden of the district, and shall contain a statement of the situation and area of the land applied for, the number of the section if the land is a surveyed section, the tenure upon which the land is held, and what improvements have been made thereon.

3. If the land applied for is not a surveyed section, the application shall be accompanied by a deposit of £3 to cover the expenses of surveying the same; and, after the application has been finally dealt with, there shall be refunded to the applicant any unexpended or unrequired balance remaining of the said deposit.

4. A notification of every application shall be advertised by the applicant not less than twice in such newspaper circulating in the district as the Warden shall direct, and the Warden shall appoint a day for hearing the said application, such day to be not less than one month after the first publication of the aforesaid advertisement.

5. After the hearing of the application, the Warden shall advise the Commissioner of Crown Lands of his opinion thereon.

6. No lease shall be granted over land upon which any mining operations are carried on, or over or to which any mining right or title exists, unless or until the holder of such mining right or title consent to such lease.

7. Every lease shall be for the surface only of the land, and no lease shall entitle the lessee to mine for gold upon the land leased, or to extract, dig, or search for any metals or minerals therein or thereon.

8. No lessee in the Township of Ross shall have any claim for compensation for any damage which may be caused by or arise from mining operations legitimately carried on beneath the surface of the ground, and leases in other localities shall contain such special covenants relating to mining as may be recommended by the Warden and approved by the Governor in Council in each case.

9. The rental for lands leased under these regulations shall be 10s. per annum.

10. No transfer or assignment of any lease shall be lawful without the consent of the Warden, and every such transfer or assignment shall be registered at the Warden's office, and the sum of 2s. 6d. shall be paid for such registration.

11. Leases may be in the form hereto, and all expenses in connection with the preparation of leases shall be borne and paid by the lessee.

THE DISEASED ANIMALS IMPORTATION PREVENTION ACT.

By His Excellency Sir George Cumine Strahan, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS I, Sir George Cumine Strahan, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, deem it probable that the importation of sheep or the skins or any portion thereof from the Colony of New Zealand may cause disease to be introduced into Tasmania:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Cumine Strahan, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, in Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Diseased Animals Importation Prevention Act (47 Victoria, No. 2), do hereby absolutely prohibit the importation into Tasmania of sheep or the skins or any portion thereof from the said Colony of New Zealand.

“THE MEDICAL ACT, 1886.”

PART II.

Colonial and Foreign Practitioners.

Registration of colonial practitioner with recognized diploma.

11. On and after the prescribed day where a person shows to the satisfaction of the Registrar of the General Council that he holds some recognized colonial medical diploma or diplomas (as hereinafter defined) granted to him in a British possession to which this Act applies, and that he is of good character, and that he is by law entitled to practise medicine, surgery, and midwifery in such British possession, he shall, on application to the said Registrar, and on payment of such fee, not exceeding five pounds, as the General Council may from time to time determine, be entitled, without examination in the United Kingdom, to be registered as a colonial practitioner in the medical register:

Provided that he proves to the satisfaction of the Registrar any of the following circumstances:—

- (1.) That the said diploma or diplomas was or were granted to him at a time when he was not domiciled in the United Kingdom, or in the course of a period of not less than five years during the whole of which he resided out of the United Kingdom; or
- (2.) That he was practising medicine or surgery or a branch of medicine or surgery in the United Kingdom on the said prescribed day, and that he has continuously practised the same either in the United Kingdom or elsewhere for a period of not less than ten years immediately preceding the said prescribed day.

Registration of foreign practitioner with recognized diploma.

12. On and after the said prescribed day where a person shows to the satisfaction of the Registrar of the General

Council that he holds some recognized foreign medical diploma or diplomas (as hereinafter defined) granted in a foreign country to which this Act applies, and that he is of good character, and that he is by law entitled to practise medicine, surgery, and midwifery in such foreign country, he shall, on application to the said Registrar, and on payment of such fee, not exceeding five pounds, as the General Council may from time to time determine, be entitled, without examination in the United Kingdom, to be registered as a foreign practitioner in the medical register:

Provided that he proves to the satisfaction of the Registrar any of the following circumstances:—

- (1.) That he is not a British subject; or
- (2.) That, being a British subject, the said diploma or diplomas was or were granted to him at a time when he was not domiciled in the United Kingdom, or in the course of a period of not less than five years, during the whole of which he resided out of the United Kingdom; or
- (3.) That, being a British subject, he was practising medicine or surgery, or a branch of medicine or surgery, in the United Kingdom on the said prescribed day, and that he has continuously practised the same in the United Kingdom or elsewhere for a period of not less than ten years immediately preceding the said prescribed day.

Medical diploma of colonial and foreign practitioner when deemed to be recognized.

13. (1.) The medical diploma or diplomas granted in a British possession or foreign country to which this Act applies, which is or are to be deemed such recognized colonial or foreign medical diploma or diplomas as is or are required for the purposes of this Act, shall be such medical diploma or diplomas as may be recognized for the time being by the General Council as furnishing a sufficient guarantee of the possession of the requisite knowledge and skill for the efficient practice of medicine, surgery, and midwifery.

(2.) Where the General Council have refused to recognize as aforesaid any colonial or foreign medical diploma, the Privy Council, on application being made to them, may, if they think fit, after considering such application, and after communication with the General Council, order the General Council to recognize the said diploma, and such order shall be duly obeyed.

(3.) If a person is refused registration as a colonial or foreign practitioner on any other ground than that the medical diploma or diplomas held by such person is or are not such recognized medical diploma or diplomas as above defined, the Registrar of the General Council shall, if required, state in writing the reason for such refusal, and the person so refused registration may appeal to the Privy Council, and the Privy Council, after communication with the General Council, may dismiss the appeal, or may order the General Council to enter the name of the appellant on the register.

(4.) A person may, if so entitled under this Act, be registered both as a colonial and a foreign practitioner.

Separate list of colonial and foreign practitioners in medical register.

14. The medical register shall contain a separate list of the names and addresses of the colonial practitioners, and also a separate list of the names and addresses of the foreign practitioners registered under this Act; each list shall be made out alphabetically according to the surnames; and the provisions of “The Medical Act, 1858,” relating to persons registered under that Act, and relating to the medical register and to offences in respect thereof, shall, so far as may be, apply in the case of colonial and foreign practitioners registered under this Act and of the said lists of those practitioners, in the same way as such provisions apply in the case of persons registered under the said “Medical Act, 1858,” and of the register as kept under that Act.

Medical titles of colonial and foreign practitioners.

15. On and after the appointed day it shall be lawful for any registered medical practitioner who, being on the list of colonial or of foreign practitioners, is on that day in possession of or thereafter obtains any recognized colonial or foreign medical diploma granted in a British possession or foreign country to which this Act applies to cause a description of such diploma to be added to his name in the medical register.

Registration of foreign degrees held by registered medical practitioners.

16. On and after the appointed day it shall be lawful for any registered medical practitioner who, being on the medical register by virtue of English, Scotch, or Irish qualifications, is in possession of a foreign degree in medicine to cause a description of such foreign medical degree to be added to his name as an additional title in the medical register: Provided he shall satisfy the General Council that he obtained such degree after proper examination and prior to the passing of this Act.

Power of Her Majesty in Council to define colonies and foreign countries to which this Part of the Act applies.

17. (1.) Her Majesty may from time to time, by Order in Council, declare that this Part of this Act shall be deemed, on and after a day to be named in such order, to apply to any British possession or foreign country which in the opinion of Her Majesty affords to the registered medical practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in the said British possession or foreign country as to Her Majesty may seem just; and from and after the day named in such Order in Council such British possession or foreign country shall be deemed to be a British possession or foreign country to which this Act applies within the meaning of this Part thereof; but, until such Order in Council has been made in respect of any British possession or foreign country, this Part of this Act shall not be deemed to apply to any such possession or country; and the expression "the prescribed day" as used in this Part of this Act means, as respects any British possession or foreign country, the day on and after which this Part of this Act is declared by Order in Council to apply to such British possession or foreign country.

(2.) Her Majesty may from time to time, by Order in Council, revoke and renew any order made in pursuance of this section; and, on the revocation of such order as respects any British possession or foreign country, such possession or foreign country shall cease to be a possession or country to which this Part of this Act applies, without prejudice nevertheless to the right of any persons whose names have been already entered on the register.

Amendment of 21 and 22 Vict., c. 90, s. 36, as to medical officers in ships.

18. Nothing in "The Medical Act, 1858," shall prevent a person holding a medical diploma entitling him to practise medicine or surgery in a British possession to which this Act applies from holding an appointment as a medical officer in any vessel registered in that possession.

PART III.

Dentists.

Provisions as to 41 and 42 Vict., c. 33.

26. It is hereby declared that the words "title, addition, or description," where used in "The Dentists Act, 1878," include any title, addition to a name, designation, or description, whether expressed in words or by letters, or partly in one way and partly in the other.

There shall be repealed so much of section four of "The Dentists Act, 1878," as provides that a prosecution for any of the offences above in that Act mentioned shall not be instituted by a private person, except with the consent of the General Council or of a branch Council, and a prosecution for any such offences may be instituted by a private person accordingly.

Notwithstanding anything in section five of "The Dentists Act, 1878," the rights of any person registered under "The Dentists Act, 1878," to practise dentistry or dental surgery in any part of Her Majesty's dominions other than the United Kingdom shall be subject to any local law in force in that part.

It shall be lawful for Her Majesty, at any time after the said appointed day, to declare, by Order in Council, that section twenty-eight of the said "Dentists Act, 1878," shall be in force on and after a day to be named in such order, but in the meantime and until such order has been made, and before such day as last aforesaid, such section shall not be deemed to be in force.

Save as in this Act mentioned "The Dentists Act, 1878," shall not be affected by this Act.

Definitions.

27. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—
The expression "part of the United Kingdom" means, according to circumstances, England, Scotland, or Ireland:

The expression "British possession" means any part of Her Majesty's dominions exclusive of the United Kingdom, but inclusive of the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands; and, where parts of such dominions are under both a central and a local Legislature, all parts under one central Legislature are for the purposes of this definition deemed to be one British possession:

The expression "local law" means an Act or Ordinance passed by the Legislature of a British possession:

The expression "the appointed day" means the first of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, or such other day in June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, as may be appointed by the Privy Council:

The expression "medical corporation" means any body in the United Kingdom, other than a university, for the time being competent to grant a diploma or diplomas conferring on the holder thereof, if he has

passed a qualifying examination, the right of registration under the Medical Acts:

The expression "registered medical practitioner" means any person for the time being registered under the Medical Acts:

The word "diploma" means any diploma, degree, fellowship, membership, license, authority to practise, letters testimonial, certificate, or other status or document granted by any university, corporation, college, or other body, or by any departments of or persons acting under the authority of the Government of any country or place within or without Her Majesty's dominions:

The expression "medical diploma" means a diploma granted in respect of medicine, surgery, and midwifery, or any of them, or any branch of medicine or surgery:

The word "person" includes a body of persons, corporate or not corporate.

The expression "the Medical Acts" means "The Medical Act, 1858," and any Acts amending the same, passed before the passing of this Act.

Bonus for Canned and Cured Fish for Export.

Treasury Department,

IT is hereby notified that bonuses under "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," as set forth in the following sections (Nos. 8, 9, and 10) of that Act, will be paid subject to the conditions named therein, and in the regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

8. In order to encourage the production and curing of fish for export, the Colonial Treasurer shall during the next seven years after the passing of this Act, without further appropriation by Parliament, pay out of the Consolidated Fund to any person who shall prepare canned and cured fish for export, and actually export the same from the colony, a bonus or bonuses upon the quantity of canned and cured fish prepared and exported by such person as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say,—

- (1.) In respect of the first 200 tons avoirdupois of fish canned with or without oil, the sum of 1d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (2.) In respect of every ton avoirdupois of fish canned as aforesaid beyond the first 200 tons, the sum of ½d. per pound, the weight of the cans not to be included in the tonnage upon which such bonus is paid;
- (3.) In respect to cured fish the bonus to be paid shall be respectively ¼d. and ½d. a pound under similar conditions, as far as the same are applicable to those contained in the two last subsections.

9. The total tonnage upon which the Treasurer may grant bonuses as aforesaid under this Act shall not exceed 6,000 tons.

10. Every person intending to apply for the grant of a bonus shall register a special trade-mark under the laws for the time being in force in New Zealand providing for the registration of trade-marks, such trade-mark to be used for all cured and canned fish to be prepared for export by such person, and shall, within six years after the passing of this Act, give notice to the Treasurer of his intention to export canned and cured fish with a view to applying for a bonus, and shall append to such notice a copy of such trade-mark; and all cases, barrels, or cans containing fish cured and canned for export by any such person shall, before exporta-

tion, be marked with the trade-mark so registered by him, and no part of any such bonus shall be payable except in respect of cases, barrels, or cans so marked.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £4,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries.

The distribution will take place on the 8th February, 1887, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary for Education, Wellington, on or before the 31st January, 1887.

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club, whose membership is composed of a section of the community only, and if within a borough it must be open to the public free of charge. The receipts for the year must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

A nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of each library's receipts, and the vote of £4,000 will be divided in proportion to the amounts as thus augmented, but so as that no institution shall receive more than £50.

Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1886; and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

The Gilchrist Scholarship.

A SCHOLARSHIP of the value of £100 per annum, and attainable for three years, is biennially awarded to the highest among those candidates at the London University January Matriculation Examination held in New Zealand, who pass either in the Honours or in the First Division, are not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-two years of age, and are desirous of prosecuting their studies either at the University of Edinburgh, or at the University College, London, with a view to graduation in one of the Faculties of the University of London.

If any candidates offer themselves, the January examination for New Zealand will be held some time in the month of January, 1887, or as soon after as the examination papers arrive in the colony, and at such place or places as may be hereafter fixed, having regard to the candidates' places of abode.

Candidates will not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the following subjects, according to the details specified under the several heads:—

1. Latin:
2. Any two of the following languages: (a) Greek, (b) French, and (c) German:—
3. The English language, English history, and modern geography:
4. Mathematics:
5. Natural philosophy:
6. Chemistry.

Particulars of the foregoing subjects of examination will be found in the Calendar of the University of London, under the head of "Regulations—Matriculation." The special Latin and Greek subjects for January, 1887, are *Cicero*, *De Senectute* and *Pro Lege Manilia*; and *Homer*, *Iliad*, Book XVI.

The scholarship will be considered as commencing from the 1st July, 1887, but the first quarterly instalment will be paid to the successful candidate in the first week of October, 1887, at which time he will be expected to present himself to the Secretary of the Gilchrist Trust in London. Subsequent payments will depend on attendance at three courses of lectures in every session, and on good conduct; and the scholar must present himself for the first examination in one of the Faculties of the University of London before the end of the second year of the currency of his scholarship.

Every candidate will be required to give satisfactory evidence that he is between the ages of sixteen and twenty-two years, and either that he is a native of New Zealand, or that he has resided in New Zealand for the last five years.

Notice of entry, with satisfactory testimonials as to personal character, and the London matriculation fee of £2, must be sent to the Secretary for Education, Wellington, so as to reach his office not later than the 1st January, 1887.

The following remarks apply only to the four principal boroughs:—

The births in September were 288 against 278 in August, an increase of 10. The deaths in September were 129 against 133 in August, a decrease of 4.

There were 16 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards: 3 males of 78, 77, and 67 died at Auckland; 5 males of 77, 76, 71, 69, and 66 died at Wellington; 2 males of 78 and 76, and a female of 65, died at Christchurch; a male of 75, and 4 females of 84, 75, 74, and 72, died at Dunedin.

Specific Febrile or Zymotic Diseases.—The total number of deaths from various diseases in this class was the same in September as in August. Measles caused 5 deaths in September against 6 in August, and whooping-cough 6 deaths in September against 3 in August. There were not any deaths from typhoid fever in the past month, but 1 death in Auckland occurred from diphtheria. Two deaths occurred from hydatids.

Constitutional Diseases.—There was a slight decrease in the number of deaths in this class, from 28 in August to 24 in September. Phthisis, which caused 17 deaths in August, only caused 8 in September. There were 6 deaths from cancer against 5 in the previous month.

Local Diseases.—There were only 58 deaths from these diseases in September against 77 in August. The decrease in number was chiefly owing to the fewer deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs, which amounted to 24 in September against 40 in the previous month.

Violence.—The deaths in this class were exceptionally numerous in September, having amounted to 14; 12 occurred from accidents of various kinds, of which only 1 was from drowning and 2 deaths were suicidal.

The subjoined table shows the mortality for the last two months at each of these four boroughs from six principal specific febrile or zymotic diseases, and also the deaths from certain inflammatory diseases of the lungs. These causes of death have been distinguished from the others of the classes to which they belong, as being the most important special diseases which give rise to sudden increases in the death-rates of towns, and the prevalence of which is closely connected with sanitary condition and climatic influence of the season on health.

(Made under the Powers conferred on the Company by "The Tramways Act, 1872," for regulating the Travelling in any Carriage belonging to the Company, and for preventing the Commission of any Nuisance in or upon any such Carriage.)

THE by-laws and regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the company, and all places with respect to which the company have power to make by-laws or regulations.

1. Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor or other duly-authorized officer or servant of the company the fare legally chargeable for the journey, or deposit in the fare-box provided for the purpose his ticket, or pay into the same the fare legally chargeable for the distance travelled.

2. Each passenger shall show the ticket supplied to him (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or other duly-authorized servant of the company.

3. No ticket that is defaced or illegible, or altered after the same has been supplied, will be accepted by the conductor or authorized servant of the company in charge of the fare-box, and the holder of any such ticket, or the person by whom such ticket has been deposited in the fare-box, will be regarded as not having paid his or her fare, and shall upon demand pay to the conductor, or, if required so to do, deposit in the fare-box, the fare legally chargeable for his or her journey.

4. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the interior of any carriage. Any person who persists in smoking after being requested by a passenger, or warned by any servant of the company, to desist shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law, and may be removed from the carriage by any servant of the company.

5. No person shall give or offer a gratuity to the conductor or any other servant of the company, and no conductor or other servant of the company shall receive or accept a gratuity from any person.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst riding in any carriage or on any platform thereof, or commit any nuisance in or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No passenger or other person shall, while riding in any carriage or on any platform thereof, play or perform upon any musical instrument without permission of the conductor.

8. No person in a state of intoxication shall attempt or be allowed to enter any carriage, and any person found in such a state in any carriage or on any platform thereof shall be immediately removed by or under the directions of the conductor.

9. No person shall wilfully remove or deface any number-plate, or printed notice or writing on the panels, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these by-laws and regulations, in addition to any liability to pay the amount of damage done.

10. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the company, shall be permitted to travel on the steps of any carriage, or sit on, or lean against, the outside rail of either platform of such carriage.

11. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of the carriage, soil or injure the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other sufficient reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in any carriage, and may be prevented from entering any carriage, and shall not enter any carriage after being requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in any carriage shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall be placed where directed by the conductor, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage, unless the permission of the conductor be given.

13. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter any carriage; and no person shall hold or hang on to any part of any carriage, or travel therein otherwise than as allowed by the conductor.

14. No person shall enter or leave, or attempt to enter or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

15. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in any carriage or upon any platform thereof.

16. No person shall travel in any carriage or upon any platform thereof with loaded fire-arms.
